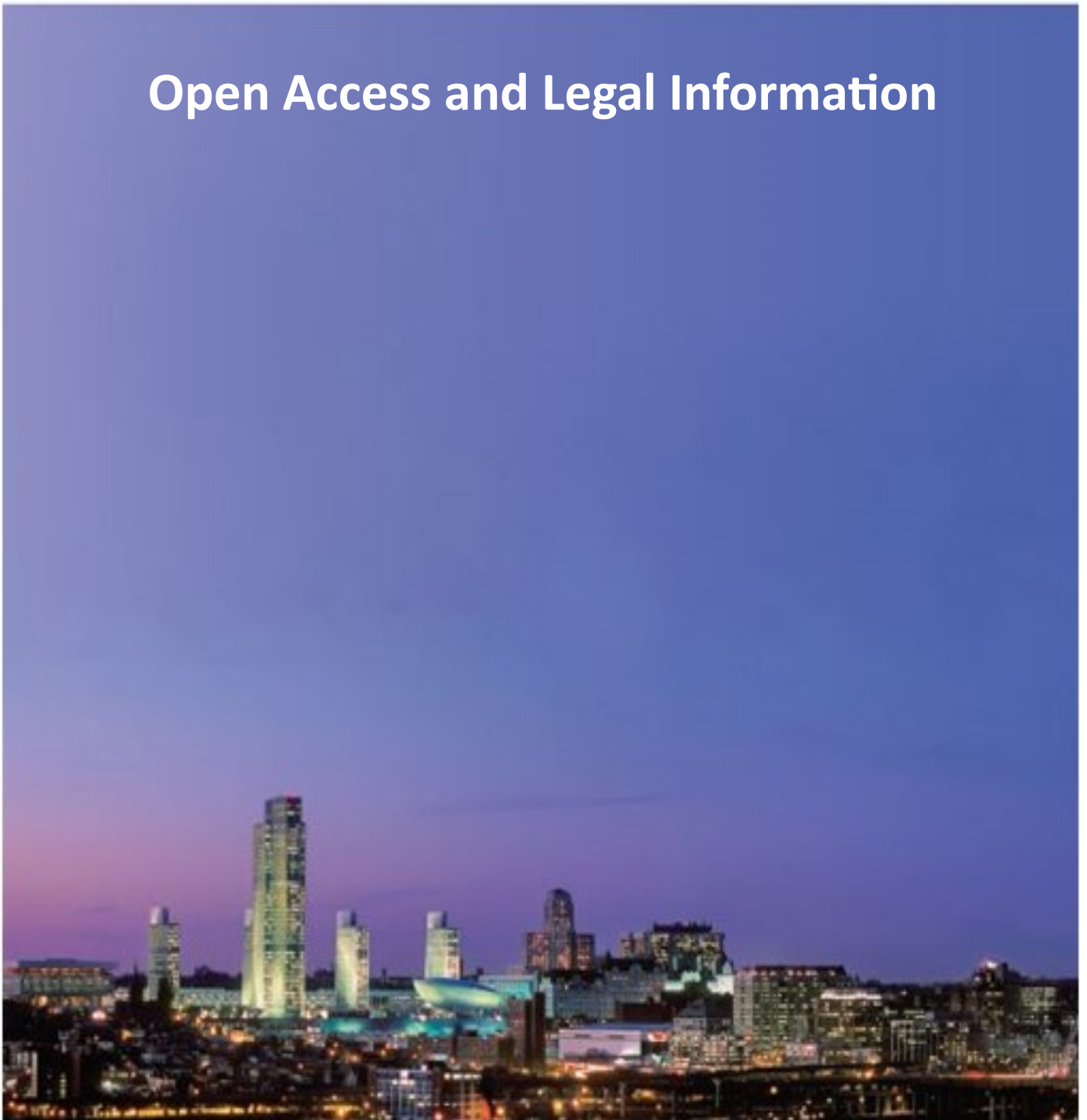

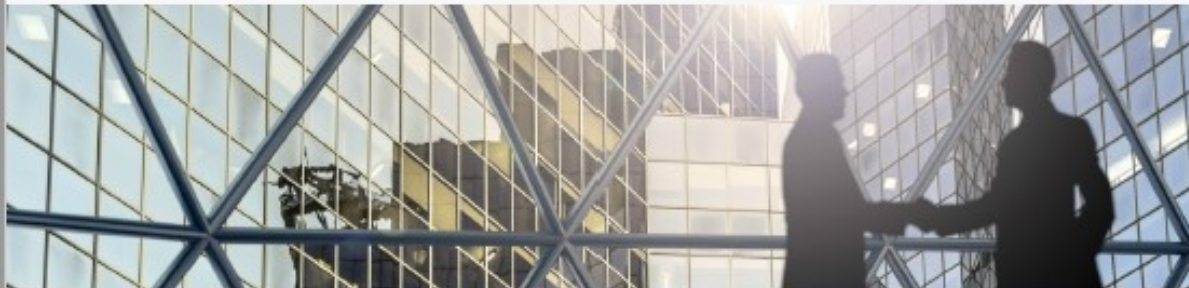

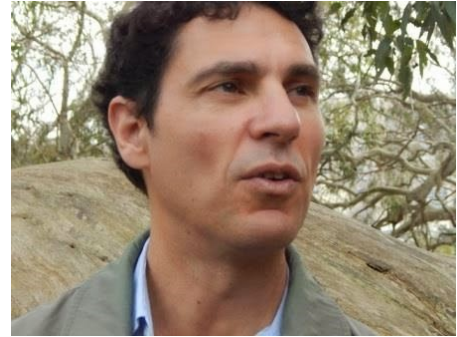

He works with publishers to implement initiatives that increase rigor and reproducibility in the published literature and supports researchers with the process of preregistration: specifying analysis decisions before data collection in order to increase the reproducibility of scientific findings. My background is in behavioral ecology, with experience in citizen science and undergraduate advising.
