

# The General Secretary's Introduction

# 'The entrance of thy words giveth light; it giveth understanding unto the simple.'

Psalm 119.130

In presenting to you the 2024 Annual Report edition of the *Quarterly Record*, we are once again thankful to the Lord for the work appointed for us and for the resources to carry it out. We are especially thankful where the Lord has graciously answered prayer over the past year. In supporting the work of the Society before the throne of grace, and in practical ways through distributing the Scriptures as you are able, we trust that we are co-labourers together in the work: staff and supporter, member and missionary, translator and distributor.

This year's edition includes a devotional reflection on Revelation 3.8: 'Behold, I have set before thee an open door'. In Scripture the image of an 'open door' often signifies a God-given and quided opportunity to proclaim and

promote Divine truth. This is especially applicable to the Society at present, as the past year has been marked by an unmistakable momentum in the work of Bible translation and distribution. We are now engaged in digitisation, revision, or translation work in 90 different languages, with consultancy provided in a further five. In addition, there are over 40 more languages where we are carrying out research or the potential for future projects exist. As our Editorial Director notes in his report:

Our resources as a Society, human and material, may seem small, and indeed the challenge before us seems scarcely sustainable with what we have. Yet when joined to prayer, dependence on God, and unwavering commitment to His Word, the resources entrusted to us may become mighty tools for the advancement of His Kingdom.

The work of the Society continues to expand globally, standing on the shoulders of those who have gone before, and in this edition we trust you will gain a renewed appreciation for the worldwide nature of our work. For the first time we include reports from


our two distribution centres in Ethiopia and Colombia, alongside updates from our branches, translation projects, and wider distribution efforts. It is especially encouraging to report a 10% increase in the number of Scriptures and Scripture items circulated through sales and grants in 2024. We strive that, where we have a Gospel translated and distributed, to later have a New Testament, and then a full Bible, if the Lord will. We are grateful for the cooperation of like-minded organisations and for the continuing support of our sister society, GBS, in key projects including the Spanish, Chinese, and Hebrew Scriptures.

Our supporters in the UK and Ireland will be familiar with our Deputation Speakers, who are often the public face of the Society in churches across the British Isles and beyond. Their valued labours are also reported in this magazine.

As we rejoice in open doors for translation work, we must not forget that translation is only the beginning.

Without distribution, the translated Word cannot fulfil its appointed purpose. We therefore urge your prayerful support for the practical means required to print and distribute the Scriptures. Whether in countries where printing is costly or in regions where legal restrictions hinder distribution, we are dependent entirely upon the Lord to provide the resources and open the way. Isaiah reminds us, 'So shall my word be that goeth forth out of my mouth: it shall not return unto me void' (Isaiah 55.11)—and the Lord often uses the prayers, giving, and labours of His people to bring this to pass.

However, as we reflect on these open doors and causes for thankfulness, we must also acknowledge with grief the direction of the United Kingdom in which the TBS headquarters are based. Recently, the UK Parliament has approved new pro-abortion legislation that further disregards the sanctity of life. Added to this is the growing momentum to legalise assisted dying,



removing protections for the most vulnerable and undermining the value of life at its beginning and end. These are not isolated issues, but clear symptoms of a nation that has turned its back on the Word of God. Where God's Word is rejected, moral confusion, injustice, and spiritual decline inevitably follow.

s we rejoice in open doors for translation work, we must not forget that translation is only the beginning. Without distribution, the translated Word cannot fulfil its

appointed purpose.

The Bible declares: 'Righteousness exalteth a nation: but sin is a reproach to any people' (Proverbs 14.34), Our prayer is that, even in these dark days, the Lord would graciously turn many back to His Word. The pressing need of our day is not merely political reform, but spiritual reformation—a return to the authority, truth, and life-giving message of Holy Scripture.

As a Society, and with our members and supporters, we remain committed to upholding the Holy Scriptures, to confessing without compromise 'the Godhead of the Father, of the Son, and of the Holy Ghost, Three Co-Equal and Co-Eternal Persons in One Living and True God'. Our work is founded upon the belief that God's Word alone brings light to darkened hearts and nations. This year marks 1,700 years since the Council of Nicaea, which declared the full divinity of the Son of God, standing against the errors of Arius. It is sobering to consider that in our own day, the Person and glory of Christ continue to be diminished—not only through false teaching but also through the rejection of the Word that testifies of Him. At our recent conference,

we considered these matters under the theme *Christ in the Text*, highlighting how the modern critical Greek text often omits or weakens passages that declare His deity and how Christ as the 'scopus scripturae'—the scope of Scripture—is the incarnate Word declared in the written Word.

God willing, we look forward to welcoming vou to our Annual General Meeting in September. We give thanks to the Lord for His continued provision in the life of the Society. In April the Rev. James I. Gracie and Pastor Darren Cadapen were prayerfully added to the General Committee, brought on to support and strengthen the work entrusted to it. Both have previously spoken on behalf of the Society (Pastor Cadapen previously

working for the Society), and have been actively involved in the work of local auxiliaries, demonstrating a longstanding commitment to the Society's stand for the Scriptures, mission to distribute Bibles, and witness to the glory of God. We trust that, under God's guiding Hand, their contributions will serve to uphold the spiritual and practical oversight needed for the work ahead.

