- June 2019 ILO Centenary Declaration adopted & declared that "safe and healthy working conditions are fundamental to decent work"
- 10 June 2022 All constituencies agreed to the decision that safety and health at work is a fundamental right
 - Technical Fundamental conventions:
 - C 155 Occupational Safety and Health Convention, 1981 (No. 155)
 - C187 Promotional Framework for Occupational Safety and Health Convention, 2006

Decent Work

Significance of decent work:

 Ensuring safety and health at work is indispensable as a hearing ability is part of our daily lives and the ability to resume work safely

- Fundamental principles and rights at work
- Commitment to significant health & safety improvement beyond meeting legal requirements

Approach

- Proactive and preventive to improve on 2003 regulations
 - ✓ Extension of scope to beyond 85 dB(A)
 - o Inclusion of :
 - Action levels
 - Ototoxic chemicals
 - Vibration
 - Earlier reporting to CI
 - ✓ Inclusion of vulnerable employees and gender specific aspects on:
 - o information, instruction and training and
 - o risk assessment
 - ✓ Code of Practice may have some differences, the Department will address it through the SABC TC on SANS 10083


