

GENERAL COMPETITION SPECIFICATIONS

The entire Fall Festival of Dressage will be run (1) according to the latest Official Prize List, posted on the NEDA website www.neda.org and (2) according to the current USEF, USDF and FEI rules and (3) NEDA Local Rules on page 2 of this Prize List. Show management may fine and / or eliminate and / or expel, without refund, either before or after scores are posted, any competitor not conforming to these specifications.

Helmets. Anyone mounted on a horse must wear protective head gear per USEF GR801 / Dressage 120.6. CDI competitors must comply with FEI General Regulations Article 140.1

Training through Grand Prix levels, including musical freestyles. Breeding Divisions. Classes will start each day at 8:00 AM.

3. AWARDS

3.1. Awards: Distribution

Awards will be distributed at the Awards Tent, except for ribbons presented during Award Ceremonies. All prizes for each award will be given to the one person picking up and signing for them and who accepts responsibility for further distribution. Checks will be mailed after show. See below.

3.2. Awards: Ceremony Requirements

Each CDI Saugerties and Regional Championship class requires participation in its Awards Ceremony. A final schedule for each day Awards Ceremonies will be posted in the Show Secretary Office and in the show program. Unless unforeseen events force otherwise, Awards Ceremonies will be held, each day, mounted in Ring 1 during its lunch break and at the end of its classes. Inclement conditions may force moving them to unmounted in the VIP Pavilion or the Food Pavilion. Roughly, each day morning classes will have their awards during Ring 1 lunch break; afternoon classes will have their awards at the end of classes in Ring 1.

3.3. Awards: Post Show Mailing of Checks, Tests, Awards

Tests and awards not picked up during the show will not be mailed to competitor. Awards not picked up will be donated to other NEDA events for door prizes. If you are not available, have a friend pick them up. The only exceptions are for awards which are unavailable until Sunday (NEDA JrYR and Adult Amateur Championships and dressage show Special Awards based on scores of rides ridden Thursday / Friday / Saturday). Any post show mailing will be sent to the Owner of the horse, using name and address on Entry.

Checks for Prize Monies (except for USDF Regional Championships, which are mailed by USDF) will be made out to and mailed to Owner on Entry one week after Show; Concerning Prize Money won by Foreign Competitors: US IRS requires sporting events to withhold 30% of prize money over \$600 won in the US. Foreign competitors should apply for a US Social Security number and will be asked to complete form 8283 or complete a W-8 Certificate of Foreign Status. American competitors receiving \$600 or more in Prize Monies must complete IRS W-9 form with tax information for 1099's and Show Manager must receive it on or before the Saturday following show completion. The W-9 form is available on NEDA website, Fall Festival Prize List page. **For payment to any other party (than Owner) Show Manager must be notified with Written Notification on or before the Saturday following show completion, with indication of Payee and address to which Prize Monies are to be sent.**

6. ENTRY FORMS

6.1 Entry Forms: Membership Verification Sheet. USEF now offers a convenient Verification procedure with membership proof (both USEF and USDF) for Rider, Owner/Lessee and Horse printed on one sheet of paper which can accompany entry. Go to USEF website www.usef.org. Click on Verification tab on home page and follow instructions. Copies of current membership cards, if not on the Verification Sheet, are needed, however, for USEF requirements for Trainers and Coaches.

6.2 Entry Forms: Coggins

Every horse (except foals under 6 months) must supply non-returnable copy of Coggins within one year.

6.3 Entry Forms: Signature Requirements

Every Entry Form must contain signature of: (1) Rider Handler, or parent / guardian if Rider under 18 on previous December 1; (2) Owner; (3) Trainer, and (4) Coach (if acting as Coach at the competition). The word "same" will be rejected. Trainer must be an adult and on grounds during competition and sign Entry Form. Copied / faxed signatures are acceptable.

6.4 Entry Forms: Incomplete Entries

Entries will be processed in general by Entry Date. Neither refunds nor schedule changes for competitor entry errors. Show Secretary reserves right to delay processing incomplete Entry Forms until all required information (including required breed registration documentation), signatures and payment are complete. Incomplete Entry Forms may thereby lose priority for "first come, first serve" processing mentioned in this prize list; they may fall onto Wait List; they may be required to pay late fees (\$50/\$100) at the point Entry Form is complete; they may lose priority for stabling. "First come / first serve" policies may be applied depending on point at which Entry Form is complete, not point at which Entry Form is first received by Show Secretary.

Stabling and Open Class ride time scheduling will be delayed until Entry is complete..

Note: this means that incomplete entries will lose stabling priority, thereby may be separated from others in their party and may be scheduled elsewhere, such as in the "Back Barns". Similarly incomplete Entries lose priority for acceptance to the Open Classes which have long wait lists.

