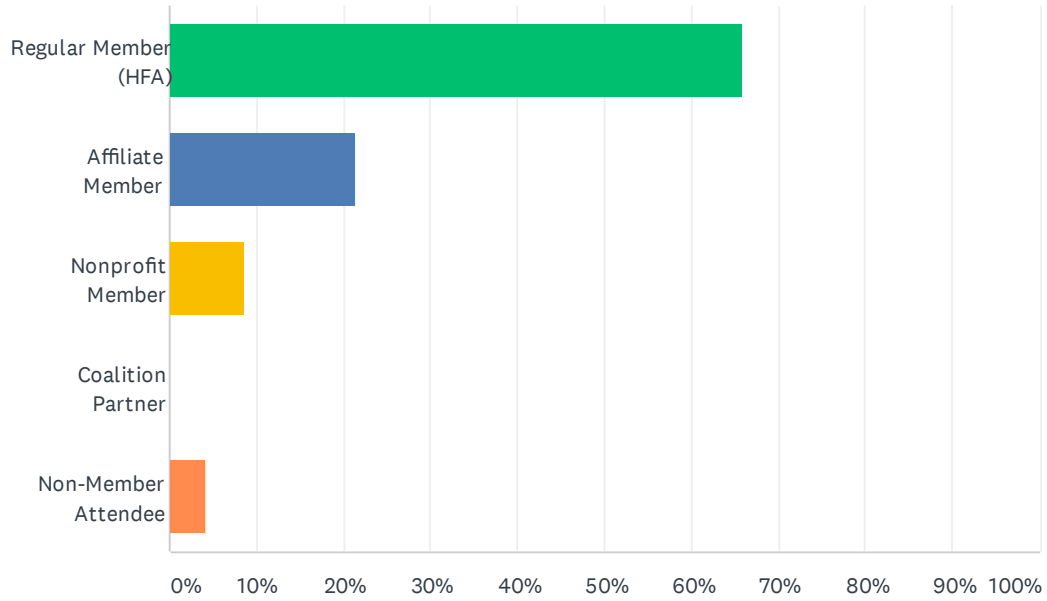


## Q2 Please identify your relationship with NALHFA

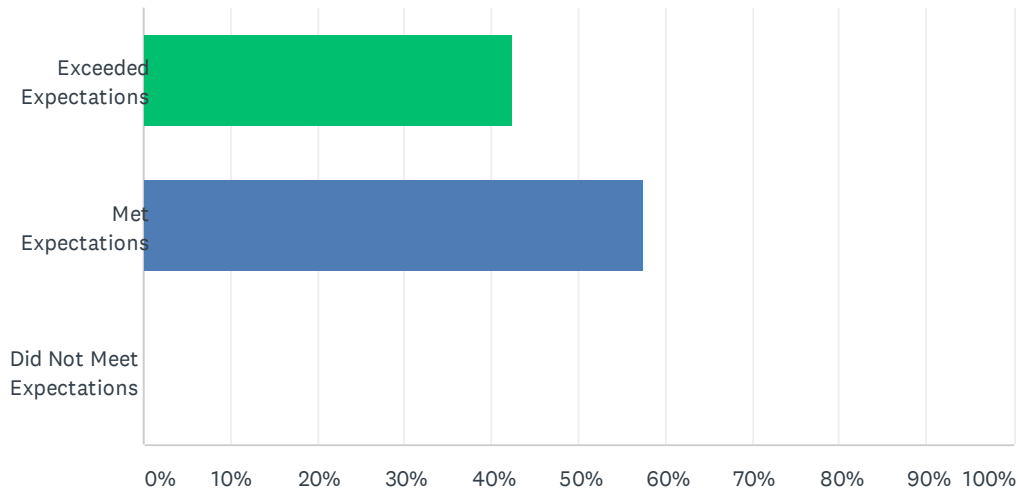

