



Letter from the Chair

It is only natural as we transition from one year to the next that we reflect on the accomplishments of the past and set our goals or resolutions for the new year. For our Section, we continued to offer the terrific programs that our members have come to expect. Our activities and seminars continued to help our members meet their professional development and continuing education needs for critical operator and professional engineer licensing. These programs strongly support the education component of our mission, are respected throughout the industry, and help ensure the quality and safety of the state's drinking water.

There were also many firsts and expanded activities in 2006, demonstrating our volunteers' ability to think and go beyond "just what we did last year". But these activities in 2006 are only the beginning, as they are also an indication of where we are headed



and what we are capable of as volunteers of NJAWWA.

Our Annual Conference and Section meeting had a new home and new programs in 2006, and received terrific feedback from our members. This "newness" will continue in 2007 as our conference heads to Bally's Atlantic City Hotel and Casino on the Boardwalk on March 27-30. Plans are underway with an expanded program and many of our committees are participating in more activities during the week, creating more opportunities for everyone. The pre-conference workshop on "Global

Warming" has stirred a buzz amongst members, and promises to be a popular session.

In 2006, our Ad Hoc Committee on Corporate Governance completed its review of the Section's governance, and provided recommendations for the makeup of the Board of Trustees. Based on the discussions that followed, and surveys from the membership supporting the changes, a proposal for expanding the Board was approved by the Trustees in December. In 2007 this will proceed towards implementation and formal approval by the members, and expand members' participation opportunities at the Board level.

In 2006, the Section held several activities in connection with National Drinking Water Week. Plans are currently underway for 2007's program May 6-12, and we anticipate a slate of great events. My particular favorite last year was the children's poster contest that was very well received by teachers, children and utilities (see a sampling of entries on our website: www.njawwa.org/nj928.html). Partnering With the Media to Promote NJAWWA and Water Education

Each year, New Jersey's municipal and investor-owned utilities deliver over 500 billion gallons of water to over 7.5 million residents who depend on public water supplies. The New Jersey Section American Water Works Association (NJAWWA) members are committed to improving our water infrastructure, financing repairs, meeting increasingly stringent water quality regulations, preserving and protecting our source waters and meeting customer needs for safe and plentiful water supplies. The Public Information Committee (PIC) works to promote these messages and is actively working to position the NJ Section as the premier "go to" source for water information in the state.

One of the ways the PIC is working to educate New Jersey residents about the value of water is by conducting an NJAWWA introductory campaign to editors of New Jersey daily and weekly newspapers and other media throughout the state. Over the next few months, a letter, Section brochure and other materials will be mailed to general/environmental editors to inform them about the Section and the critical role we play in ensuring the safety of New Jersey's drinking water. This package will also include reference to the current national

print media campaign under way entitled "Only Tap Water Delivers."

The media plays an important role in shaping customer perceptions. Our purpose behind this initiative is twofold, **1)** Introduce the media to critical water issues and the important work being conducted by NJ water utilities, and **2)** Engage the media to help educate NJ residents about the role they can play in preserving our state's drinking water quality. Our communications will be designed to position the NJAWWA as a valuable and professional resource for any future articles related to drinking water issues.

The Public Information Committee meets regularly to discuss these and

other customer education issues. Public Information and the Drinking Water Week Task Force plan to hold a joint meeting at the Section meeting in Atlantic City. Please check posted schedules.