6.5 Entry Forms: Payment

Entries will not be processed without full payment. Make checks out to NEDA; **checks (including those on Wait List) will be deposited upon receipt of entry.** Or pay by credit card (Visa or MasterCard only) and include card holder billing name, full address including zip code, and three digit Security Code on back of card. **Credit cards will be charged upon receipt of entry.** Credit Card entries will not be processed until credit card payment is approved. No number deposits; any included will not be refunded. Penalty for non-negotiable checks / declined credit cards. Delinquent fees / paperwork must also be collected for any Entry whose rider / handler / owner / trainer/ coach owes fees, paperwork, receipts or any other obligation from any previous NEDA function before Entry will be considered complete and processed.

6.6 Entry Forms: Remittance

Remit Entries via mail or fax or on line through NEDA website. Send only one Entry Form to Show Secretary. Do not follow up faxed entry with snail mail entry! Complete USDF / USEF documentation and payment of any fees due for each Rider / Handler, Owner, Trainer, and Coach (if applicable) must accompany Entry. See Table just above for details. Do not send to HITS on the Hudson. Send FedEx (or any other express mail) using no signature option. Rider and Owner contact information must be complete; be sure to include an email address for Show Secretary to contact both Rider and Owner. Most communications will be done via email but "snail mail" addresses are also necessary.. Faxed entries direct to Show Secretary will be accepted, so long as they are complete and full payment by credit card is authorized and approved.

6.7 Entry Forms: Entry (Received) Date

All Entries will be assigned a Entry Date by which they will be processed in all "first come / first serve" processing outlined in this Prize List. This date shall be date received by Show Secretary. Show Secretary may further sort entries by time. Show Secretary shall penalize Entry Forms with Entry Date prior to Opening Date. Show Secretary may adjust Entry Date to that date upon which an incomplete Entry Form becomes complete and payment is approved. Late entries will be processed and scheduled upon payment of appropriate fees and if there is available ring time, including late entries to Regional Championships.

6.8 Entry Forms: Breed Show Entry Form Requirements

See Breed Show Specs for important details concerning Handlers / Riders / Trainers / Owners / Horses and Assistant Handlers.

6.9 Entry Forms: CDI Entry Form Requirements

CDI competitors must indicate clearly on Entry Form: horse's breed, sex, age, color, country of birth, present nationality (country of its owner), passport number, sire and dam and their registration numbers, and previous name of horse, if any; rider's country for whom horse/rider is competing and rider's citizenship; name of groom. See Table above for important details concerning the CDI Drug Fee, FEI Registration Numbers, USEF IHP fee, exemption for foreign owned horses competing in CDI only. CDI competitors, and those who request stabling with them, must select Duration Stabling. A letter of permission must be sent from their NF to the USEF and to Fall Festival show management.

6.10 Entry Forms: Foreign Competitors

USEF: foreign Riders and Owners must provide either (1) proof in English of membership in good standing in their NF or (2) proof of USEF membership; to compete as an Amateur, with USEF membership or non member card indicating Amateur status; Breed Show IBC Classes are exempted. USDF: foreign Owners and Riders must supply with Entry either (1) copy of current USDF membership card or (2) copy of USDF Non Member card (NM) with Non Member ID number; affidavit is required for incomplete documentation; exception horses competing only in Breed Show IBC Classes.

6.11 Entry Forms: Conflicts

Indicate potential schedule conflict with judge(s); if scheduled ride cannot avoid judge(s), ride will be scheduled HC.

6.12. Entry Forms: Non Compete Horses / Non Compete Broodmares

Each horse on grounds must complete an Entry Form and pay Office Fee. Each non-compete horse, except broodmares accompanying foal, must also pay Non Compete Fee. Entry is exempt from USEF Drug Fee. Rider/Handler, Owner/Lessee, and Trainer are exempt from USEF Non Member Fee. Rider/Handler and Owner/Lessee are exempt from USDF Non Member Fee. Non Compete horses and Broodmares are subject to all show rules, and may be drug tested. All horses pay any stabling fees required. Every Horse will be assigned a Bridle Number.

6.13. Entry Forms: Para Equestrian

Para Equestrian riders may compete in Dressage Open show and / or Para Equestrian classes. Include documentation with entry. If special equipment is needed, include copy of current USEF Dispensation Certificate. Riders must carry documentation throughout show for review by the TD as necessary. Riders competing in both the Dressage Open Show and the Para Equestrian classes must follow the USEF "two level rule". Grades Ia and Ib are equivalent to USDF Intro Level; Grade II is equivalent to USEF Training Level; Grade III is equivalent to USEF First Level; Grade IV is equivalent to USEF Third Level. Show Management / Officials reserve right to move, if necessary, Rider into appropriate Open Show class, based on FEI test selected, and adjust Entry Fees appropriately. Grade I, II and III riders competing in both Dressage Open Classes and Para Equestrian Classes must follow USEF bridle rules; they may not ride in a double bridle any time on the show grounds. Grade I, II and III riders wishing to use a double bridle may not enter USEF classes.

