Challenges of Conducting BAT/Collector Training via Webcam/Online

Presented by Betye Bailey, Corporate Training Manager for Intoximeters

Unlike most DOT-required training under Part 40 regulations, both Breath Alcohol Training (BAT) and UDS Collector training require proficiency demonstrations that must be monitored in real time by a qualified instructor. These proficiency demonstrations (mock tests) make webcam training for BATs and Collectors very difficult to accomplish.

In this webinar, we will briefly review DOT's training requirements for both BATs and UDS Collectors and then discuss how to meet those requirements in a fully online training course. Topics covered include:

- Length of time needed to cover required training elements
- Resources needed for webcam session (e.g. partner for the mock tests)
- Logistical considerations such as the type of webcam being used and functionality of the EBT instrument
- Monitoring mock tests with limited visibility and a fixed viewpoint
- Effective proofreading of ATFs and CCFs
- Best Practices and preparations