May the Lord stir us to labour faithfully while it is yet day, and may He yet be pleased to revive many around the world. We especially think of those countries the Society has branches and offices in: Australia, Brazil, Canada, Colombia, Ethiopia, New Zealand, the United Kingdom, and the USA.



# Operations Report

### 'I will delight myself in thy statutes: I will not forget thy word'

Psalm 119.16

he Trinitarian Bible Society has the privilege of distributing God's Word in faithful translations. As we do so it is our sincere prayer that the Bibles we distribute would be read and, under God's blessing, be the means by which the Saviour of the Scriptures is known.

Reading the Bible is unlike reading any other book.

## It is able to make us wise unto salvation

The Bible is able to make us wise unto salvation, through faith which is in Christ Jesus, the most important thing for any individual human being. As Paul writes in 2 Timothy 3.15–17: 'From a child thou hast known the holy scriptures, which are able to make thee wise unto salvation through faith which is in Christ Jesus. All scripture is given by inspiration of God, and is profitable for doctrine, for reproof, for correction, for instruction in righteousness:

that the man of God may be perfect, throughly furnished unto all good works'.

If we read the Bible rightly we read it prayerfully, praying that the Holy Spirit would open our eyes to behold wonderful things out of God's Word. We read, seeking to have the teaching of the Word of God revealed to us personally—not only as seekers first searching for the truth, but again and again, for doctrine, reproof, correction, and instruction in righteousness, that we might be complete and 'throughly furnished unto all good works'.

### It is through His Word that God makes Himself known

We read our Bibles not merely to know about God, but seeking that we might know Him personally. As Jesus prayed in John 17.3: 'This is life eternal, that they might know thee the only true God, and Jesus Christ, whom thou hast sent'.

Paul expressed this in Philippians 3.8–10, speaking of 'the excellency of the knowledge of Christ Jesus my Lord' and his

desire 'that I may know him, and the power of his resurrection, and the fellowship of his sufferings'. If we read the Bible rightly, we read it seeking to know God for ourselves and to hold communion with Him. As individuals, we get to know each other through speaking and listening. In His mercy, God speaks to fallen sinners through His Word—and it is His Will that we would read and listen to that Word. Each sinner who is given the grace thus to listen to His Word and act upon it will also find that the Lord teaches them to speak in reverence to Him—in both prayer and praise.

### It shows us where sin is and how sin can be avoided and overcome

Psalm 119.11 states: Thy word have I hid in mine heart, that I might not sin against thee. It has been said that just in that one verse we have four things: the best resource (God's Word), the best practice (hiding it in our hearts), the best place (in our hearts—not merely on the shelf or in our minds, but in that internal place of the soul), and the best motive (that we might not sin against God).

The Bible shows us what sin is. If we read the Bible rightly, we read it seeking that the Lord will give us a clear view of what sin is, where it exists within us, and how it can be forgiven and overcome. As God in His mercy blesses His Word to us, He shows us the one way—the Lord Jesus Christ—by which the guilt of sin can be forgiven and the power of sin can be overcome.

The Word of God is our best resource. May the Lord cause us to prayerfully read, and reread, and then reread again the Scripture, hiding it in our hearts. The Lord's people will often find an inward battle arising from a disinclination to read the Word of God—because it doesn't suit our fallen nature. And yet to read it at times is also our greatest joy and is always our great need. The Christian will have this battle in them

until they are brought safe home to glory: the flesh lusting against the Spirit and the Spirit against the flesh. What a comfort to the believer it is, to know that greater is the Holy Spirit within them, than the world, the flesh, and the devil. May the Lord grant us each grace that we might persevere in prayerfully reading God's Word and hiding it in our hearts, that we might not sin against Him.

### The Society's Aim is unchanged since its founding in 1831.

The object of this Society is to promote the Glory of God and the salvation of men, by circulating, both at home and abroad, in dependence on the Divine blessing, the HOLY SCRIPTURES, which are given by inspiration of God, and are able to make men wise unto salvation, through faith which is in Christ Jesus.

We cannot know the extent to which the Society has promoted the Glory of God in any given year, so must content ourselves with reporting on the circulation of the Holy Scriptures at home and abroad and sharing reports about various aspects of the work.

The headline circulation summary for 2024 is that 3.6 million Scriptures and Scripture items in 41 languages were circulated to 98 countries.

### **Grants**

During 2024 over 2.36 million Bibles, Scripture portions, and Scripture items were granted free of charge to institutions and individuals at home and abroad. Every grant application is scrutinised to ensure, as far as is practicable, that grants of Bibles, Scripture portions, and other items are distributed through

channels which will be acceptable to the Lord and to our supporters. As well as supplying many smaller grants to approved recipients, we also supply large grants each year to grantees who have a close association with us. Some examples of larger grants awarded during 2024 are listed below.

