### SETAC Pellston Workshop®: Omics

Spring 2019, South Korea

The objective of the workshop is to define a roadmap for how -omics (e.g., genomics, transcriptomics, metabolomics, etc.) data can be used in the regulatory arena to improve human and ecological protection. The goals of the workshop are to increase capacity to interpret -omics data and to develop a standardized strategy for their integration with other in silico, in vitro and in vivo data into risk-based decision-making, toxicity testing, environmental monitoring and environmental quality criteria development.

### SETAC North America- Focus Topic Meeting: Estimating Environmental Risk from Per- and Polyfluoroalkyl Substances (PFAS)

12-15 August 2019, Durham, North Carolina, USA

The purpose of the meeting and breakout sessions planned is to review information on PFAS chemistry, exposure potential, and human and ecological toxicity, and 2) to formulate a roadmap to developing a risk assessment approach that considers mechanistic approaches for extrapolating exposure and effects across different scenarios/species and compounds within environmental pathways of exposure.
