Loretta has spent more than 30 years as an association management professional, nearly all of it with the Louisiana State Bar Association. After serving as the LSBA's Director of Communications and Programs for five years, she became the Association's first non-lawyer executive director in 1991. Under her leadership, the LSBA has expanded to include initiatives such as disciplinary diversion, a statewide access to justice program, law office management, professionalism and diversity.

She is a member of the National Association of Bar Executives (NABE), the American Society of Association Executives (ASAE) and the Louisiana Society of Association Executives (LSAE). She has served as Secretary (2015-2016) and as a State Bar Director (2013-2015) on the NABE Board of Directors. She is a past chair of the NABE Administration and Finance Section (2011-2012) and has served two terms on the NABE Program Committee. She has previously chaired the NABE Chief Staff Executives (1997-1998) and Surveys (1993-1995) committees, and has been a member of the Bylaws Committee (2003-2004).

Loretta served as LSAE President in 2002, after having served as Vice President and as a member of its Board of Directors. She was the 2011 Chair of the Board of Directors of AIDSLaw of Louisiana, Inc., has served since 2007 as Secretary of the Board of the Louisiana Center for Law and Civic Education, and since 2013 as a member of the Board of Directors of the Louisiana Civil Justice Center.

She has presented at programs for the National Association of Bar Executives, the National Conference of Bar Presidents and the Louisiana Society of Association Executives on topics including leadership, disaster response, finances, communications, human resources and event planning. She received the CAE (Certified Association Executive) designation in 2005.
