International Bird Rescue (Bird Rescue) was founded in 1971 after a devastating oil spill in San Francisco Bay, and has since provided skilled oiled wildlife responders during more than 220 oil spills worldwide. Today, in order to mitigate the human impact on aquatic birds, Bird Rescue operates an as-needed wildlife emergency response center in Anchorage as well as two full-time wildlife centers, serving the greater San Francisco Bay and Los Angeles metropolitan areas as specialty hospitals providing medical and surgical care for aquatic birds. Between the two centers, IBR typically admits 4,000 to 6,000 aquatic birds per year, with the majority received from other wildlife centers.

California Wildlife Center was founded in 1996 as a wildlife rescue and rehabilitation center in response to the abundance of injured and orphaned animals in the Los Angeles area. Annually California Wildlife Center helps over 4,000 patients including songbirds, raptors, marine mammals and terrestrial mammals.

The Wetlands and Wildlife Care Center (WWCC) serves injured and orphaned wildlife in Orange County. WWCC is capable of rehabilitating over 400 animals at a time. The facility is equipped with animal washing stations, a hospital, indoor and outdoor caging areas, and food preparation areas.