Whilst these Scriptures were sent out by us in 2024, in some cases the local distribution is still ongoing. Pray that the Lord would oversee and bless the scattering of this Gospel seed throughout the world.

### Sales

Supporters will be aware that we also distribute the Holy Scriptures by way of sales, often at heavily discounted prices. This is an important distribution channel for the Society, and most of the items we sell will later be given away free of charge on the mission field. Some 1.24 million Scriptures and Scripture items were sold by the Society worldwide in 2024. Of these, 188,600 were under licence or royalty to other publishers.

In 2024, 95% of our total circulation (grants plus sales) came through publications which we procured and circulated ourselves, and 5% through licensing

or royalty arrangements with other publishers.

In 2024 we once again received the Feefo Platinum Service award for our sales work. This award is given to businesses that have achieved the Feefo Gold standard for three consecutive years or more. Over the last year, our average Feefo Service rating was 5 and our Product rating was 4.9 (both out of 5). Our all-time Service and Product ratings both currently stand at 4.9. We are grateful for our dedicated staff members and our loyal and supportive customers. The breakdown of distribution according to Grants and Sales was 66% grants and 34% sales.

Taking grants and sales together, the total number of items circulated in 2024 was 10% higher than in 2023. Overall, 424,746 more copies of the Scriptures (Bibles, New Testaments, and portions) were circulated in 2024 than in 2023. This increase comprised significantly more Gospels and New Testaments than in 2023,

but fewer Bibles—a result of demand for newer translations in which the Society has published a Gospel for the first time, but in which we do not yet have a complete Bible. Our prayer is that the Holy Spirit would abundantly bless these copies of the Word of God, to the salvation of His own people and for the glory of His Name.

### **Countries and Languages**

Our motto is 'The Word of God among all nations'. As mentioned earlier, in 2024 we distributed **3.6 million Scriptures and Scripture items in 41 languages to 98 countries**; these countries and then the languages are listed below.

### **Feedback from grantees**

It is always an encouragement when we receive an email, letter, or phone call with an expression of thanks for a TBS Bible or other Scripture item that has been received. Some letters are sent by prisoners writing on cheap paper in their prison cells, others are sent by grantees labouring at home and abroad to share the Gospel of our Lord Jesus Christ with needy men, women, and children. Look out for the latest distribution news in 'The Word of God Amona All Nations' section in your Quarterly Record magazine. Some supporters tell us that they like to use these photos and letters to help inform their prayers for the Society's work, along with other content which we publish in print and online.

## UK Scripture poster display campaigns

As a Christian Society with a core emphasis on the Holy Scriptures, we believe that it is a great public benefit to present the Holy Word of God freely to members of the public. To this end, we have for many years operated a campaign whereby we coordinate the display of large Scripture



posters in public places throughout the UK, most recently in bus shelters.

In 2024 we refreshed our poster designs, adding a QR code to allow passers-by to scan and continue reading the Word of God via the TBS Online Bible. In 2024, 98 (2023: 57) individual bookings were made for our 2025 campaign, through funding provided by 38 sponsors (2023: 25).

UK recipients of this *Quarterly Record* will find enclosed a flyer for the 2026 TBS UK Bus Shelter Scripture Poster Campaign. Please pray that the Lord will bless the 2025 and 2026 campaigns.


### **Auxiliaries**

The Society's published Aim speaks of circulating the Scriptures 'at home and abroad'. Therefore, as well as having an international focus to our work, we also encourage the circulation of the Scriptures at home. The Society's regional auxiliaries, active in the UK, USA, and Canada, contribute significantly to this locally oriented work.

In 2024 the UK auxiliaries were responsible for circulating 25,121 Scriptures and Scripture items, the vast majority through grants to schools, prisons, hospitals, and care homes. 13,299 of these publications were Bibles and around 930 were New Testaments. We are thankful for the many auxiliary committee members and volunteers who give their time to pursue the Society's Aim in their local regions. ### Children's quizzes

Each year we publish two quizzes, one for junior students and a senior version, on a theme connected to the Society's work and principles. These quizzes can be completed by anyone, but children in countries in



which TBS has an office can earn a Scripture award through them. Completed quizzes are returned to the respective TBS offices for marking, and where a good effort has been made a

prize is then sent out. Quizzers can choose to receive one of several TBS Bibles or Scripture items for themselves, or they can ask that a Bible or New Testament be granted on their behalf to an overseas grantee selected by TBS HQ. Our hope is that the children will enjoy completing the quizzes and will also be edified by doing so. In 2024 the theme of the children's quiz was Robert Morrison.

In total, 486 correct quiz submissions were received from children worldwide.
172 English Bibles were awarded to children as prizes—comprising 97 Camouflage Pocket Reference Bibles and 75 White Presentation Royal Ruby Bibles. Additionally, on behalf of children who completed quizzes 628 Chichewa Bibles will be granted to children in Malawi once the Bible project has completed (two copies are being sent

on behalf of each of the 314 children who requested that a grant be made).

