1. Welcome and report by the President and adoption of the agenda

The President (MD) welcomed all Councillors, thanked them for attending and communicated the names of Councillors absent. Concerning the adoption of the agenda, Werner Rühm proposed to anticipate the point 6: "Termination of KARR and GAST memberships" because he must to attend an other meeting. The Council agreed the agenda with this change.

2. Approval of the Minutes of Interim Council, held 2nd September 2013 in Dublin

MD verified that there were no amendments to the Minutes of the previous Interim Council meeting in Dublin and the motion to accept the Minutes (Appendix A) was approved.

6. Termination of KARR and GAST memberships

MD explained the problem concerning the subscriptions not paid by KARR and GAST. IARR Constitution & Bylaws states: "VII. Finances. 1. Member organisations shall pay annual dues to the Association based on the number of their active members, as laid down in the Bylaws of the Association. 2. When

any member organisation has failed to pay its dues for three consecutive years, Council shall consider termination of its membership.” But KARR, IARR member from 2009, paid subscriptions only for 2009 and 2010, in spite of several reminder, while GAST, member from 1974 as Joint German Group, paid last subscription in 2011, in spite of several reminder.

Concerning GAST, Werner Rühm expounded the German position about IARR. Two associations are interested to continue the IARR membership, but a formal decision was not taken. MD proposed to postpone the decision about GAST to next Council meeting, all the Councillors agreed.

Concerning KARR, David Brenner proposed to postpone the decision to next Council meeting, Takeo Ohnishi and Bruce Kimler agreed with him. The Secretary-Treasurer (GG) remembered to the Council that for the same reason the ISRAPS (Indian Society for Radiation and Photochemical Sciences) membership was deleted.

After a short debate, MD proposed to vote two possibilities: a) the membership deletion with the possibility to apply again, b) the postponement of the decision to next Council meeting. Votes were returned at 8:2 in favour of the proposal a) with 1 abstention.

Werner Rühm leaved the meeting.

3. Matters arising from the Minutes not covered by the agenda

Roger Martin reminded the proposal made during the Council meeting in Seoul and in Warsaw, *i.e.* the possibility that the present threshold for national societies of 101 members to have one Councillor decrease to 50.

GG reminded the Council that the resolutions involving amendment of the Constitution may be proposed by the Council or by any two of the member organisations acting together and it must be submitted to the Secretary-Treasurer for transmission to Council at least one year in advance of the meeting of the General Assembly which will vote on it. No requests of amendments were proposed.

MD suggested Roger Martin to follow the procedure for the next 2019 General Assembly in Manchester.

4. Kaplan Award

MD stated that there were three nominees for the Kaplan award this year: Penny Jeggo, Ohtsura Niwa, and Masao Sasaki. The selection committee (Marco Durante, Mary Helen Barcellos-Hoff, Rob Coppes) had a difficult task choosing among these extremely distinguished scientists. They eventually selected Ohtsura Niwa as the recipient of the 2015 Henry Kaplan award. The President congratulated Ohtsura Niwa, on behalf of the IARR, and reminded the Council that Prof Niwa will present the Kaplan award lecture on Friday 29th May at 13:10.

David Brenner leaved the meeting

5. Report of 15th ICRR in Kyoto

Takeo Ohnishi, Chair of the Organizing Committee of the 15th ICRR and President of Japanese Association for Radiation Research, described his report (Appendix B).

The scientific program for five days of the Congress consisting of:

- 463 invited speakers for:
 - 4 plenary lectures
 - 2 special lectures
 - 56 congress lectures
 - 66 eye opener lectures
 - 347 symposia
- 1122 selected presentations:
 - 135 oral
 - 987 posters

There were 1.764 participants (including regular participants and accompanying persons) from 53 countries, in conjunction with some others meetings: 58th Annual Meeting of the Japanese Radiation Research Society, Annual Meeting of Japanese Society of Radiation Chemistry, 53rd Annual Meeting of the Radiation Biology Group/Japanese Society for Radiation Oncology, 44th Annual Meeting of the

Symposium of Tumor Control by Radiation, Annual Meeting of the European Radiation Research Society, 21st Annual Meeting of the International Association for the Sensitization of Cancer Treatment.

In addition, eight satellite meetings were organized.

159 travel support awards for young scientists had been granted by various organizations, 108 excellent poster awards, and 11 Journal of Radiation Research award.

