## **PIMA Urges House to Extend Energy Efficiency and Renewable Tax Incentives**

*100,000's of Jobs and Billions in Investments at Risk*

**Bethesda, MD, October 2, 2008** – The Polyisocyanurate Insulation Manufacturers Association (PIMA) and their member companies have asked the senior leaders of the House of Representatives to support the extension of the energy efficiency and renewable energy tax incentives. The Senate's economic recovery package, which passed on October 1, 2008, included these important energy tax incentives.