### Q3 Did the virtual conference meet or exceed your expectations?

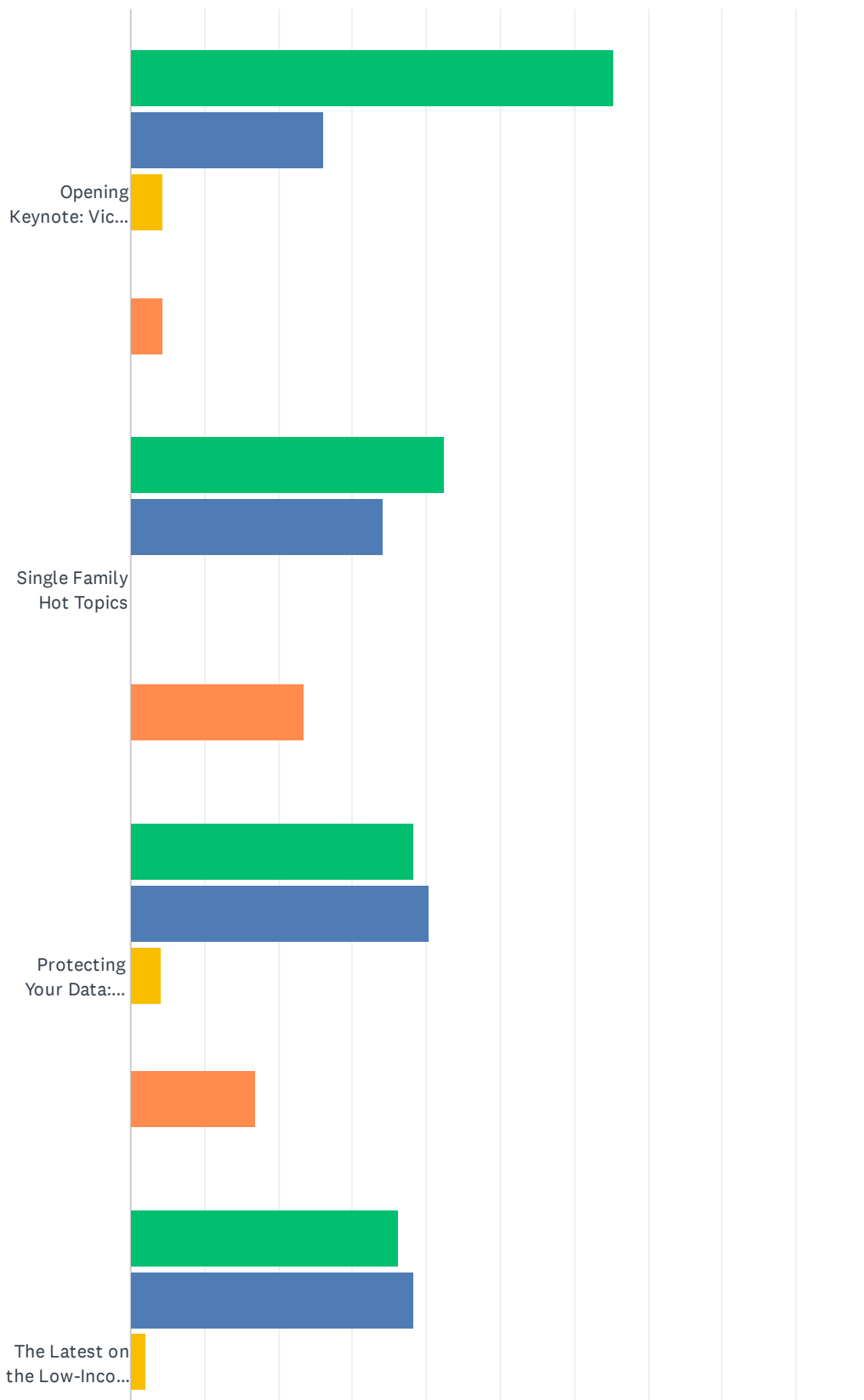