Participants and horses competing in Para-Equestrian classes at USDF recognized competitions will no longer be exempt from USDF memberships. Para-Equestrian competitors will now be required to have a USDF Group Membership, a USDF Participating Membership or a USDF Non-Member ID and pay the \$25 Non-Member fee per competition. Owners of horses competing in the Para-Equestrian classes will be required to have a USDF Participating Membership, a USDF Business Membership, a USDF Group Membership or a USDF Non-Member ID and pay the \$25 Non-Member fee per competition. The horses competing in Para-Equestrian classes will be required to have a USDF HID number or be USDF Lifetime registered.

To enter Para Equestrian classes provide with Entry one or more of the following: (1) USEF Para Equestrian Classification Card indicating Profile and Grade based on the FEI Profile System; (2) USEF Para Equestrian Dispensation Certificate (permission for special equipment, issued annually) as determined by the USEF Para Equestrian Classification System via the Adaptive Sports Committee; (3) FEI Para Equestrian Card for Qualifying and International level competitions; (4) copy of application to USEF for a Para Equestrian classification, rendering competitor Para Equestrian Eligible as determined by the USEF classification coordinator. See USEF GR1310-GR1313 For further information contact Laureen Johnson at USEF directly (908.326.1153). For tests see FEI website for tests: www.horsesport.org. Click on Para Equestrian / Rules to download the various tests available for each Grade. Competitor must select FEI test matching their Grade Level in documentation submitted with Entry. Grades Ia, Ib, II and III will be held in a large arena as much as possible; tests requiring a small arena will be held in small arena.

7. ACCEPTANCE / TIMES POLICIES**7.1. Acceptance: Regional Championship Entries during Championship Window**

The Championship Window consists of six days: Opening Date and the next five days. During the Championship Window Show Secretary shall receive and process Regional Championships Entry Forms (which must be complete). During this time Regional Championship horse / rider combinations will be accepted into their Regional Championship Class(es) as well as Breed Show Classes and Open Show Classes; they will be assigned horse and tack stalls as requested. Entry Date will be considered only in the case of any Open Class which fills with Regional Championship riders. See Regional Championships section of this Prize List for limitations and important details. During this Championship Window, all other Entry Forms will be set aside, for processing after this six day period according to their Entry Date. After Championship Window Show Secretary shall process Regional Championships entries as follows: Championship Ride(s) and horse stall will be accepted; other rides and tack stalls will be accepted based on Entry Date, processed the same as CDI, Breed and Open entries below.

7.2. Acceptance: CDI, Breed and Open Entries

Send all non-Regional Championship entries to be received according to Opening and Closing Dates, starting on Opening Date in order that each may be assigned Entry (Received) Date. Generally many classes are filled within the first week. After processing Championship Window entries Show Secretary shall process Entries set aside during Championship Window, in order by Entry Date. Some classes and some stabling will, at that point, be partially filled with Regional Championship competitors.

7.3. Acceptance: Class Limits

Both Breed Show and Dressage Show will be scheduled and assigned specific performance times. Show Secretary will accept rides and fill classes on a first come basis depending on Entry Date. Stabling will also be assigned on a first come basis depending on Entry Date. Incomplete entries will not be scheduled in Open Classes, nor will they be assigned stabling. A Wait List will be created, as necessary, class by class, on first come basis depending again on Entry Date. Once a class is filled subsequent entries to that class will not be accepted until there is a scratch in that class. As show fills, each entry may find some classes accepted, some classes not accepted. Before and on Closing Date, competitors may scratch unaccepted classes with full refund of class entry fees provided Secretary has been notified by Written Notification (see General Specifications / Competitor Communications).

7.4. Acceptance: Stabling

Horse and tack stalls will be filled from complete entries on first come basis, depending on Entry Date. Front Barn 6 will be held aside for Breed Show competitors. The rest of the Front Barns will be filled first and then stalls will be assigned in the Back Barns. It is estimated that two thirds of Fall Festival stalls can be assigned in the Front Barns, one third in the Back Barns. Get your entry in early!

7.5. Acceptance: Freestyle Format and Sound Check Times

Times for freestyle sound checks will be posted at the office. Music must be supplied on CD. Show is not responsible for CD problems.

