



## Domestic Violence Specialist (Bilingual - English/Spanish)

### **Bilingual Domestic Violence Specialist**

The New York Society for the Prevention of Cruelty to Children (The NYSPCC) seeks a motivated, devoted professional with strong clinical and organizational skills to serve as a Bilingual Domestic Violence Specialist. The position requires working one weekend day and two weekday evenings.

The Domestic Violence Specialist will play an important role in launching the expansion of our Therapeutic Supervised Visitation Program (TSVP) to include supportive counseling for custodial parents. TSVP serves families with a court mandate for visitation due to histories of domestic violence, child physical and sexual abuse, and neglect. The program seeks to assist high-risk families in creating safe and supportive relationships with their children through psychoeducation, exploring the impact of intergenerational trauma on parent-child relationships, supporting parent accountability, and facilitating healing in parent-child relationships.

#### **Responsibilities:**

- Provide weekly supportive counseling to custodial parents of children participating in TSVP, the majority of whom are impacted by domestic violence
- Carry a limited caseload of TSVP families
- Co-facilitate Parenting Journey groups for visiting parents participating in TSVP
- Provide trainings to professionals and/or workshops with youth or parents, as needed
- Supervise a master level student intern, as needed

#### **Qualifications:**

- LMSW, LCSW, LMHC or equivalent and New York State licensure required
- Fluency in Spanish required
- Strong organizational and communication skills required
- A minimum of five years of experience providing counseling to adult domestic violence survivors required
- Comprehensive knowledge of IDV Court, Family Court, and child protective systems preferred

Salary: \$70K, commensurate with experience.

Excellent benefit package, including health insurance (medical, dental and vision), 403B plan with match, life insurance, and generous vacation/personal day leave.
