Reach: 700,000+ Ohioans in 65 of Ohio's 88 counties via 52 networks spanning 280+ locations

Opioid Epidemic: 86% of Ohio's Community Health Centers provide opioid treatment services (MAT)

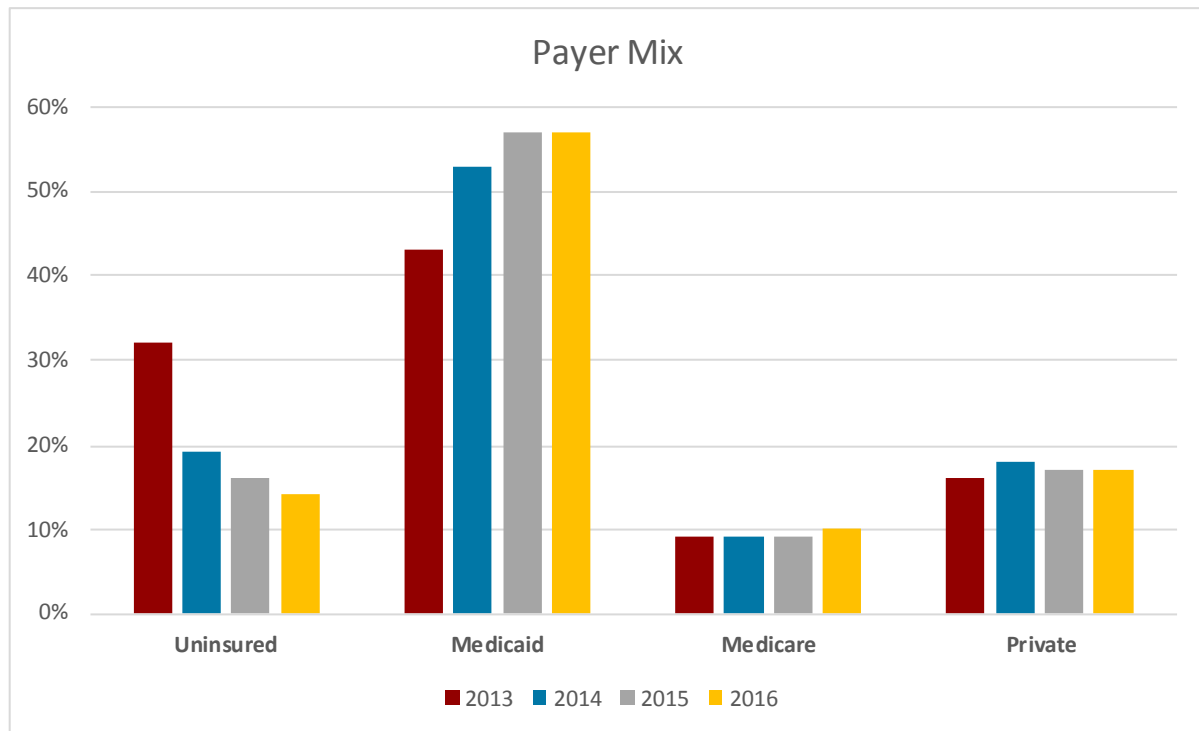
Dental Access: 90+ Dental sites (and growing) | 20% increase in dental patients from 2013-present

Extended hours of operation: Ohio's FQHCs offer after hours care in the evenings and weekends



Program Growth (2013-2016)

- ⇒ 23% Increase in Patients
- ⇒ 47% Increase in Staff/
Health Center Jobs
- ⇒ 35% Increase in Access Points (sites)
