## 2015 – Minneapolis St. Paul Chapter

### Section 1 – Executive Summary

The Minneapolis/St. Paul Chapter has been in existence since SDA's inception. It was then known as the Architectural Secretary's Association (ASA). Our Chapter began as the Minneapolis Chapter, but later St. Paul was introduced. We are locally known as the "Twin Cities."

Through the years our Chapter has had excellent networking practices that include membership retention, educational programs, social events and chapter member communications.

Professional development is key to our Chapter's success. Our monthly meetings continue to address the five subject areas for Certification:

- Office Administration
- Marketing
- Project Management
- Human Resources
- Finance

Another great leadership/professional development for our Chapter is that we currently have seven members that have received their CDFA certification. This certification process is promoted in our Chapter on a regular basis, and we encourage our members to visit the national website and attend the CDFA University to prepare for the exam. Many of our members have received personal recognition in their firms in receiving promotions by having their CDFA certification. This gives our members a well-rounded understanding of our profession, as well as providing CEU's for our certified members.

The Chapter has given the prestigious Star Award to a member of our Chapter each year since its inception; given for significant contributions to the membership of our Chapter and the entire society through participation in and support of its meetings and publications, fundraising, recruitment, or other significant activities. It is quite an honor for our President (who attends the annual EDSymposium) to come back and present the award at our Chapter meeting.

The Chapter won the Gold Level Chapter Foundation Award in 2013, and have noted it on our website.

Every year we have sent our Chapter President or Delegate (if they could not attend) to the annual EDSymposium. The Chapter has set aside funds through our "Carol Powers Ernst Scholarship Fund" to assist members of our Chapter to go to EDSymposium by paying their registrations (see Appendix "A" – Application Form for Carol Powers Ernst Scholarship Fund).

The Chapter keeps a sponsorship database and also a list of A/E/C firms from the Minneapolis/St. Paul Bizjournal. We have used it to draw potential new members. We also use the booklet that our local AIA office sends to all of our members called, *Architecture/MN* (see Appendix "B" – Example of page from *Architecture/MN* booklet). This booklet comes out each month and includes firms from all the disciplines in our local area. This gives us another means to find out how many local firms are currently available to send an administrator to our Chapter.

We have used member surveys to prepare for our annual Chapter meetings in the fall of the year, and the Board of Directors of the Chapter regularly keep in touch with our membership through e-mails, phone calls, and luncheons. The entire chapter takes on the responsibility of getting new members, and we encourage the current members to work toward bringing in one new member each year.

We have strategically emphasized the one-on-one invitation to join our Chapter. This is done through personal E-mails, LinkedIn or Facebook Invitations, lunches or a meet-and-greet by the Chapter. Our Chapter has also had great retention of members throughout the years.

We have always provided job opportunities to members and non-members alike. When members hear about a job opening, the member sends out an E-mail explaining the job responsibilities, as well as give a contact name and number if they know someone that might be interested in the position. We do not charge for providing this service. We see it as a networking opportunity.

Our website is available and used by all members of the Chapter. The Board of Directors use this tool to keep us up-to-date on meetings, events, articles of interest, construction®, and awards. We also provide a section called “SDA at a Glance” where we can direct potential members to understand what SDA is all about for those who are viewing our website for the first time. (See Appendix “C” – “SDA at a Glance” Brochure).

We are very pleased to not only have a Chapter website (SDAMN.org) but also Facebook and LinkedIn accounts (see the 2015 Chapter Checklist for the URL address for Facebook and the LinkedIn group). The chapter had a speaker for one of our monthly meetings in the past that helped our members understand the differences for these various accounts, as well as hands-on examples during the meeting. Our Chapter website did receive a National Award in years past.

The Chapter’s monthly meetings are held at the AIA/MN offices Board Room. This room has the ability to use technology to include members or guests through GoTo meetings if they are unable to attend a meeting. The most important aspect of our Chapter meetings is that we provide continuing education speakers each month. Ten of the twelve meetings include a speaker, and most of the time we don’t have to pay the speakers. We are well known throughout the community due to our active membership, and they are usually very happy to come and share their knowledge with us.

Many of the member firms provide outstanding continuing education to their staff, as well as AIA/MN includes our SDA Chapter members at their continuing education monthly meetings and convention every year.

Due to the longevity of our Chapter, the great leadership by our Board of Directors, and the networking by our Chapter members, the Minneapolis/St. Paul Chapter should receive the Chapter Excellent recognition.

We are very proud to be members of our local Chapter and have great leadership by our National Executive Committee, and for that we all are very enthused to be members of this great organization.

### Section 2 – Best Practices

#### ***Best Membership Campaign:***

Our members have created their own E-mail, LinkedIn, and/or Facebook, to send personal invitations to prospective members. The personal touch is what we are looking for in order to have perspective members understand what SDA is all about. Once contact is made we invite them to our website so they can see what our local Chapter provides to the members, and talk with them about the importance of National membership. (See Appendix “D” – Example E-mail Invitation).

