The International Classification of Diseases, 10th edition (ICD-10) will be implemented October 1, 2015. By understanding the difference between the ICD-9 data set and ICD-10 data set, you will understand the transition and ensure you are coding and documenting to the greatest specificity. ICD-10 requires documentation and identification of laterality, timing and sequencing of visits. The specialties with the greatest impact on code set changes have been identified as Orthopedics and Obstetrics and Gynecology. The conclusion of the presentation you will gain knowledge which will enhance your clinical documentation and ensure accurate data capture as we move into population health.