7.5 Acceptance: Assignment of Bridle Numbers

A Bridle Number belongs to the Rider / Handler and Horse combination. See Breed Show Specifications for important Entry details concerning Rider / Handler designations. If a horse is handled by one person and ridden under saddle by another, two entry forms must be remitted and two Bridle Numbers will be assigned, one for each combination. If a foal is accompanied by its non compete dam two entry forms must be remitted, one for each horse, and two Bridle Numbers will be assigned, one for each horse. Each combination will keep the same Bridle Number throughout the Event and it must worn, from the time of arrival until the end of the Event, by the horse, competitor or handler at all times, when the horse is being handled, exercised or shown on the grounds so that it may be identified by the stewards

7.6 Acceptance: Post Entries / Wait List Policies

The Show will be scheduled just after Closing Date with entry received through Closing Date. All entries (including late entries to the Regional Championships) beyond limits of filled classes and not scratched as of Closing Date will form the Wait List. Post entries will be processed, upon payment of appropriate Post Entry Fee, and their classes will also be either accepted or added to Wait List. If the ride placed on the Wait List is never filled, its entry fee is refunded after the show, less the Wait List Fee; once a ride on the Wait List is filled competitor will be notified as follows: Secretary will contact competitor by email or phone if before Last Ditch Date; after Last Ditch Date and at show it is competitor's responsibility to check Headquarters for status of Wait List class(es). Secretary will attempt to notify competitor when ride is accepted into show, especially before Last Ditch Date. Once ride has been filled two or more hours before ride time competitor is obligated financially, whether or not the ride is ridden. It is competitor's responsibility to watch website and Wait List posted at Headquarters during show to see if Wait List classes are accepted.

7.7 Acceptance: Multiple Horses

Anyone entering the show riding three or more horses per day does so at their own risk. Show Management will attempt to accommodate, but if it is not able to schedule the additional rides to the satisfaction of the Rider / Owner, entry fees will not be refunded.

8. COMMUNICATION WITH COMPETITORS**8.1 Communications: Websites**

The NEDA website (www.neda.org) will be used to keep show competitors informed. In the home page click on Fall Festival on left. Once in Fall Festival home page click on Hotline on left. Official Prize List changes, stabling lists, and other helpful information will be posted there by Show Manager. Show Secretary will also use this website) to post the complete class schedule, both before Closing Date while show is filling and after Closing Date when times are tentatively set.

8.2 Communications: Entry Confirmation

Due to complexity of processing Regional Championship entries confirmations cannot be sent upon receipt. Instead, Show Secretary shall post details of each class, as show fills, on the NEDA website. She will also maintain as much communication with competitors as possible using email. Be sure to include email address on each Entry Form. The Show tentative class limits chart will be posted on the website Schedule Page. Show management will post the Wait List as well. Check all information carefully and notify Entry Secretary immediately of errors. No guarantee of show reporting corrections and additional information given after Closing Date.

8.3 Communications: Written Notification

Written Notification consists of: (1) notification to Show Secretary (preferred) and / or Show Manager by email or fax AND (2) reply by email or fax from Show Secretary or Show Manager. No changes or refunds will be processed without both (1) and (2) above. Keep paperwork. To be safe send all written communications to both Show Secretary and Show Manager. Disputes will be settled only by Written Notification from both parties.

8.4 Communications: Times / Stabling Assignments

After Closing Date performance times will be scheduled for both Dressage Show and Breed Show and stalls will be assigned. Times (tentative) will be posted on the NEDA website www.neda.org approximately two weeks after Closing Date. No times will be mailed. Final times will be posted at Headquarters during show. Check them! Do not assume website or program times. Fall Festival is a large, complex event and last minute changes are often necessary. Stall assignments will be posted on NEDA website on the Schedule Page. Competitors will be notified by email or telephone, as much as possible, of any changes.

8.5 Communications: Scores

Scores will stand as posted unless challenged within 12 hours.

8.6 Distribution of Awards at Show

With the exception of ribbons distributed at Awards Ceremonies, all Awards will be distributed from Awards Tent to the person who says he is representing the competitor. This person will be given all prizes and will be asked to sign for them. This person accepts responsibility for further distribution of ribbons, prizes and any other awards.

8.7 Communications: Post Show Mailing of Tests / Awards

Class tests and awards not picked up during the show will not be mailed to competitor. Competitor forfeits awards not picked up. If you are not available, have a friend pick them up. The only exceptions are for awards which are unavailable until Sunday (NEDA JrYR and Adult Amateur Championships and other Special Awards whose winners cannot be known until after competitor may have left the grounds). Any post show mailing will be to the Owner listed on the Entry Form, unless Show Manager is notified otherwise on or before the Saturday following the show.

9. CHANGES / REFUNDS

9.1 Changes / Refunds: Changes, Scratches, Adds After Closing Date and at Show

Every Time Slot consists of a (1) Time / Ring; (2) Bridle Number; (3) Horse; and (4) Rider. Any change requires extensive computer adjustment and reissuing of reports. Therefore, after Closing Date:

Changes may be only done by:

- (1) scratching the Time Slot, no refund; and
- (2) filling an available Time Slot by paying the full entry fee for the class; in the case of substitution of Horse and / or Rider in the same Time Slot the full entry fee must be (re) paid because a new Bridle Number must be entered into the class and test sheets updated.

