- Duration & size of project, extent of its ability to operate at design level, and cost effectiveness
- Describe the project monitoring program as it concerns compliance, public information, and performance evaluation
- Describe the contribution of the cooperating parties to the project (e.g. SCDHEC, Clemson Extension Service, USDA, landowners, etc.)
- Provide information that determines compliance of project with local, state, & federal regulations
- Describe training activities that have improved operations
- Give evidence of the enhanced benefits that have resulted from the project, such as lower costs, energy savings, enhanced soil properties, better crop productivity and quality, and improved public acceptance
