Title: Relationships as Health: Towards a Universal Education Approach to Intimate Partner Violence in Primary Care

Session Description

The medical community's efforts to address intimate partner violence have encountered many barriers. With growing evidence for the importance for screening for IPV in medical settings and the USPTF's grade B recommendation, we will discuss an urban FQHC's strategy for screening and universal education around IPV for all adolescent and adult patients.

Several screening instruments have been identified as having high sensitivity and specificity for identifying IPV in health care settings. There is growing evidence for a Universal Education intervention, a model supported by the Department of Health & Human Services (DHHS). Universal Education models serve as primary prevention by educating persons on what a healthy relationship is, and the impact of healthy relationships on health. Studies are suggesting a universal education model has contributed to women leaving unhealthy relationships regardless of disclosure. Research further suggests that a screen for IPV is best accompanied by an appropriate response and a warm, supported referral to a community-based advocate.

We partnered with local and national agencies to address this important social determinant of health. We will present the process of implementing this approach in a FQHC including designing the intervention and protocol, staff training, and preliminary evaluation measures.