Scratches may be only done by:

- (1) forfeiting the Time Slot, no refund.

Adds may be only done by:

- (1) filling an available Time Slot or placement on Wait List, in either case by paying full entry fee.

In addition, any Change or Add that requires issuance of new Bridle Number (and therefore new Entry Form into the computer system) will be charged Post Entry Fee (on or before Last Ditch Date) or Last Ditch Fee (after Last Ditch Date and at show).

Once the show schedule is set and the program is set to go to press (approximately a week after Closing Date) a rider may switch times within a class only upon paying the appropriate Last Ditch Fee, and then may switch only into an already available Time Slot. Classes will start at the time printed in the program. Classes will end no later than posted in the program. In other words, breaks will remain as the program states and no rides will be entered into the breaks. Nor will classes be moved. Show Management will not move any riders within a class. The only exception is a change of person listed as Rider to another Handler for an unmounted class in the Breed Show. In this case a Handler can sign an Entry Form and handle the horse without penalty provided no other changes are made to the Time Slot. Any other changes incur penalties above. The above policies to maintain the Order of Go as printed in the program will be maintained barring unexpected event which force other actions.

9.2. Changes / Refunds: Policies for No Shows

Competitors who do not scratch and are No Shows for any of their rides may be assessed \$10 before their entry is processed at any subsequent NEDA event. Show management may scratch competitor for entire show (and reassign times to other competitors) if competitor has not picked up packet and is a no show for his first class.

9.3. Changes / Refunds: Refund Policies

Any unused USEF or USDF fees will be refunded after any indebtedness is settled.

Any refund monies will be issued after show and mailed to that person listed as Owner on Entry. Be sure the Owner address is complete and valid.

Full refunds, except for Office Fee, through Closing Date only with Written Notification (email, fax, US mail) to Show Secretary (with copy to Show Manager) and with written receipt from Secretary and / or Show Manager.

After Closing Date refund of all stabling fees and pre ordered bedding fees, except \$50 per stall, when competitor notifies Secretary by Written Notification on or before Last Ditch Date. No stabling / bedding refunds after Last Ditch Date.

Once a competitor scratches, Show Management will fill scratched time slot(s) and stall(s). Scratching competitor may not pass scratched time slot(s) or stall(s) on to other(s).

Except for stabling refunds (above) no refunds after Closing Date except for: (1) refundable portion of unfulfilled Wait List Class requests; (2) refundable portion of unfulfilled stabling requests; (3) special refunds concerning non-qualification for championship classes as detailed in Regional Championships and Breeders Championships specifications; (4) para equestrian entries to the National Championship classes who do not qualify; (5) stabling fees for stalls "retaken" by show; (6) any other refund specifically described in latest version of the Official Prize List on NEDA website.

No refunds for: number deposits; Affidavit fees; Breed/Discipline fees. No refunds for expulsion from show; elimination from class(es). No refunds for elimination from CDI via examination, passport errors, or FEI jog. No refunds for competitor error(s). No refunds for cancellation of Event, portion(s) of Event and / or class(es) for any reason including (but not exclusively) situations resulting from: grounds (or portion of grounds) unavailable to / unusable by NEDA for any reason; inclement weather; Acts of God; local / national emergency, act(s) of terrorism.

These refund policies apply to any monies received by NEDA for sponsorship / vendor space / program advertising or any other option listed in the current sponsorship flyer as posted on the NEDA website.

10. STABLING**10.1 Stabling: Stalls**

1,100 Stalls available in permanent barns with sliding doors. Fall Festival will be using the HITS grounds alone, not sharing with the hunter finals. Therefore the 484 stalls in the "Front Barns" 1 / 2 / 3 / 4 / 5 / 6 will be available. Show will hold (only until Closing Date) 48 of these stalls in Barn 6 for Breed Show competitors. The other 416 stalls in the Front Barns will be assigned on first come basis. There are 536 stalls available in the "Back Barns" and overflow from the Front barns will be assigned there. CDI competitors will be stabled in separate barn which is not close to any other stabling. Stalls will be assigned (only for complete and paid for entries) by Entry Date (date entry is received), first come first serve. Incomplete entries will not be assigned stabling until they are complete. Stalls will be stripped before competitors arrive. No initial bedding. An area near the Breed Show competition arena will be available for drive in competitors.

10.2 Stabling: Duration Stabling

Duration stalls are available Tuesday 4:00 PM through Sunday early evening. Early arrivals must clear arrival with Show Management and pay \$50 Monday Stall Fee.

10.3 Stabling: Breed Show Stabling

Stall will be scheduled in Barn 6 only. Horse must have legitimate entry to at least one Breed Show class. Early arrivals must clear arrival with Show Management and pay \$50 Monday Stall Fee. Special Breed Show Fee applies to Tuesday / Wednesday / Thursday nights, until early evening Friday.