We are hugely indebted and thankful to a gifted and faithful volunteer in the UK who helps our Editorial Department to prepare the annual children's quizzes. She also marks each one (for the UK) and responds to the quizzer with a handwritten card; no doubt the arrangements are similar in our Branches. May the Lord bless this investment in these young lives and may He raise up another generation to involve themselves in the important work of the Society.

### **Conferences and exhibitions**

In March 2024, the doors of the Society were opened to the public to highlight our work in Bible translation and distribution. We were pleased to welcome many local Christians to our head office at William Tyndale House; as well as viewing various displays, visitors participated in a tour of the building and attended presentations from staff on aspects of the Society's work. There were also several activities for children to participate in.

In November 2024 we held *Inspiration and Text* conferences, where the vital doctrine



of the inspiration of the Holy Scriptures was explored, as part of the Society's Promoting and Upholding work. Two main conferences were held, in London, England, and Lisburn, Northern Ireland, supplemented by two meetings targeted specifically at young people, in Belfast, Northern Ireland, and Inverness, Scotland. Some of these sessions were recorded and released online for those who were not able to be present. # **Branch** Greetings



t is with sincere gratitude, in the name of our Lord Jesus Christ, that the Board of Directors and staff of the Trinitarian Bible Society's Australian Branch address you. As we review the past year, we are once again reminded of God's unfailing support, prompting us to declare with thankfulness, 'Hitherto hath the LORD helped us', The vital work of TBS (Australia) headquartered in Grafton on the north coast of New South Wales persevered throughout 2024.

The Australian Commemorative Bibles have proven to be a significant blessing. The initial despatch from Grafton occurred in late November 2023, and we rejoice that of the first printing of **5,000 copies**, all have been distributed.

Throughout 2024, a total of 1,604 Commemorative Bibles were granted, and **503** copies were purchased by individuals and bookstores. These grants reached a diverse range of recipients, from grandparents desiring a single Bible for a grandchild, to a boarding school seeking 500 copies to place a copy in every bedside locker. Some Bibles found their way to market stalls and others were lovingly distributed to children at outreach camps. We are particularly encouraged by the significant number that have been placed in both Christian and secular schools through Religious Education programs. Furthermore, many churches embraced the opportunity to provide a free Bible to each child in their Sabbath Schools.

Australian **Commemorative** Rihle

We are thankful to report that an additional 5,000 copies have been printed in the new Hampton Bible setting. With God's grace, 2,500 of these will soon depart from London, and we anticipate inviting individuals to express their interest in obtaining more copies for free distribution.

The profound impact of these Bibles is clearly seen in the heartfelt expressions of gratitude from grant recipients:

- The children will cherish the excellent Commemorative KJV Bibles received for their Scripture classes.
- Deepest thanks ... Over 200 young boys and girls have been requesting Bibles, and today, God has answered our prayers.
- The children's delight in their new Bibles was evident—a sentiment beautifully captured in pictures of excited young recipients.
- A request for an additional 200 Bibles underscores the growing demand as new families discover a welcoming space for Scripture learning.
- Expressions of gratitude from the city of Coffs Harbour highlight the urgent need for God's Word in this nation.

Further grants in 2024 included:

Bibles: 543

New Testaments: 70

Words of Life calendars: 380

Tracts: **25 packs** Posters: **17** 

This brings the total number of Bibles granted in 2024, including the Commemorative Edition, to **2,149.** 

Including these grants, a total of **647** orders were carefully packed and despatched across Australia, as well as to New Zealand, the Philippines, and Singapore.

We also gratefully acknowledge that donations and legacies in 2024 showed a significant increase of 75% compared to the amount received in 2023.

We acknowledge that in our own strength 'we can do nothing', and that we depend entirely upon the Lord for wisdom, strength, and provision. The Lord has given us wonderful partnerships here in Brazil, who have just presented to us their reports.

Printed Bibles – By God's amazing grace, through our own warehouse and through our special partnerships, we distributed **248,212** complete Portuguese Bibles in 2024. To God be the glory!

Bible App – One of our key Bible App partners (Biblia JFA Offline) reported that **3,581,390** individual users read **146,586,992** chapters of our Portuguese ACF Bible in 2024! Again, to God be the glory!

Online Bible Search – Our online Bible search partner (bibliaonline.com.br) reported that in 2024, 34.6 million active users, in 200 countries read 155.8 million passages of our Portuguese ACF Bible. Speechless!

or my administrative assistant, Mrs Jolanda Tichelaar, and me, 2024 was not only a year of much change, but also a year of much learning. We had to become familiar with all aspects of managing the TBS (Canada) office and interacting with the many individuals, churches, schools, outreach organisations, and prisons that we serve. Every week we were pleasantly surprised by the number of people who visited our store. Many were familiar to us through our range of church contacts, but almost every week we also welcomed customers or visitors who learned about TBS for the first time through word of mouth, via public transit advertisements, and the local Coffee News (a weekly two-page news flyer placed in many fast-food outlets in Lethbridge and neighbouring towns), or because they were visiting a nearby business and were curious about the new Bible store next door. We occasionally welcomed people who were disappointed to learn that we only sell the Authorised (King James) Version of the Bible, but those occasions became opportunities not only to explain why we only sell the KJV, but also to offer free literature for further reading.

