NACC’s organizational membership program is designed to bolster the national NACC community by holistically engaging child welfare offices and agencies from small teams to large practices.

Organizational Membership Rates

Organizational membership rates are determined by the number of attorneys in your office or child welfare unit who are not Child Welfare Law Specialists. (NACC Child Welfare Law Specialists already receive a complimentary NACC membership and our deepest conference discount.)

Small (up to 10 attorneys)	\$ 500
Medium (11 to 25 attorneys)	\$ 1,250
Medium–Large (26 to 50 attorneys)	\$ 2,500
Large (51 to 99 attorneys)	\$ 5,000
Extra Large (100 or more attorneys)	\$ 8,000

Once your organization is registered, your group administrator will receive an email and link that can be sent to your office to invite them to register as organizational team members with Bronze-level benefits. Once registered, your staff will have instant access to their benefits for the term of the organizational membership. No maintenance or administration of registration lists is required, no need to update the list with staffing changes.

Attorneys and non-attorneys may register as NACC members, but the rate is determined by the number of attorneys in the office practicing child welfare law (whether or not they choose to utilize the membership). Organizations are defined as a single office or unit dedicated to child welfare law practice. For example, the Juvenile Rights Practice housed within the Legal Aid Society qualifies as an organizational member, not the entire Legal Aid Society. Likewise, for statewide representation systems, organizational memberships apply to the specific unit providing child welfare representation. For example, the Office of the Law Guardian housed within the Office of the Public Defender qualifies as an organizational member, not the entire Public Defender system.

NOTE: Beginning in 2020, all conference registration discounts will be determined by NACC membership status and Child Welfare Law Specialist status, not by group size. NACC organizational members receive the NACC member conference discount for their entire office (and deeper discounts for CWLS).