Concerning the budget, MD requested Takeo Ohnishi about the gross income. A budget summary will be sent later.

7. Budget and financial matters by the Secretary-Treasurer and report of the Finance Committee chaired by Dr George Don Jones

7.a. Budget for the period 1st January 2011 - 31st December 2014

GG gave a summary of the USD and EUR accounts for the IARR showing the "IARR Proposed Budget 1st January 2011 - 31st December 2014" (Appendix C), and the "IARR Account 1st January 2011 - 31st December 2014" (Appendix D).

The former was presented to the General Assembly and ratified by the New Council during the 14th ICRR in Warsaw. The latter were submitted in full to the Finance Committee (George Don Jones, Richard Hill, and Bruce Kimler) which reviewed these accounts and provided a letter (Appendix E) stating that they found the accounts to be in good order and recommended approval of the accounts at the General Assembly of the IARR.

7.b. Support of young investigators to attend 15th ICRR

GG presented to the Council name and nationality of the young investigators awarded with travel support.

7.c. Current status of annual subscription payments

GG shown the "IARR 2004-2015 National Societies Members" (Appendix F) and informed Council that at 15th May 2015 eight national societies had paid their dues up to and including 2015, he thanked the national representatives and treasurers for assistance in this matter. The societies in arrear are the Association for Radiation Research (ARR), the Australian Institute of Nuclear Science and Engineering (AINSE), the German National Association of Radiation Research Societies (GAST), the Irish Radiation Research Society (IRRS), the Korean Society of Radiation Bioscience and the South African Radiobiology Society. Considering the fourteen national societies, the total members are about 3,300.

GG reported that till now, many national societies pay for only one hundred active members to have to appoint a Councillor, but from next year it will be necessary to have more than one hundred member as the Constitution states.

7.d. Provisional budget for the period 1st January 2015 - 31st December 2018

The "IARR Provisional Budget 2015-2018" (Appendix G) was presented to Council, although this will have to be ratified by the New Council later in the week. This budget was based on the agreed increase in subscriptions to EUR 4 per member, and a membership of 3,300. The advance for the 15th ICRR (Kyoto, Japan) was maintained at EUR 40,000 (returnable in the event of a profit being made). The first tranche of the advance for the 16th ICRR (Manchester, UK) was included. A non-returnable amount of EUR 15,000 is also allocated for student travel awards to the congress. In addition, modest increases in the support of small meetings (USD 12,000 to EUR 10,000) were proposed for the period 2015-2018. After making these adjustments, the total balance might be EUR 130,000.

7.e. Support to small meetings

GG showed the criteria for IARR support of meetings other than the International Congress of Radiation Research, and the request of Roger Martin to support with USD 2,000 the 14th International Workshop on Radiation Damage to DNA (Melbourne, Australia, 20th-24th May, 2016). MD reminded particularly that the IARR support should be towards assisting younger scientists to attend the meeting. The Council decided to support the meeting.

8. Nominated candidates for IARR Council 2015-2019

MD, as Chair of the Nominating Committee for selection of new IARR Councillors, composed by Marco Durante (Chair, Germany), Günther Reitz (Physics, Germany), Peter O'Neill (Chemistry, UK), Eleanor Blakely (Biology, USA), and Hirohiko Tsujii (Medicine, Japan), shown the following list of candidates:

The Korean Association for Radiation Research (KARR) and the National Association of Radiation Research Societies (GAST) had no Delegates to the General Assembly because the number of Delegates which each member organisation may appoint to the Assembly (Bylaw No. 6) is calculated from the average membership fees paid to the Association during the two years preceding the General Assembly. The same applies to the appointment of Councillors by the member organisations (Constitution III.4.c).

10. IARR website

GG advised the Council that more than 1,500 old IARR documents were scanned and sent to Bruce Kimler, who is in charge of the management of the IARR web site. The “Announcement of second International Congress of Radiation Research in Harrogate (UK) 5-11 August 1962” was shown. The most important documents could be posted on the IARR web site.

11. Any other business

George Don Jones asked explanations about the amendment of IARR Constitution “Change of the number of Councillors appointed to represent member societies to one based on proportional representation” proposed by the Presidents of the Radiation Research Society (RRS) and the Dutch Society for Radiobiology (NVRB).