### **During the year of our Lord 2024, TBS (Canada):**

- Granted hundreds of Bibles to Sunday school and elementary school children.
- Almost as many were also provided at a discounted price for middle and high school students.
- More than **1,500** Bibles were granted to prison inmates through their chaplains.
- More than 15,000 Bibles, New Testaments with Psalms, and individual Gospels were granted or sold at reduced prices to organisations and individuals for distribution as part of their outreach work.

It is both humbling and encouraging for us to be involved with the distribution of so many TBS Bibles and Scripture items throughout Canada. Our country has largely forsaken its Christian heritage and no longer acknowledges the authority of God's Word in public education, the justice system, and all levels of government. Despite our backsliding as individuals and as a nation, the Lord still allows us freedom of worship and facilitates the distribution of His Word throughout the land. Truly, 'It is of the LORD's mercies that we are not consumed, because his compassions fail not. They are new every morning: great is thy faithfulness' (Lamentations 3.22–23).

Throughout the past year, the Lord inclined the hearts of many individuals, churches, organisations, and businesses to support the work of the Society financially. Small and great, every gift is a humbling reminder that the Lord continues to provide even though the cost of living has risen disproportionately to personal income. 'The silver *is* mine, and the gold *is* mine, saith the LORD of hosts' (Haggai 2.8). To Him be all thanksgiving and honour for the funds received, which enabled us to cover all costs incurred, provide the

additional monthly funding TBS (UK) needs to pay the Tagalog translator full-time, and transfer a large surplus to TBS (UK) for other translation and granting projects.

Thanks to the sustaining Hand of the Lord, and the invaluable help of Mrs Tichelaar and several loyal volunteers, I may report that 2024 exceeded my expectations. Having the opportunity to read much in preparation for writing articles for the *Canadian Report* was a very rewarding and instructive experience. Meeting new people in person or via telephone calls and conversing with them about their outreach efforts gave me a deeper appreciation for the extent of Bible distribution in Canada. It is the Word of God, and He will cause it to bear fruit wherever and in whomever He will.

In both the spring and the fall, I travelled to Ontario to attend the annual meetings. It was my privilege to hand out Bibles and carry out TBS presentations for students in schools and/or homeschool groups in British Columbia, Alberta, Saskatchewan, Manitoba, and Ontario, and each opportunity was a rewarding experience. Attending the AGM in London and meeting several of the TBS team at William Tyndale House was a special privilege as well. It gave me an even greater awareness of the enormity of the undertaking in which TBS is engaged. Towards the end of the year, I was diagnosed with cutaneous T-cell lymphoma (Sezary Syndrome) and needed to start treatments immediately. Despite time off for treatments, I was enabled to do most of my work for the remainder of the year. 'What shall I render unto the LORD for all his benefits towards me?' (Psalm 116.12).

With this brief overview of the past year, I extend TBS (Canada)'s hearty greetings to TBS (UK) at William Tyndale House as well as to each of the other Branches. May the Lord bless and prosper the Trinitarian Bible Society in its efforts to make 'The Word of God Among All Nations' a reality. The Apostle Paul, in 2 Thessalonians 3.1, wrote, 'Finally, brethren, pray for us, that the word of the Lord may have *free* course, and be glorified, even as *it is* with you'. May the Lord grant prayer in all our hearts for the Society and each of its many labourers. Most importantly, may His Holy Spirit accompany His Word. He has promised in Isaiah 55.10–11, 'For as the rain cometh down, and the snow from heaven, and returneth not thither, but watereth the earth, and maketh it bring forth and bud, that it may give seed to the sower, and bread to the eater: so shall my word be that goeth forth out of my mouth: it shall not return unto me void, but it shall accomplish that which I please, and it shall prosper *in the thing* whereto I sent it'. Let that be an encouragement for 2025.

# **Colombian**Distribution Centre

he year 2024 brought several challenges but also many reasons to give thanks at our TBS distribution centre in Medellín, Colombia. Despite the impediments that presented themselves, the Lord allowed us to distribute many Spanish Bibles and Bible materials during the year.

In March, a container holding nearly 3,000 Spanish Bibles for distribution in Colombia finally arrived at the seaport of Cartagena after its long journey from the printer in Brazil. However, the following day a gas explosion and subsequent fire destroyed the entire warehouse, including our Bibles. This was a setback, but the Lord enabled us to receive a shipment of Bibles sent by air from TBS (USA) until we could get more Bibles shipped from Brazil.

A few months later, we were suddenly informed that we had two weeks to vacate the premises of the office and warehouse we were renting in Colombia. In the Lord's providence, we were able to find a place to rent which was larger and more suitable for our purposes, at a cost that was considerably more economical.

