B. California Labor Market Information and Career Center

On the California Labor Market Information (LMI) website, one can create an occupational profile specific to one or more job titles and specific geographic locations at www.labormarketinfo.edd.ca.gov, or create a new occupational profile at <http://www.labormarketinfo.edd.ca.gov/cgi/databrowsing/occExplorerQSSelection.asp?menuchoice=&searchCriteria>.

C. Researching and Negotiating Salaries

It is difficult to assign a definitive range to social work salaries, because salaries vary depending on many factors. Some of these factors include the following:

- The type of degree
- The years of professional experience
- The area of expertise (for example, forensic, medical, school, child welfare)
- The type of employer (for-profit, nonprofit, government, university, etc.)
- The type of social work license, certification, or credential

- The geographic location, urban or rural setting, and overall economy
- The candidate's special skills, such as being bilingual or holding state-specific credentials or multiple licenses

Because there are so many variables, job seekers should research common salaries for job type, geographic location, and other specific factors. There are websites that give information about salaries based on job title, degree, years of experience, and geographic location. Three such sites are listed here:

- **Salary.com:** Visitors can search by job title and zip code, before refining their search by choosing up to three job titles and education levels to compare. The "Free Salary Data" tool for each selected job title displays a likely salary range, along with information about typical benefits and links to relevant open job postings in that region. <http://www.salary.com/category/salary/>
- **Pay-Scale.com:** Visitors can research salaries and do a comparison by state and city. www.payscale.com
- **California Labor Market Information:** Another valuable resource for salary information is the California Labor Market Information (LMI) website, where one can enter a job title and a specific location and learn about the median salary range, as well as the outlook for future job availability—that is, the expected growth in that specific geographic region. www.labormarketinfo.edd.ca.gov/