Mary Helen Barcellos-Hoff explained that a suggestion was made that the minimum number of active members required for a national or regional society to appoint one Councillor be reduced from the current 100 (Constitution III; 4; c) to 50. The amendment is on the agenda of General assembly.

10. Close of meeting

The President closed the meeting at 18:30 after thanking all Councillors for their participation.

1. Welcome by the President and adoption of the Agenda

The President Marco Durante (MD) welcomed Council members and Councillors appointed by member societies. He emphasised that the main function of this meeting is choosing the location for the 16th ICRR in 2019. The Agenda was presented, and adopted after a short discussion about its items.

2. Approval the minutes of the Old Council meeting (Warsaw, 29th August 2011) and New Council meeting (Warsaw, 1st September 2011)

Minutes of the of the two previous Council meetings in Warsaw, sent by e-mail to all members of the old and new Council, were shown and MD requested if there were no amendments to the minutes. There was a move to adopt the minutes by MD, and the motion to accept the minutes was carried.

3. Matters arising from the Minutes not covered by the Agenda

President MD informed Councillors that the Korean Society of Radiation Bioscience failed to pay its subscriptions from 2010 in spite of many requests. IARR Constitution states that when any member organization has failed to pay its dues for three consecutive years, the Council shall consider termination of its membership. MD proposed to postpone this decision, having been sent further email just before this Council meeting. The Council approved the President suggestion.

4. Venue for the 16th International Congress of Radiation Research (ICRR2019)

MD gave notice of the two bids to host the 16th International Congress of Radiation Research (ICRR2019), one in Manchester (UK) from Association for Radiation Research, and the second one in Las Vegas (USA) from Radiation Research Society. The Councillors received the bid's presentations that were discussed by ARR and RRS representatives in 15 minutes presentations each before discussion and ballot.

4.a. Proposals and presentations by Representatives

The proposal of the Association for Radiation Research to host the ICRR in Manchester from 24th to 29th August 2019 was introduced by Kaye Williams, Chair of the proposed meeting. The city, his global accessibility, and the congress venue (Manchester Central) were briefly introduced, together with the possible accommodations and the social program. Dr. Williams also provided detailed information on the Organizing Committee, an innovative programme and exhibitions formats, the registration fees and the budget with the sources of support.

The proposal of the Radiation Research Society to host the ICRR in Las Vegas in mid- September 2019 was introduced by Francis Cucinotta, President of the proposed meeting. He introduced the Organizing Committee, letters of support from many scientific Societies and research Laboratories, financial support from RRS and some US Organization, and registration fees. Potential host hotels and the cost of accommodation were shown, together with the access to Las Vegas and round trip air fares, possible locations for satellite meetings and activities.

4.b. General discussion on proposals

There was an extensive discussion on the two proposals and several questions to the applicants.

4.c. Voting on proposals

The President thanked both bidders and their Societies for the outstanding applications. He proposed that Antonina Cebulska-Wasilewska and Kiyoshi Miyakaga be appointed as tellers for the voting. This was unanimously accepted. The voting was carried out by anonymous ballot by all Councillors present, and the President announced his white ballot. Votes were returned at 9:4 in favour of the ARR bid, with 2 white ballots. MD congratulated Kaye Williams on behalf of the Council.

5. Preparations for the 15th International Congress of Radiation Research (ICRR2015)

Masahiro Hiraoka, President of the Congress, reported on progress of preparations for the ICRR2015 to be held in Kyoto, 25th – 29th May 2015 under the aegis of the Japan Radiation Research Society (JRSS). The Congress will take place at Kyoto International Conference Center, the early registration fee will be JPY 50,000 and for student JPY 20,000, and the late registration fee will be JPY 60,000 and for student JPY 30,000 (JPY 1 = EUR 0.0076 = USD 0.01 at exchange rate of 1st September 2013). Kiyoshi Miyagawa and Kiyoshi Miyagawa are the Vice-Presidents, Kenji Kamiya is the Secretary General, Naoyuki Shigematsu is the Chair of Finance Committee, and Kazuo Sakai and Yasumasa Nishimura are the Co-Chairs of Scientific Committee, that will include all IARR Councillors, while the local Organizing Committee will be implemented with members of AARR, RRS, ERRS and IARR. Theme of ICRR2015 will be: "Radiation Science Shaping the Future of The Earth and Mankind", and Fukushima Nuclear Accidents and Progress of Medical Application will be presented as the main topics. A tentative programme was shown, together with concurrent international and Japanese meetings that will be held in the same region, and satellite meeting as the 12th International Microbeam Workshop, the International Symposium on Physical, Molecular, Cellular and Medical Aspects of Auger Processes,

