

Our Postdoc Association

- The Fellows Committee (FelCom) at the National Institutes of Health (NIH) is an organization dedicated to more than ~3,000 fellows, spread across 23 institutes.
- The work of FelCom is supported by eight subcommittees and fifteen liaison positions, including the **Visiting Fellows Committee (VFC)**

Visiting Fellows Committee

- VFC establishes and maintains strong links of visiting fellows at the NIH to help them succeed while training in the US.
- The VFC builds community amongst visiting fellows by organizing social, cultural, and career-oriented activities.
- The VFC maintains a list of country representatives to connect visiting fellows.
- The VFC's "Science Voices from Home" is the organization's signature event.



Science Voices from Home

- "Science Voices from Home" helps fellows stay in touch with the international science community by connecting postdocs with scientists and science-related organizations, like embassies, research agencies, and global organizations.
- Sessions discuss country-specific career options, job search strategies, funding opportunities, transitions, and life as a researcher in that country.
- Seminars are presented in two different formats:
 - In-person speakers are often science seminar speakers from abroad whom do this additional seminar while on campus.
 - Webinars feature NIH alumni who have moved to that country and science administrators sharing insights into transitions to that country.
- Additional benefit: VFC organizers develop essential organizational skills important for their careers.

Format of Science Voices from Home:

1. In-person speakers present for 45 min with 15 min for Q&A.
2. Webinars have 2-4 speakers each talking for 10 min followed by 30 min of Q&A. Postdocs can participate as part of the in-room audience or online.