Layovers Friday night must pay \$50 Breed Show / Friday fee for each Horse / Tack Stall and vacate stall(s) by noon on Saturday. Those remaining after noon on Saturday will be billed \$65 Breed Show / Saturday stall fee for each Horse / Tack stall.

Horse may also enter Dressage Show class(es). Max one Tack Stall per Horse. **Entry must be received and completed by Closing Date.** Breed Show entries (1) with Entry Date after Closing Date and / or (2) wishing stabling with others in their party who have not entered Breed Show must pay \$215 Duration Stabling. Once Barn 6 is fully scheduled with Breed Show Stabling, Breed Show entries must pay \$215 Duration Stabling and will be stabled elsewhere according to Entry Date. No substitutions; any Horse without legitimate Breed Show class entry and which is using Breed Show Stabling Horse or Tack stall will be assessed fees to bring amount paid for each stall up to \$215 Duration Stabling.

10.4 Stabling: Rules

Power is available in barns. All electrical cords must be 12 gauge, 3 wire negative ground. All electric connections must conform to state and county codes. No Class I Flammable Liquids such as gasoline are allowed inside any buildings or tents on the grounds, nor anywhere (inside or outside buildings) in the stabling areas. No gas, electric or propane heaters, tanks or hot plates (inside or outside buildings) are allowed in the stabling areas. Sharps boxes will be located in stabling areas per USEF requirements. No cross tying horses in barn aisles. No tying dogs in barn aisles. No mounting of horses inside any barn.

10.5 Stabling: Assignments

Entries will not be scheduled until complete. First to be assigned will be the 484 10'x12' stalls with sliding doors in the "Front Barns" 1 / 2 / 3 / 4 / 5 and 6. Show will hold the 48 stalls in Barn 6 for Breed Show competitors. The other 436 stalls in the Front Barns will be assigned on first come basis to dressage show competitors and overflow Breed Show competitors. There are 536 10'x12' stalls with sliding doors available in the "Back Barns" 7 / 8 / 9 / 10 / 11 / 12 and 13. Breed Show and Dressage Show overflow from the Front Barns will be assigned there. CDI competitors will be stabled in Barn 14 in 80 12'x12' stalls with sliding doors. This FEI stabling is not close to any other stabling. CDI competitors must plan carefully for non CDI horses / tack stalls in their party.

Stalls belong to the Horse in the Entry Form with which payment is received and will be assigned accordingly. All stalls will be assigned by show management. Tack stall request may only accompany Horse Stall request, on the same Entry; ie no Tack Stall requests without Horse Stall on the same Entry. Tack stall will be assigned in same location as Horse Stall of its Entry Form and must be for same duration as its Entry. Stall assignment(s) will be posted on NEDA website. No substitution of horses, changing of these stall assignments or occupancy of any other stall without permission from either NEDA Show Stable Manager, Show Manager or Show Secretary.

Competitors who have not scratched may arrange privately to share stall with another party. Competitor must (1) arrange privately the details of cost, bedding, switching horses and (2) notify by email **both** Show Manager at FallShow@neda.org and Show Secretary at debra@centerlineevents.com of the details.

10.6 Stabling: Monday Arrival and Extra Nights

Stalls will not be available before 4:00 PM Tuesday, except for special requests and payment with entry. Arrivals before Tuesday 4:00 PM must indicate so and pay on Entry Form; competitor must also arrange with Show Management their arrival time, so that stall(s) are ready. Early arrivals, without notice and payment, may find stall uncleaned and pre ordered shavings not yet delivered. Horses may stay Sunday night, only until mid day on Monday with payment of additional \$50 fee. Those staying beyond Sunday night and beyond Monday mid day must pay an additional \$200 Stabling Fee for each stall to stay until Wednesday; special arrangement must be done with Show Management. Early arrivals and / or late staying horses who have not indicated and paid with Entry will be billed accordingly.

10.7 Stabling: Feed and Bedding

No initial bedding. Shavings \$10 per bag. Hay \$20 per bale.. **Shavings pre orders will be accepted through Last Ditch Date only.** No pre orders will be accepted after Last Ditch Date. Shavings will be available at the Stabling Office in Barn 9 until 6:00 PM each evening; Competitors may purchase bedding there and take it to their own stalls. If arriving late bring enough bedding until Stabling Office opens the next AM. If arriving after mid-afternoon, without pre ordering bedding, bring necessary bedding and food supplies to cover from arrival until the next day. Once Show Headquarters opens, feed and bedding can be ordered at Headquarters before mid afternoon for delivery that day. Additional bags of shavings, as well as hay and common feeds, are available. Competitors may also order and pay for supplies at Headquarters which will then be delivered to stabling area. Competitors may bring in their own feed and shavings; no outside feed / bedding retailers / suppliers are allowed to deliver to the grounds.

