Voter Engagement is Central to Social Work Values!

Participating in elections is important, because those elected will ultimately determine the policies that affect us all. Elections are the foundation of democracy. Yet those who are young, not white, poor, and less educated are disproportionately unlikely to vote (Pew Research Center for the People and the Press, 2006). Increasing voter participation for these groups, many of whom may be the clients of social workers, is important as those elected will make decisions on policies that affect lives of society's most vulnerable populations.

Voting rights is a critical issue for the National Association of Social Workers. We hope you find the resources in this newsletter helpful for you in your work and that you will join with NASW in supporting the importance of voting and voter engagement.

Tennessee Faces Lawsuit Over New Voter Registration Law

The League of Women Voters of Tennessee, along with American Muslim Advisory Council, Mid-South Peace & Justice Center, Rock the Vote, and Spread the Vote, filed a federal lawsuit challenging a new Tennessee law that imposes new requirements and substantial penalties on groups that engage in voter registration efforts. The complaint charges that the new law violates freedom of speech, freedom of association, due process, and the fundamental right to vote under the First and Fourteenth Amendments. The lawsuit is currently pending in federal court.

The National Social Work Voter Mobilization Campaign began in 2016 with the first launch of the [VotingIsSocialWork.org](#) web site crafted by Influencing Social Policy, the Nancy A Humphreys Institute for Political Social Work and the Congressional Research Institute for Social Work and Policy with funding by the Fund for Social Policy Education and Practice. The new website and current leadership team includes the Humphreys Institute, the Silberman School of Social Work at Hunter College and Bryn Mawr Graduate School of Social Work and Social Research with many people involved in the larger task force.

The Campaign seeks to:

- Raise awareness of the importance of voting to social work practice and social policy;
- Integrate voter engagement activities into class and field education for all micro and macro students;
- Provide information about voter mobilization skills and strategies to field instructors, students and faculty for use in agencies and the classroom, and
- Ensure that all the people served by social workers have access to the vote.

Did you know that you can register to vote online in Tennessee?

What you will need to complete your online voter registration: you must have a Tennessee driver's license or Tennessee Department of Safety and Homeland Security ID in order to submit this application online.

Instructions:

- Fill in all the required fields on the application.
- An online application for a new voter registration must be submitted at least thirty (30) days before the next election.
or
- A printed voter registration application for a new voter registration must be postmarked or hand delivered to the proper county election commission office at least thirty (30) days before the next election.
