We believe this year's conference will be an enriching and exciting one that has the potential to engender strong connections and future creativity. With its concentration on the integration of change process research into practice, this conference stands poised to move the field forward in a meaningful and sustainable direction that can provide us all with truly 'integratable', empirical knowledge. We hope you will come away from the SEPI conference feeling energized, with innovative new ideas, techniques, and methods to readily integrate into your psychotherapy practice.
