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**Associate Member:** A person who is engaged or employed in one of the following categories and is not eligible for membership under Article II, Section 1 of the NHCBA By-laws, shall be eligible for Associate Member status: a law student enrolled in an ABA accredited law school; a teacher or professor of law at an ABA accredited law school; a law clerk in Federal or Connecticut Superior Court, including Temporary Assistant Clerks; and a legal administrator, legal librarian or paralegal/legal assistant who is employed by a law office, including a corporate legal department, a government, judicial or legal agency, or any other entity devoted primarily to the practice of law. Application for membership shall be made as set forth in Article II, Section 1, and said membership shall be under such conditions and with such rights, privileges and limitations as the By-laws may provide. Associate members shall not have voting rights.

**Instructions:** In order to become an Associate member of the New Haven County Bar Association, one must complete Application Parts I and II and submit them for approval by the committee on membership, along with the appropriate dues payment. The NHCBA will review all applications and notify you in writing of its decision within 45 days of receipt of the completed application and payment, if needed. If declined, a written appeal may be filed with the NHCBA's Executive Committee within 10 days of receipt of such notice.
