Abstract Submission Guidelines Form

All submissions will undergo **open review (identifiers not removed)** and will be scored according to the criteria identified below. The abstract submitter will be the person presenting the topic, unless otherwise communicated. The deadline for submission is October 30, 2018. The selection process will be completed by December 31, 2018 and you will be notified of the status of your submission by January 5, 2019. All abstracts should be no more than 350 words, double spaced, Calibri or Arial 12 font, 1-inch margins on one page, written with the following headings: Title, Background, Purpose, Methods, Results, Conclusion. The abstract will be open peer reviewed on the following criteria:

Overall content: Provide enough detail for assessors to score. Each assessor should be able to read the abstract and have a clear understanding of the content

Relevance to Neonatal Nursing: the reviewers will be looking for how your work impacts and improves care to infants and their families

Topic: Consideration will be given to the originality and creativeness of new work or new concepts, especially along the lines where there has been limited research or work done previously

Purpose: have 1-3 aims for your study/project/presentation. This enables the reviewers to know the purpose of your presentation and work

Methods: Clearly describe the methods used for your study or project to enable the assessors to understand how you did your work in terms of the study or plan for your project and reached your conclusion

Results: Clearly state the findings and or results of your work; this maybe an outline of the key findings with more detail in your poster presentation

Conclusion: List your conclusion of your work and its importance and or relevance to Neonatal Nursing