One of our primary activities in 2024 was completing the many steps for the legal establishment of the office and distribution centre in this country. After fulfilling the legal, accounting, and administrative functions required, we received our status from the Colombian government. Spanish Bibles were then imported from Brazil, the

United Kingdom, and the United States. This process always involves much paperwork, but we are now legally registered to import in this country.

In addition to Mariela Guardia, who works as our Latin America distribution coordinator from the Colombia office, we have employed an assistant there who works on filling and shipping orders three days per week, sending them via local doorto-door delivery services.

Each year we print Spanish materials to be distributed in Colombia and many other countries in Latin America. In the Lord's goodness, in Medellín we were able to print 10,000 copies of the Gospel according to John, 15,000 Golden Thoughts calendars, and 15,000 Words of Life calendars. We also printed 80.000 Scripture leaflets for evangelistic purposes, as well as 2,000 copies of the Spanish version of the article What today's Christian needs to know about the Greek New Testament which are used at conferences and promotional events. These TBS materials were distributed from our offices to many areas of Colombia as well as to other countries. We had to wait until the social and political unrest in Venezuela and Ecuador calmed down before we could supply them with Bibles. Finally, in November and December we were able to send the materials to them.

After the initial presentation of the RV-SBT Bible in Colombia in June 2023, we experienced a great demand for our

Bible, and the first shipment of Bibles was depleted very quickly. Thankfully, by late 2024 we had received an additional shipment of 6,000 Bibles from the printer in Brazil for sales and grants purposes.

Our work also involves promoting the RV-SBT Bible revision and making it more widely known by way of participation in different events inside and outside the country. For example, we had a TBS stand and exhibit at a large Baptist conference in Bogotá, Colombia in April, where our Colombian representative spoke to the audience about the completed TBS Spanish Bible and the textual aspects involved in its preparation. We were also present with a stand at the annual convention of the Latin American Reformed Seminary in Medellín, where there was an international audience of more than 800 participants. At this convention, we distributed TBS materials as part of the packet that was given to all attendees.

During the past year several churches in Colombia held denominational meetings, and they contacted us beforehand to request TBS articles and other items for distribution at their meetings. These events present an excellent platform to publicise the materials and the work of TBS, and specifically of our TBS distribution centre in Colombia.

In Latin America social media platforms such as Facebook, Instagram, and YouTube have become a primary and important means of communication for any entity or organisation to maintain a close connection with its audience. Our TBS team in Latin America has also worked to optimise the use of these platforms to promote our work and to further instruct our followers concerning the mission and work of the Trinitarian Bible Society.

Since 2024 was our first year of operation as the officially established Trinitarian Bible Society Colombian distribution centre, it has been a challenge for us to import materials from outside the country, and this work has required a lot of time and resources. Because we are a new entity in Colombia, we have received inspection visits from government officials to verify our purpose in the country.

However, despite the challenges, we may say that hitherto the Lord has provided all that has been necessary to carry out the work in this country, and we pray that He may bless His Word to those who receive it in Colombia and beyond in the vast continent of South America.





# **Ethiopian**Distribution Centre

he work of the Lord by the TBS office in Ethiopia went very well in the year 2024. Actually, it was amazing.

One of the methods we use to make known the work of TBS up and down the country is arranging distribution events for the Amharic New Testament and Psalms. This can be done when church leaders are given a PowerPoint presentation that shows who the TBS is and what they do, and the need we had for this new translation.

Many found this presentation eye-opening when they learned what has been done on the former translations, and how much we need the TBS translation based on Greek Received Text.

In the year 2024 both PowerPoint presentations and distribution were done in the following cities.

### Addis Ababa Bole Church

One of the churches in Addis Ababa asked us to give the PowerPoint presentation for leaders on the afternoon of 30 June 2024. The church leaders gathered around 200 people.

Some young people asked why the TBS didn't come to the country long ago. We answered that this is the timing of the Lord and asked them to pray for us as we are progressing forward in the country and with the Old Testament translation.



### Harar City

Harar City is found in the southeastern part of the country; it is close to Somalia. Dr Ayele and I went to Harar and gave a presentation on 16 November 2024. 100 church leaders were expected, but over 120 leaders attended. The presentation was received very well. The next afternoon over 1,000 believers came and had an explanation about the TBS and what it is doing. The Word of God was preached, and Dr Ayele spoke about the 'Challenge and Blessing of Translation'.

In Harar City, we distributed 1,300 Amharic New Testament and Psalms. We also met two translators to the Harari language who want to work with us after seeing the presentation.



### Awasa City

Awasa is an Ethiopian city dominated by evangelical believers; there are many churches in the city. Dr Ayele, Mrs Taika, and myself went there to present the work and distribute the New Testament and Psalms.

The leaders received us and we gave the PowerPoint presentation to them on Friday 6 December 2024. Over 50 leaders attended the meeting.

In Awasa we distributed 1,800 copies of the Amharic New Testament and Psalms. The next day invited believers gathered

in one of the churches, and over 1,000 of them received the New Testament and Psalms. We met so many people showing interest in the translation and who desired to be members of the Society.

