

Amendment One: Additional Membership Status

- **Amendment Champion:** Bryan C. Botts, Director of Communications
- **Summary:** A constitutional amendment to add a third membership category to account for association engagement by individuals who do not qualify as SEAHO members under the current institutional or corporate membership categories.
- **Proposed Changes:** Under Article III, Membership (additions in red)
 - 3. Non-Affiliate Membership** – open to any individual, institution, or organization outside the ten Southeastern states of the United States (Alabama, Florida, Georgia, Kentucky, Louisiana, Mississippi, North Carolina, South Carolina, Tennessee, and Virginia) who is associated with an institution of higher education that has housing officers involved in the administration, dining services, guest housing, facilities management, operations, and residential life.
 - a. Non-Affiliate Members** – any individual employed by an institution or organization identified above. Non-Affiliate Members may neither vote nor be elected to office, serve on a committee or task force, or receive support from SEAHO’s grants or other financial assistance. Non-affiliated members cannot receive financial support from SEAHO to participate in SEAHO or ACUHO-I-sponsored events, nor are they eligible to attend SEAHO’s Regional Entry Level Institute.
- **Rationale:** This additional membership status would establish guidelines for non-members requesting to participate in SEAHO events and use association resources. Further, it would allow SEAHO to better manage technology and website for individuals requesting to attend the annual conference. You can review the entire document outlining this amendment [here](#).
