## Updated information on free non-medical masks for water and wastewater employees

"The Colorado Water/Wastewater Agency Response Network (CoWARN) is reaching out to water and wastewater utility employees in Colorado to offer a second round of free non-medical face masks. Please [sign up](#) by **Wednesday, June 10**.

CoWARN has received 90,000 masks from FEMA, but so far only 10,000 masks have been requested by utilities. If there aren't enough requests for these masks, FEMA may request that CoWARN send the masks to another state. If you don't need any masks or have feedback about this project please fill out this [anonymous survey](#).

Utilities that received masks during the first round are **eligible** to receive masks during this second round. All water and wastewater utilities in Colorado are eligible to sign up; these masks are **not** just for CoWARN members.

Masks can be picked up at Denver Water, Parker Water and Sanitation District, the City of Grand Junction, or at Colorado Rural Water Association headquarters in Pueblo. In addition, utilities can request that the masks be shipped to them directly, but will need to cover the cost of postage.

CoWARN is increasing the number of masks that can be requested per full time employee. Previously, utilities were told to request 2 masks per employee, but utilities can now request up to 10 masks per full-time employee. However, please continue to only request masks for employees that need them."
