



ADDENDUM A

Potential 2019 – 2020 Leadership Action Learning Projects:

- Ethics: Review consent agreement and adjudications by the State Board of Psychology create a database under categories of the ethical violations and the type of discipline received
- Advocacy: Develop a grassroots network for state/federal issues: develop a survey to members to determine if any members have personal connections to a legislator or their office; get their contact information and ask if they can be a key contact if we needed to call on them
- Advocacy: Develop information/brochure on ways that psychologists can become advocates for the profession
- Membership: Survey early career psychologists to determine the challenges they are facing as they are entering the profession; determine any member benefits that we could offer to help them with the transition
- Membership: Survey retiring psychologists to determine the challenges they are facing as they are ending their career; determine any member benefits or opportunities (mentor new professionals, public engagement, becoming involved in PPA committees, leadership) that we could offer to help them with the transition
- Membership: Survey mid-career psychologists to determine the challenges they are facing as they are entering the profession; determine any member benefits that we could offer; determine if this group of psychologists want to become more involved in leadership/the association in general
- Postdoctoral training/Supervision: Survey students/ECPs on their experiences with supervision; what was good, bad not addressed that should be addressed
- Serious Mental Illness: Survey our members to determine how many of them treat individuals with Serious Mental Illness; develop information for www.psychologycanhelp.com for the public about what they should look for in a provider providing these services
- Public Interest: Assisting the Interpersonal Violence Committee with building out www.psychologycanhelp.com website and on projects that they are currently working on
- Public Workshops: Develop a plan to reach out to the public to let them know that PPA is willing to conduct public workshops on topics of interest (how to handle divorce, stress management, dealing with loss of loved one etc.) Options include monthly workshops at PPA office, workshops in public settings, workshops in conjunction with convention, etc.

- Practice Building: Review products and services that might be useful to expanding one's practice- examples billing program software, scheduling software, platforms for telehealth etc.
