**Trauma Management Seminar**

This interactive Seminar provides a review of the physiology and treatment of common traumatic injuries, and their consequences, affecting our mammalian and avian patients. Through a mixture of didactic lectures and hands-on practice, participants learn about managing traumatic injuries, including:

- the types, effects, and treatment of shock;
- mechanisms and treatment of hypothermia and hyperthermia;
- assessing and managing dehydration and emaciation;
- effects of hemorrhage and providing hemostasis;
- types, diagnosis, prognosis, and stabilization of fractures;
- wound management, from assessment to treatment;
- and, a general discussion of pain assessment and management.

Participants work in pairs with one adult bird and one adult mammal carcass. Instructors assume participants already have experience doing basic physical exams of patients. All participants receive a Certificate of Attendance for attending the entire 8-hour Seminar.
