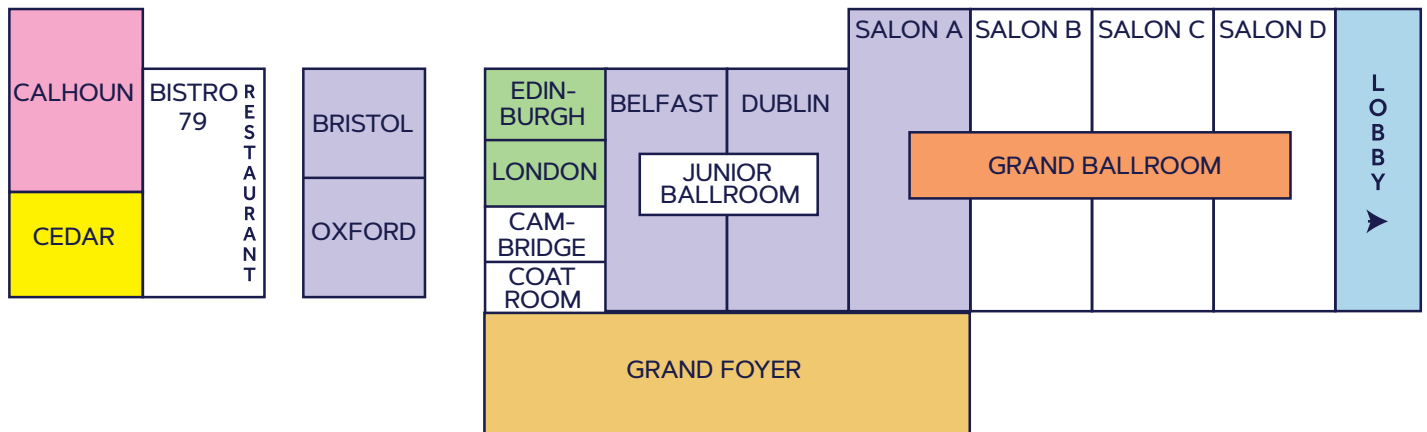

This session will discuss the Minnesota Legal Paraprofessional program and process that the state went through to approve the program. As background, in September 2020, the Minnesota Supreme Court issued an order adopting Court Supervised Practice Rule amendments authorizing the Legal Paraprofessional Pilot Project, effective March 1, 2021, in two areas of civil law: landlord-tenant disputes and certain family law disputes. In 2025, the Legal Paraprofessional Program became permanent with additional practice areas approved.

Trademark paralegals play a vital role in the registration process and beyond, supporting portfolio management and brand enforcement across an increasingly complex IP landscape shaped by AI-driven innovation. Working in both law firms and in-house legal teams, they contribute throughout the lifecycle of a brand—from search and clearance, filing applications, managing foreign associates, and preparing specimens of use, to navigating TEAS, docketing, responding to Office Actions, handling maintenance filings, supporting TTAB proceedings, and overseeing brand enforcement and portfolio management. This session reviews these core responsibilities while focusing on three essential pre-filing steps that are critical to achieving successful outcomes. With more than 70% of applications receiving an initial refusal, the ability to overcome these challenges often depends on the groundwork completed before filing. By mastering the art of becoming “trademarkable,” participants will learn how to improve success rates while reducing inefficiencies, time, and costs in the registration process.

Will Power: The Strength of Legacy Plans (1.0 CLE) SALON A

Estate planning (“legacy planning”) ensures clients’ final wishes are honored and helps families avoid costly disputes. In 2026, 56% of U.S. adults had no basic estate documents (will, trust, powers of attorney, etc.), even though 73% agree planning is personally important. Without a solid plan, state intestacy laws (which vary by state) dictate inheritance, often against the deceased’s wishes, and spouses may nonetheless claim forced shares. Studies show this gap has real consequences: a LegalShield survey found nearly 60% of Americans lack a will despite 90% saying one is important, and 58% have seen family conflict due to missing estate plans. Paralegals have a key role in closing this gap – through client education, careful document preparation, and ethical guidance – helping families preserve legacies and reduce drama.

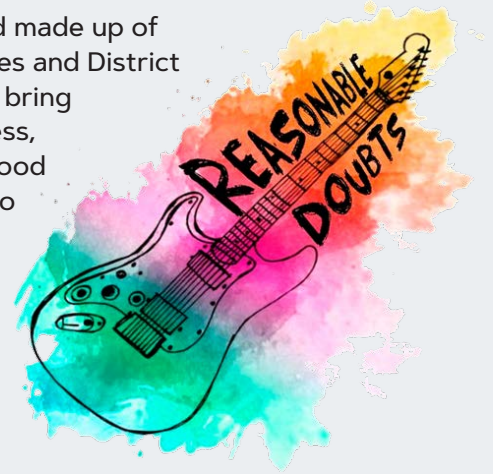

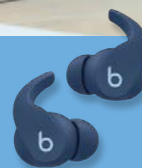
