Overview

Do you have an interesting clinical vignette? Have you completed a research, advocacy, education, JEDI, or quality improvement project? If yes, submit an abstract for presentation at the North Carolina Pediatric Society's Annual Poster Session!

The poster session gives pediatric residents a rewarding scholarly experience at our state's AAP chapter meeting with two categories for posters: **clinical case** or **original project**.

- **Recognition:** Two trainee authors from each top 10 abstract will receive a meeting registration discount.
 - **Awards:** The top 3 will give podium presentations at the meeting and receive an honorarium.
 - **Networking:** Share your work, educate other pediatricians, and learn about the North Carolina Pediatric Society and its role in promoting child health in North Carolina.
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Submission Guidelines

- **Format:** Abstracts should be 500 words or less, single-spaced, and no less than 12-point font. (Title, Authors, and References do not count toward word count).
- **Eligibility:** Primary submitting author **must** be a Pediatrics or Internal Medicine-Pediatrics resident at the time of submission. Students and fellows may be co-authors.
- **Project Requirements:**
 - **QI Projects:** Must have evidence of two PDSA cycles.
 - **Advocacy/JEDI Projects:** Must have evidence of having an impact or an outcome.

- **Clinical Vignettes:** Should highlight key clinical concepts to increase general pediatric knowledge.
- **Research Projects:** Must be the result of the primary work of a resident.

Review your abstract carefully; you cannot edit your work once submitted. Attention to detail (spelling, grammar, adherence to guidelines) affects ranking.

1. **Title:** ALL CAPITAL LETTERS
2. **Authors:** Last Name, First 1-2 initials (Example: Frog, KT)
3. **Learning Objectives:** State what someone will learn or be able to do after reading your poster.
4. **Case Description:** Briefly summarize the case presentation.
5. **Discussion:** A concise discussion highlighting important facts or teaching points.
6. **References**

1. **Title:** ALL CAPITAL LETTERS
2. **Authors:** Last Name, First 1-2 initials (Example: Frog, KT)
3. **Purpose**
4. **Methods**
5. **Results**
6. **Conclusions**