### Emanuel Fellowship Church in Addis Ababa

The church leaders attended the first launch in 2021, and were asking the Addis Ababa office for the distribution of the new translation for the members of the church. We went there on 15 December 2024; I preached the Gospel, and gave them an explanation of how this translation came to happen, then gave one copy for each of them. On that day we distributed 1,000 copies. We saw happiness on the faces of all who attended and received the Word of God.

### **Annual Public Meeting**

The 2024 Annual Public Meeting (APM) was held in the city of Addis Ababa on 30 November. A good number of TBS (Ethiopia) members attended the meeting. Pastor Jonathan Arnold and Mr Philip Blows from TBS London were speakers at the meeting. The meeting went well. The next day, 1 December, we

travelled to the town of Debrebirhan to have an APM with the members there.

### **Other visits**

On 2 December we went to a Christian school. We went early in the morning when 500 students were gathering for a daily devotion time. Both Jonathan Arnold and Philip Blows spoke to them, and we left 500 copies to be given to the students.

The next day we distributed the New Testament and Psalms in two Bible colleges.



### **Grants**

Churches and ministries are continuously asking for grants of Scriptures, therefore in 2024 seven grants were given to those who wrote a letter. The office had granted 1,500 Bibles for those seven requests made by churches and Christian ministries.

### Membership


The office is contacting and receiving contact from people to help them to become members, and asking them to submit their annual membership contribution. They know they will not be able to attend the Society's AGM, but have a desire to stand with us and be associated with the work. The number

of members now in Ethiopia is around 500. In reminding them of the need of maintaining their annual membership we can also increase knowledge of the work of TBS in the country.

With thankful heart we request the following prayers to be made for us:

- Pray for peace and stability to return to the nation.
- Pray for many to be aware of the work of TBS in Ethiopia and receive the New Testament and Psalms.
- Pray for us to have our own place of work to facilitate the work of TBS all over Ethiopia.
- Pray for support of the Society in Ethiopia and believers to see the importance of being members of the Society.
- That the kind provision of a premises being offered to us will be brought to fruition and meet the needs of TBS for storage and distribution in Ethiopia.

We thank God for the work of TBS who helped with all these activities to be accomplished in the year 2024. We would love to thank those who are supporting this work for the glory of the Name of our Lord.

e are very pleased to introduce the TBS Hampton Text Bible—a compact Authorised (King James) Version Bible in a completely new setting. A key feature of this Bible is the 5,000+ footnotes containing word definitions for less commonly used words. We hope that these will be useful to children and adults alike. The Bible also features eight full colour maps. To ensure optimal readability, the Hampton uses a newly designed typeface and good line spacing, particularly important for a pocket-sized Bible.

# Report of the UK Deputation Speakers

t is with heartfelt gratitude to the Lord that we report that the work of the Deputation Speakers has been greatly blessed in recent years. The Lord has opened many doors for us to share the Scriptures and promote the work of the Society. In the past year, hundreds of meetings have been conducted on behalf of the Society throughout the United Kingdom and further afield. This includes deputation meetings, teaching meetings, youth fellowships, youth conferences, and school assemblies. Deputation Speakers are also called upon to represent the Society at various conferences and exhibitions throughout the United Kingdom.

The last 12 months have seen some new opportunities in schools to present Bibles to school leavers. This is encouraging, as other school openings (sometimes due to a change of headteacher) have come to a close. We anticipate the new William Tyndale Commemorative Bible will be presented to many children this coming year. Comparatively few children will have heard of Tyndale, so this will provide a golden opportunity to tell a younger generation about this remarkable man and the excellent translation work he undertook. We are thankful for the arrival of the new Hampton Text Bibles which will be a great help for children who read the Authorised Version for the first time, as the occasional

unusual words in the main text are explained at the bottom of each page; plus a range of coloured maps are included.

Many of our supporters will recall that tens of thousands of Platinum Jubilee Bibles were produced by the Society in 2022 and Coronation Bibles the following year, A grandmother, concerned for the spiritual welfare of her family, presented each of her grandchildren with a Platinum Jubilee Bible. having written an appropriate text on the opening page. Two years later her teenage grandson began reading his copy and it has been the means of completely changing his life. He requested his mother attend a place of worship with him, and they are now hearing the Gospel preached. We pray that much blessing will be experienced by them both.

In June 2024 Craig Dennison travelled to the USA where he presented the work of the Society to 11 congregations in several states. A warm welcome was received, and gratitude was expressed for the work and witness of the Society.

In November 2024 Matthew Vogan and Craig Dennison conducted a youth conference in Inverness on the theme of inspiration.

A surprise visit of snow a couple of days before the conference left us wondering if the conference should proceed, but in the Lord's goodness around twenty young people attended. The response was very encouraging, and another Inverness youth conference is planned for August 2025, Lord willing. If your church, assembly, or auxiliary would be interested in organising a youth conference, please get in touch to book a Deputation Speaker.

