Qualifications for Participation in the Honorable Cornelius Blackshear NCBJ Presidential Fellowship Program at the 2018 National Conference of Bankruptcy Judges Annual Meeting in San Antonio, Texas

Between 1 and 5 up-and-coming minority bankruptcy attorneys will receive Presidential Blackshear Fellowships at the 2018 NCBJ Annual Meeting in San Antonio, TX (October 28–31, 2018). Individual attorneys, law firms, government agencies and bankruptcy judges are invited to nominate, as Blackshear Fellows, attorneys who deserve special recognition for their professional accomplishments to date, and who show the potential to distinguish themselves in future years as highly respected members of the bankruptcy or debt restructuring bar.

To be nominated, the prospective program participant must:

- a. have two to ten years of experience practicing law;
- b. devote at least fifty percent of his/her practice to bankruptcy cases;
- c. demonstrate legal excellence in the practice of bankruptcy law;
- d. display a serious commitment to principles of civility, ethics and professionalism; and
- e. demonstrate commitment to the continued educational development of bankruptcy professionals and to professional activities that will benefit the public, members of the bar and the court system.

Only one attorney from any single law firm or agency may participate. NCBJ registration fee waivers and grants to defray part of the cost (up to 50% of eligible expenses, not to exceed \$1500) are available to the applicant(s) selected for the Blackshear Fellowship. A grant request attesting to the qualifications must accompany the nomination.

Nominations will be accepted, commencing on May 28, 2018. The nomination period will close on Cui ww'3, 2018. (Nominations submitted prior to or after the times will be disregarded.) Each nomination must be in the form of correspondence from an authorized partner of the law firm, senior attorney of a governmental agency or bankruptcy judge attesting to the qualifications of the nominee to be a Blackshear Fellow, including the number of years the nominee has practiced law. Please include a completed application form with the nomination, including the nominee's full contact information and email address. The application form is available on the NCBJ website.