NASA Symposium, and Meetings at Hirosaki University and at Hiroshima University. Concerning the accommodation, approximately 1,000 rooms were booked daily during the Congress, for daily rates ranging from JPY 10,000 to 15,000. The hotels are located near the subway, which takes you to the venue in 10-20 minutes. The Gala dinner will be held at Toei Kyoto Studio Park. Excursions in some World Cultural Heritages in Kyoto are expected.

The President congratulated Dr. Hiraoka for his excellent work and thanked him for informing the Council on the progress of the meeting. The Council noted that it was important to start shaping the program now and to invite speakers as soon as possible. The topic of the ICRR must be kept general, even though radiation medicine and the Fukushima accident may be presented as meeting highlights. Plenary, high-quality invited lectures on these topics will be welcome. It is also stressed that all IARR Council members should be invited into the Scientific Council.

6. Secretary-Treasurer's Statement and Balance sheets:

6.a. Budgets for 2011/2012 and 2013/2014, including final report of the 14th International Congress of Radiation Research (ICRR2011)

The Secretary-Treasurer Gianfranco Grossi (GG) informed Council about the current status of annual subscription payments. At 30th August 2013 nine national Societies had paid their dues up to and including 2013, he thanked the national representatives and treasurers for assistance in this matter. The Societies in arrear were the Australian Institute of Nuclear Science and Engineering (AINSE), the Chinese Radiation Research Society (CRRS), the National Association of Radiation Research Societies (GAST), the Korean Society of Radiation Bioscience (KSRB), and the South African Radiobiology Society (SARS). Considering all the fourteen national Societies, the total members were about 3,300.

Then GG presented the proposed budget 2011-2014, approved by the General Assembly and shown to the New Council during the meetings in Warsaw, compared with actual figures 2011-2012 and provisional budget 2013-2014 (see appendix). The negative difference of about EUR 10,000 on the estimated 31st December 2014 balance resulted from the non-return of the total loan of EUR 40,000 to ICRR2011, because only EUR 6,000 returned.

GG showed to the Council the final report of the 14th International Congress of Radiation Research (see appendix) held in Warsaw from 28th August to 1st September 2011 prepared by Marek Janiak, Chair of the ICRR2011 Organizing Committee and President of the Polish Radiation Research Society.

6.b. Financial support for the ICRR2015

GG reported that in 2007, during the San Francisco meeting, the General Assembly decided to allocate a loan of EUR 40,000 to support the ICRRs. Concerning the return of this loan, GG shown to the Council a statement requested by Eric Hall and decided at the Interim Council meeting in San Juan in 2001: "profits should be returned in proportion to the seed money put up". The IARR currently advances EUR 40,000 for the ICRR, therefore any profits should be returned to IARR on the basis of this amount as a percentage of the total seed money advanced to the meeting. This loan will be allowed in two transfers of EUR 20,000, as a general rule the first one in 2014 (June/July) and the second one in 2015 (January/February).

6.c. Support for other meetings

GG showed the criteria for IARR support of meetings other than the International Congress of Radiation Research, and a list of supported meetings from 2000. There were three applications: the 16th International Symposium on Microdosimetry (Treviso, Italy, 20th -25th October, 2013) with a request of EUR 3,000, the 13th International Workshop on Radiation Damage to DNA (Cambridge, USA, 14th-18th June, 2014) with a request of USD 10,000, and the 11th International Symposium on Chromosomal Aberrations (ISCA11) (Rhodes, Greece, 12th -14th September, 2014) with a request of EUR 3,000. Because the amount allocated for support to small meetings remaining for 2013-2014 was EUR 5,600, the Council decide to support the three meetings with EUR 1,500 each.

7. Kaplan Award 2015

GG informed the Council that the closing date for nominations for the Kaplan award would be one year in advance of the Kyoto meeting (May 2014). Flyers advertising the award, with a request for nominations, should go to National Society Representatives, Radiation Research, International Journal of Radiation Biology, Journal of Radiation Research, and Radiation and Environmental Biophysics 6 months before the closing date (*i.e.* November 2013).

