BILL MOREAU, DC, DACBSP, CSCS **Managing Director, Sports Medicine**

Dr. Bill Moreau was named the United States Olympic Committee's managing director of sports medicine in May 2012 after having served as the organization's director of sports medicine clinics since 2011. He has been with the USOC since 2009, having also previously served as manager of sports medicine clinics for the U.S. Olympic Training Centers.

In his current role, Moreau reports to the chief administrative officer and oversees all USOC sports medicine activities, both within the U.S. Olympic Training Center clinics and in Olympic Games environments. In addition, he leads the USOC's National Medical Network and will serve as medical director for the 2016 U.S. Olympic Team. He served as Team USA's medical director at the London 2012 Olympic Games and the Sochi 2014 Olympic Winter Games.

Prior to joining the USOC, Moreau had a successful private practice in Iowa for more than 25 years. In addition to clinical practice, he served as an award-winning team physician for an area high school and community college.

Moreau has successfully presented more than 400 postgraduate presentations on sports medicine throughout the world while working with Olympic, professional, collegiate, high school and recreational athletes for three decades. He is well-published with a focus on athletic injuries and an emphasis on the study of sport related concussion. Moreau serves on the editorial review board of the Journal of Chiropractic Medicine and on the American Chiropractic Board of Sports Physicians.