10.8 Stabling: Night watch

Night watch will be provided 6:00 PM until 6:00 AM at show expense.

10.9 Stabling: Acceptance Policies

Horse and tack stalls will be assigned for entries that are complete and paid, on first come basis, depending on Entry Date. Front Barns will be scheduled first. Then Back Barns.

10.10 Stabling: Duration Stabling Special Requests

Special requests received with Entry will be granted as much as possible, on first come basis. Stallions will be separated from mares as much as possible; stallions may be separated from other horses in owner's party.

10.11 Stabling: CDI Entries

CDI horses will be stabled in FEI Stabling. CDI horses may be ridden only in FEI Stabling Warm Up and NEDA White Warm Up. Any non CDI horse, on special arrangement in the CDI Stabling may (due to FEI regulations requiring separation as much as possible from Open competitors) be ridden only in the open, non ring, area of NEDA White Warm Up.

10.12 Stabling: Turn Out

Paddock turnout available. Board fencing. Grass. Approx 100' x 100'. \$300 for duration of event. Make note and include payment with entry. First come basis. Also available during event at Headquarters. Bring chain and lock to secure gate.

10.13 Stabling: Refunds

After Closing Date refund of all stabling fees and pre ordered bedding fees, except \$50 per stall, when competitor notifies Secretary by Written Notification on or before Last Ditch Date. Once a competitor scratches, Show Management will fill scratched time slot(s) and stall(s). Scratching competitor may not pass scratched time slot(s) or stall(s) on to other(s).

11. BREED DOCUMENTATION**11.1 Breed Documentation: General Requirements**

Horses are not required to be registered, except for entrance to IBC classes and for eligibility in Breed Specific High Score Special Awards. Primary Registration is the Breed Registry which issued foal papers and/ or UELN (Universal Equine Life Numbers) for the horse/foal, or a COP / Birth Certificate. Performance and Color Registries are considered Secondary Registries (PHR, AWS, IRC, SHOC, APHA etc.). Provide documentation for registered horses. And, it is recommended to indicate unregistered horses and provide available pedigree information.

11.2. Breed Documentation: Breed Listing in Show Program

Show management will acknowledge in program only one Breed, even if multiple breeds are indicated on Entry Form. Indicate Primary Registration on Entry Form, but send documentation for Secondary Registration(s) as well.

11.3. Breed Documentation: Requirements for IBC Classes and Breed Specific High Score Special Awards

All entrants who wish to enter IBC Class(es) and / or be eligible for Breed Specific High Score Special Awards must supply non returnable complete breed documentation with entry. Copy of one of the following will suffice: registration; passport cover or pedigree page containing horse name, breed and registration number; certificate of ownership indicating horse name, breed and registration number. For foals of 2007 with pending registration copy of one of the following will suffice: Breeding Certificate; Stallion Service Certificate; Birth Declaration. For pending registrations, entry must include statement from registry that horse is approved. Membership in breed organization and / or enrollment in its current Awards Program, if available may be included. See Table of Breed Registries and Breed Organizations below.

11.4. Breed Documentation: Requirements for Futurity

Entrants for Futurity must provide with entry copy of Stallion Service Certificate denoting an eligible sire and / or registration documentation (indicating sire) as above.

11.5. Breed Documentation: Awarding Breed Specific High Score Special Awards

Breed Specific High Score Special Awards are awarded for both Breed Show and Dressage Show, and vary from year to year. Breed Show Special Awards include only classes 1 / 2 / 4 / 5 / 8 / 9 / 11 / 12 / 13 / 15 / 16 / 17. Awards will be given out in the afternoon. For dressage show only scores ridden Thursday / Friday / and Saturday will be considered; winners will be announced Sunday noontime. Eligibility lists will be set one week after Closing Date, using only entries complete as of that date and classes which have been entered. No horses will be added to the lists after that point. Post entries and entries made complete after that point will not be added to the eligibility lists. There is no Award Ceremony. Only Special Awards sponsored and whose complete specifications have been received by Show Management via a completed Sponsorship Contract by Closing Date will be awarded. See Awards Table at show for final list of these awards. Awards received after that point will not be awarded at Fall Festival, but will be awarded at the NEDA Fall Weekend or held over for Fall Festival the next year.

11.6. Breed Documentation: Result of Incomplete Documentation IBC / Futurity Classes

Entries with incomplete documentation for IBC class(es) / Futurity will not be accepted until documentation is complete; they may therefore fall onto Wait List and be subject to changed Entry Date. Check website to see list of horses accepted into each class. Notify Show Secretary immediately of errors. Awards or horses with incomplete, incorrect documentation will be withdrawn after class, if necessary.