#### ***Best Membership Retention Outreach:***

November is our annual Business meeting. Our Chapter President encourages the membership to make sure they renew their membership early so they continue to receive all the benefits of SDA membership. The reminder is written up in our meeting minutes that are sent to all members, and the Board of Directors makes personal contact with each member to encourage renewal, as well as explain and encourage the member support in working on various committees within the Chapter and/or National. The Chapter has our yearly banquet (paid for by the Chapter) and installation of new officers in December (see Appendix “E” – Example of Banquet Program). The incoming President, in their remarks, reminds members to renew their annual membership in SDA.

#### ***Best Educational Programs:***

The most important aspect of our Chapter meetings is that we provide continuing education speakers each month. Ten of the twelve meetings include a speaker, and most of the time we don’t have to pay the speakers. We are well known throughout the community, and they are usually very happy to come and share their knowledge with us. The Chapter has also used SDA National Webinars and Tapes for educational meetings. (See Appendix “F” – Spreadsheet of 2014 Programs and Presenters).

Annually the Chapter acts as greeters to all the AIA/MN State Convention attendees and the Chapter sponsors one CEU session at the convention. The current Chapter President not only introduces the speaker for the session, but gives an overview of our local SDA Chapter. Each attendee receives a small brochure created by the Chapter that emphasizes the current convention theme, and we put our SDA membership application forms on a table for attendees to take along and give to their administrators. (See Appendix “G” – AIA/MN State Convention Brochure). This is our best Chapter educational event for members and non-members to understand how important our Chapter really is to the educational opportunities that we provide our membership.

#### ***Best Networking/Social Event:***

Around October each year the Chapter membership has an after-hours networking event to begin discussions on what the membership would like to see happen at our next year’s Chapter meetings. It is a fun evening, with food and beverages, where we share ideas on the types of speakers we should be looking for and are interested in hearing about, and finding ways to improve how we network and reach out to potential members (see Appendix “H” – Sample Agenda from Chapter Networking Event).

### ***Best Fundraising Effort:***

The Chapter has developed a once-a-year effort to ask for sponsor contributions to our Chapter at four different levels: Millennium \$300; Titanium \$200; Platinum \$100; Gold \$75; Silver \$50; or Other \$\_\_\_\_. It has been either by a personal letter, or E-mail messages. What the sponsor receives in return is they get their name posted to our website with a contact name, and they are recognized in our annual AIA/MN State Convention brochure that goes out to all the Architects attending the convention. This has been an extremely successful way for our Chapter to receive money to assist members to attend EDSymposium, as well as assist us if we need to pay for a speaker at our meetings. (See Appendix “T” – Sponsor Letter).

### ***Best Communication Tools:***

Our Chapter members find using E-mail, LinkedIn and GoTo meetings effective ways for us to communicate with each other. Our monthly meeting minutes as well as Board meeting minutes being sent via E-mail to all members helps to keep us up-to-date on what our Chapter is doing currently, and what will be coming up in the future. We are fortunate that AIA/MN supports our Chapter by posting to their E-mail Newsletter information and pictures about our Chapter meetings and our annual canstruction® event. (See Appendix “J” – canstruction® event).

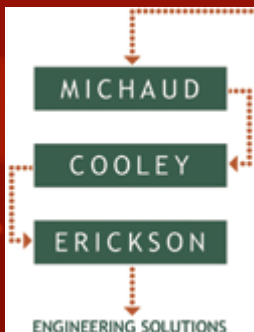

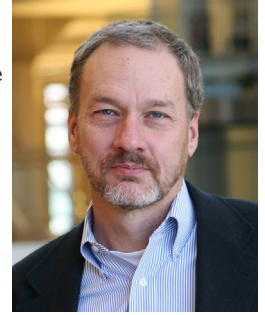
## PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE

### BOARD OF REGISTRATION

This board licenses and regulates architects, engineers, land surveyors, landscape architects, geologists, soil scientists, and certifies interior designers. It's 21-member board has three licensed architects; five licensed engineers; two licensed landscape architects; two licensed land surveyors; two certified interior designers; two geoscientists; and five public members. Not more than one member may be from the same branch of the profession of engineering. Each professional member must have 10 years experience and shall have been in responsible charge of work for at least five years. Full board meetings are held a minimum of seven times a year. In addition, members attend monthly committee meetings as needed at 160 Golden Rule Building, St. Paul. Architects currently serving on the Board include Paul May, AIA, Miller Dunwiddie Architects; Terry Groshong, AIA; and Wayne Hilbert, AIA, CNH Architects.

### STATE DESIGNER SELECTION BOARD

There is an opening for an AIA Minnesota member to serve on the State Designer Selection Board beginning in January 2015. This is an important position for AIA Minnesota to fill. The State Designer Selection Board selects the primary designer on building construction or remodeling projects as requested by state agencies (except CAAPB), the University of Minnesota and Minnesota State Colleges and Universities on all projects with an estimated cost greater than \$2,000,000 or planning projects with estimated fees greater than \$200,000. Selection for the Primary Designer is based on qualifications. 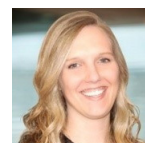

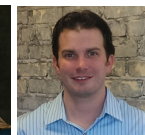