The Selection Committee for the Kaplan award normally includes the IARR President, Vice-President and Past-President. In the event that one of these people is nominated for the award, he can be replaced by another IARR Councillor.

Concerning the cash prize of the award, it will be of EUR 2,000, as shown in the Proposed Budget 2011-2014, with an additional amount of at most EUR 1,000 for travelling.

8. Appointment of Nominating Committee for the 2015 elections to Council

Because the short time remaining, the President and Secretary-Treasurer proposed to appoint by e-mail the Nominating Committee for the 2015 elections of the new members of the Council. This motion was seconded and unanimously carried.

9. Appointment of Finance Committee to audit the IARR accounts in 2015

Before the ICRR in 2015 a Finance Committee, to be appointed by Council, would also need to occur to audit the IARR accounts for the period 2011 to 2014. As for the Nominating Committee, the Council decided that the three Finance Committee members will be chosen by e-mail

10. Web site for IARR

Because the short time remaining, the discussion concerning the IARR web site was postponed to next Council meeting.

11. Any other business, followed by close of meeting

There was no other business. The President closed the meeting at 14:40 after thanking all Councillors for their participation.

of the 14th International Congress of Radiation Research – ICRR’2011
(www.icrr2011.org)
held in Warsaw, Poland, from Aug 28 to Sept 1, 2011**

Venue: Warsaw, Poland, the Palace of Culture and Science (altogether 17 lecture halls on three different floor were used)

Participants: :

668 participants (including regular participants and accompanying persons) registered by the Congress and Tourism Bureau ‘Congressor’, **355 participants** (registered by the Radiation Research Society - RRS) and **34 pre-selected lecturers, totaling 1057 participants.**

Accommodation: 1096 rooms had been reserved in 22 hotels (including 1 student dormitory) at rates from 78 PLN (19 euro) for a single room to 740 PLN (180 euro) for a double room; most hotels were within walking distances from the Congress venue.

Actually, **358** persons had booked their accommodation (excluding the RRS members who booked their hotels separately) in 16 hotels (one- to five-star; mostly four-star)

Budget: (exchange rate as of Aug 25, 2011: 1 euro = 4.16 PLN):

Income (gross) including donations from IARR and the Polish Ministry of Higher Education and Science: 1,787,016.97 PLN (429,571.4 euro)

Expenses (gross): 1,711,807.11 PLN (411,492.1 euro) + 123,619 PLN (29,711 euro) paid as tax (VAT), part of which (82,721.6 PLN = 9,885 euro) was refunded in 2012.

In December 2012 **6,000 euro** were **returned to IARR.**

Andrzej Wojcik who chaired the Scientific Program Committee (composed of seventy-seven scientists) put together **a scientific program** for four full days of the congress of the including :

- **18 congress lectures**
- **7 plenary lectures**
- **23 eye opener lectures**
- **34 symposia** (mostly with four speakers per symposium) encompassing **142 lectures**
- **1 debate**
- **5 award lectures** (11 awardees: 4 international and 7 from RRS)
- **842 posters** (displayed throughout the duration of the Congress).

In conjunction with the 14th ICRR **57th Annual Meeting of the Radiation Research Society was organized**. The RRS provided upfront financial support of USD 150,000 in return for which RRS was independently responsible for registering of up to 375 RRS members, arranging its headquarters hotel, meeting rooms and associated events including the Scholars-in-Training (SIT) workshop, the RRS business meeting, RRS committee meetings and RRS receptions.

In addition, **five satellite symposia** were organized in conjunction with the ICRR2011:

- *Ethics of Environmental Health*, Prague (Czech Republic), Aug 24-27, 2011, organizer Prof Friedo Zoelzer;

- *7th International Symposium on Physical, Molecular, Cellular and Medical Aspects of Auger Processes 2011*, Jülich (Germany), August 24-26, 2011; organizer Dr Ekkerhard Pomplun;
- *Scientific Fundamentals and Current Clinical Statute of Neutron Capture Therapy*, Warsaw, 31 August, 2011; organized by the International Society for Neutron Capture Therapy.

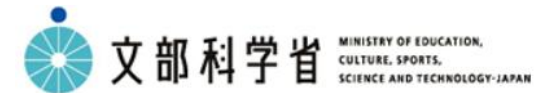
