### **Getting People to Work for Free**

*Luis von Ahn to present human computation work at SIMposium 08*

CHICAGO – Luis von Ahn gets people to work for free every day. His “games with a purpose” entice them to play simple online games that help make computers smarter. Von Ahn will share his pioneering ideas at *SIMposium 08*, taking place November 9-12, at Disney’s Contemporary Resort in Lake Buena Vista, Fla.

According to von Ahn, there were nine billion hours of solitaire played in 2003. He says that if 5,000 people instead simultaneously played ESP Game, his picture labeling game, they could label all of the images on Google in two months. The best part – the players don’t realize that they are performing a task.
