# Science Festival and MarineQuest offer FREE Hands-On Science to St. Pete City's Innovation District site for 6th annual event

**ST. PETERSBURG, FL** – The city's *Innovation District* is the backdrop for thousands to get their hands on science! More than eight years after members of the St. Petersburg Ocean Team got together and decided to offer science to the masses, their vision is now a reality along Bayboro Harbor.

The area along the Harbor, including USF's St. Petersburg campus and the Florida Fish and Wildlife Conservation Commission's Fish and Wildlife Research Institute, is transformed into a huge science lab under the sun. This year's <a href="Science Festival">Science Festival</a> and <a href="MarineQuest">MarineQuest</a> will be held on Saturday, Oct. 22 from 10am-4pm; this complimentary event is open to the public!

Attendees will experience hands-on activities representing the Science, Technology, Engineering, Arts, and Mathematics fields (STEAM). Festival attendees will interact with robots, use medical technology to check their own vital signs, conduct chemistry experiments, crawl through a full-size Turtle Excluder Device, visit SharkCon, explore the Wonders of the Insect World, and learn survival skills at FireQuest.

The day before the FREE Saturday event, more than 1,000 school children are treated to a sneak peek of the festival during organized school trips. The coveted slots go fast and students often come back on Saturday with their parents. The growing interest in STEAM subjects is exciting to event organizers and our Tampa Bay area residents.

"Through public science events like the St. Petersburg Science Festival and MarineQuest, we can inspire tomorrow's leaders to pursue educational opportunities that will further St. Petersburg's vision of becoming the epicenter of

innovation, economic development and ultimately, jobs that help change the world," said Howard Rutherford, St. Petersburg Science Festival Co-Chair.

The collaboration with MarineQuest means more people, a bigger geographic footprint, and more STEAM education for everyone. The two festivals together attracted close to 25,000 attendees during the free open house day in 2015.

"The enthusiasm we see for science is why we started MarineQuest twenty-two years ago, and why we are thrilled to have the added bonus of the Science Festival," said Gil McRae, Director of the Florida Fish and Wildlife Conservation Commission's Fish and Wildlife Research Institute. "This is what the Ocean Team set out to do, share science and entice young people into the science field."

Along with hundreds of hands-on activities, the festival will have two stages featuring live music, shows, and interactive entertainment throughout the day. Entertainers include Mad Science, Giving Tree Music, Funky49, Kidding Around Yoga, and more.
