For example, indicate the percentage of total employees that participated; note if the organization realized its intended goals as a result of the initiative(s); note if the initiative(s) has/have become a part of the organization's culture. Detail a specific recognition initiative that this person is especially proud to have developed.

CRITERIA OF A TRUE RECOGNITION CHAMPION IS AN INDIVIDUAL WHO:

- » Passionately believes in the principles of recognition.
- » Takes the initiative to spread the message throughout their entire organization.
- » Overcomes management & employee indifference.
- » Practices recognition again and again.
- » Talks about, demonstrates, and delivers recognition.

Eligibility Guidelines

1. Nominations of RPI members and member self-nominations are encouraged.
2. Nominee must be a RPI practitioner member.
 - a. Practitioner member: A professional who is engaged in developing and implementing recognition and reward programs and who does not supply or provide a resource for employee recognition.
- 3. Nominee must be a RPI practitioner member for a period of one year prior to submitting a Recognition Champion nomination form.**
4. Recognition Champion Award winners are lifetime award winners and cannot be considered multiple times.
5. Past and present RPI Board of Directors members are eligible to be awarded the Recognition Champion Award.
