CHICAGO (June 14, 2011) – The [Society for Information Management \(SIM\)](#) has launched its [2011 SIM IT Industry Trend Survey](#), which provides a recognized industry benchmark for IT executives in areas including spending, salaries, job scope of IT professionals, and technical/business trends.
