

Serving on the NVLA Board of Directors is a rewarding and important responsibility. Volunteer leaders are responsible for setting the direction of the organization, developing policy, and setting a course for the future. Below is a summary of the roles and responsibilities of each Board of Directors position:

President

The President is the chief executive officer of the Association and collaborates with the Board of Directors to supervise, direct, and control the business affairs of the association. The president ascends to the role of Immediate Past President at the conclusion of his or her term. This is an excellent position for an individual who is looking to help shape the future of NVLA.

First Vice President/President Elect

The President Elect is a three-year commitment. Following one year as First Vice President/President Elect, the officeholder progresses to the role of President and Immediate Past President over the course of the three years. The First Vice President/President Elect role is responsible for leading NVLA member recruitment and retention efforts and performing the duties of the president in his or her absence.

Second Vice President

Serves on the Executive Committee and oversees committees as assigned by the President.

Third Vice President

Serves on the Executive Committee and oversees committees as assigned by the President.

Treasurer

The Treasurer, a member of the Executive Committee, oversees the financial business of the association, including accounts of its assets, liabilities, receipts, disbursements, gains and losses. The Treasurer provides regular reports to the Board of Directors on the financial condition of the association.

Secretary

The Secretary a member of the Executive Committee, keeps a book of minutes of all meetings of directors and members. The Secretary is responsible for maintaining an accurate list of members and provides required notices of association meetings.

Regular At-Large Director (4)

Directors are responsible for collaborating with fellow members of the Board of Directors to set the direction of the organization. These positions are limited to regular members, defined as an employee of an organization that leases vehicles registered in its name or is actively enrolled in and selling vehicle leases to the ultimate lessor under an indirect lease program generally available to motor vehicle dealers. Regular members shall vote for Regular At-Large directors.

Associate At-Large Director (4)

Directors are responsible for collaborating with fellow members of the Board of Directors to set the direction of the organization. Associate members shall vote for Associate At-Large directors.

Immediate Past President

Serves on the Executive Committee, acts as a mentor to the President and First Vice President/President Elect, and typically assists with association fundraising efforts.
