MINUTES

The 8th Annual Meeting of SEAHO was held at 9 a.m., February 18, 1972 at the Conference Center of the University of South Alabama. The meeting was called to order by Ray King, University of South Florida, who presided.

Dick Kraus presented the seal which was used on the cover of the programs for the meeting and moved that this be adopted as the official seal of SEAHO. The seal is "designed to suggest architectural planes and the very 3-dimensional aspects of educational housing complexes."

"The ten-sided geodetic outline represents the 10 member states as well as one of the most popular modern architectural devices, the Geodetic (geodesic) Dome." It was designed by Robert S. Holberg, Program Director at the University Center of the University of South Alabama.

Jim Hennessey, University of Florida, seconded the motion, which passed.

John Storey, University of Georgia, moved that SEAHO adopt the proposed constitution which had been drafted by the Host Committee.

The motion was seconded by Paul Henry but was defeated.

Jim Grimm, University of Miami, moved to institute the adoption of a program of representatives from each member state, chosen by the institutions representing that state at the SEAHO Annual Conference.

Larry Ivy, University of Kentucky seconded the motion, which passed.

The states will caucus at the end of the meeting and turn over the names of the representatives to Dick Tickle of Appalachian State University, the host institution for 1973.

D. W. Burkes, Mississippi State, issued an invitation to SEAHO to meet there in 1974.

John Storey moved that we accept and the invitation was unanimously accepted.

Dick Tickle spoke of the plans for the 1973 conference to be held in the mountains of North Carolina. The dates are not yet set but the plan is to hold the conference during Snow Carnival. Motel accommodations will be available for 100 people. There will be a two day program with

the business meeting being held on Saturday morning.

Dick Kraus reminded the group of the ACUHO committee sign-up sheet and asked that anyone interested in serving on a committee sign up before leaving.

Chuck Lynch, University of Miami, reported that the Placement Service had been reasonably successful. The number of listings was small but he felt that it accomplished something. Further placement services will be carried on by the ACUHO Placement Service.

Ray King expressed thanks to Don Moore and the Tulane group on behalf of all of those who enjoyed his hospitality for pre-conference activities.

Jim Hennessey moved that the meeting be adjourned.

Jim Grimm seconded the motion, which passed.

RESOLUTION # 1

Paul Henry, Auburn University, read a resolution to the effect that a vote of appreciation be given to Dick Kraus and the find Housing Staff of the University of South Alabama for their hospitality. The motion was unanimously passed and a standing ovation duly extended.