11.7 Breed Documentation: Result of Incomplete Documentation Breed Specific High Score Special Awards

On website see "dummy classes" in 600's for list of horses accepted for each breed.. Only Entry Forms received on or before one week after Closing Date and with complete documentation will be placed on eligibility list for these awards. Do not count on Show Secretary for personal notification of incomplete documentation (inclusion of email address on Entry Form will help here). Eligibility lists will be complete seven days after Closing Date. After that point no horses will be added to these lists. Awards will not be altered during or after show for horses omitted, for any reason, from eligibility list.

11.8 Breed Designation: Table of Breed Registries and Breed Organizations

Registries in the following table have traditionally been involved with Fall Festival, either for IBC classes and / or Breed Specific High Score Special Awards, such as high scores for Breed Show and / or Dressage Show Sponsorships change from year to year. Include documentation of all horse registrations. Show management will verify Owner memberships and horse's registration to current Awards Programs.

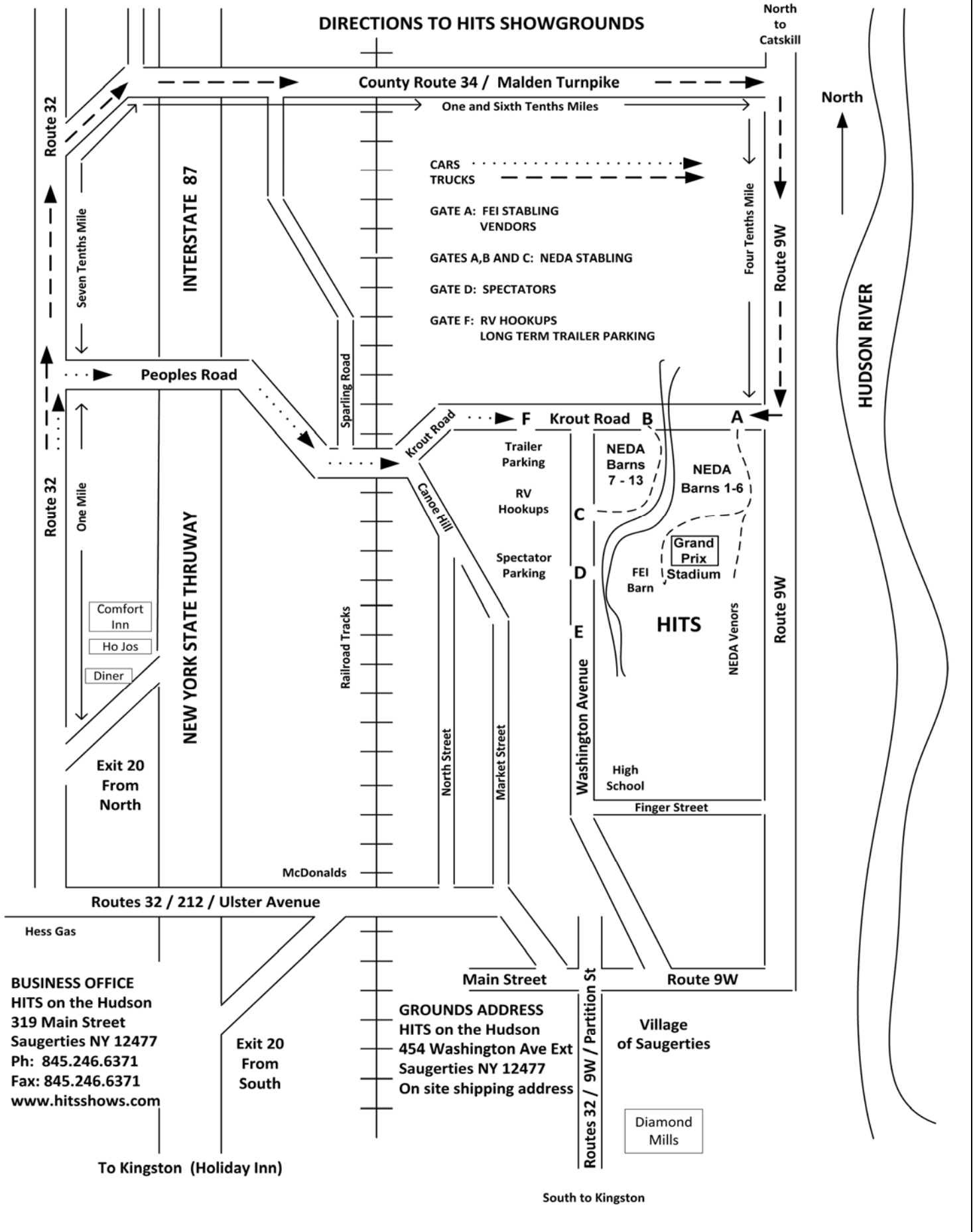
