
ABOUT FEM


- FEM was established in 1936




- The number of Employers FEM covers has increased and has more than doubled in 20 years
- The employee lives covered has also increased accordingly
- The accident frequency, or number of workers involved in an accident per 100 lives covered, has been reducing
- The reduction in the frequency was due to a number of factors such as:
 - ✓ OHS Legislative changes
 - ✓ Employer/Employee commitment
 - ✓ Collaborations with industry stakeholders
 - ✓ Health and Safety Initiatives




ACCIDENT TRENDS IN CONSTRUCTION

INJURIES



- The injuries in the South African workplace show similar trends to other countries in the world
- The higher trend of motor vehicle accidents in South Africa is one of the worrying differences (9.21% versus 5.5% in the US)

DISEASES



- The number of industrial disease claims FEM receives is a frequency of 0.11%
- The percentage of our claims that are industrial diseases is on average less than 4.47% of claims