In January 2025 Craig Dennison travelled to India to assist in promoting the newly published Hindi Gospel according to John. This trip included several church leaders' conferences, a youth conference, a visit to a theological seminary, and a conference in New Delhi. Over 1,500 people attended the meetings and were introduced to the work of the Society. Around 10,000 copies of the Hindi Gospel according to John were printed and most have been distributed free of charge, along with a Hindi translation of the article How the Holy Bible Came To Be. Positive feedback was received from each of the meetings and heartfelt gratitude was expressed for the translation work of the Society. At the youth conference in New Delhi some young people attended with copies of the ESV and NIV. The Rev. Dennison highlighted the differences in the English Bible versions, and preached on the preservation of Scripture. Following the meeting, we had requests for more than 30 copies of the Authorised Version to be sent to young people desiring a faithful translation of Holy Scripture.

In April 2025 Craig Dennison also travelled to Australia to preach at a conference and conduct deputation meetings. Four new congregations welcomed the Society to hear about our principles and work, and those who attended the meetings expressed gratitude for hearing of the Lord working in various parts of the world. In total, 16 deputation meetings were held

in various locations, with some supporters travelling three hours to attend a meeting. At one meeting a pastor reported how a young man had been persuaded toward the Received Text and Authorised Version following the 2023 Society meeting held at his congregation. At the conference near Adelaide, the Rev. Dennison was asked to speak about the doctrine of preservation, the history of the Society, and its presentday work. The conference was attended by a particularly high number of young people and young adults. Following the addresses, many young people expressed their gratitude for the teaching, particularly on the importance of holding to the Authorised Version.

The most common way we are introduced to a new church is by means of personal recommendation. In the past couple of years, several new meetings have occurred due to a supporter informing their friends and family of the blessing they received from having the Society visit their church or assembly. This in turn has encouraged others to invite us to present the work of the Society to their fellowship. Please share the work of the Society with others and encourage them to host a TBS deputation meeting.

Our speakers are often asked to speak at special meetings on subjects relating to the Word of God. In the past, our speakers have addressed topics of the doctrines of Holy Scripture, Bible versions, and disputed passages. Perhaps your church or assembly would be interested in a public meeting on such a topic. Please get in touch to book a speaker. Let us all prayerfully continue to spread God's Holy Word, trusting in the reassuring truth declared by our Lord Jesus Christ, 'Heaven and earth shall pass away, but my words shall not pass away' (Matthew 24.35).

# BREAD CAST UPON THE WATERS

ver recent years many believers have made Bibles and New Testaments available outside their homes and churches. TBS supporters will be encouraged to know that this prayerful endeavour is bearing fruit.

One young man, living in the Midlands of the UK and from a non-Christian background, became concerned to know the meaning and purpose of life. The pertinent questions, 'Why am I here?' and 'Where did everything come from?' kept passing through his mind. Having failed to find answers from the major world religions he began to consider reading the Bible and was amazed to find a free Bible outside one of the TBS-supporting churches near to his home. The Holy Spirit illuminated his understanding and led him into the truth. It was a while before he could pluck up courage to attend a service of worship, but upon receiving a warm welcome, he continued to attend, and came to the point where he could say, 'I finally realised that I am a sinner who needed Jesus ... and through His grace, I have been given the new heart that I need to repent and turn away from sin'. He concluded his testimony by quoting from what is now his favourite psalm:

'Thy mercy, O LORD, is in the heavens; and thy faithfulness reacheth unto the clouds ... How excellent is thy lovingkindness, O God! therefore the children of men put their trust under the shadow of thy wings.' Psalm 36.5,7

Another encouragement came from the West Country in the UK, where a pastor was able to report:

Two years ago, a young atheist woman took a Bible from our Bible box—she read it, came to church, and last Lord's Day, she professed faith in Christ through baptism. Keep sharing the Gospel and giving out God's Word, for it never returns void.

'So shall my word be that goeth forth out of my mouth: it shall not return unto me void, but it shall accomplish that which I please, and it shall prosper in the thing whereto I sent it' (Isaiah 55.11).

# THE OPEN DOOR

'Behold, I have set before thee an open door'

Revelation 3.8

ne difficulty many Christians, churches, and assemblies face is how to discern the will of God regarding doors of service. This is also true for the work of the Society, and in the Lord's goodness we are in a position of increased opportunities and expanding work. How do we discern what doors God would have us enter? Scripture has some guiding principles.

**Firstly, God is sovereign in opening doors.** In 2 Corinthians 2.12, Paul says, 'when I came to Troas to *preach* Christ's gospel, and a door was opened unto me of the Lord'. We may desire certain doors of service, and we can gravitate towards certain doors due to emotions or personal experience, but ultimately, the Lord opens the doors He would have us enter. This has been the experience of the Society in longing for faithful translations in certain languages: no door seemed to open until the Lord Himself did it without us.

Sometimes the Lord may seem to open doors but we do not have the resources to undertake the work. We are then obliged to pray for assistance and wisdom so that we may be good stewards of both the open doors and our resources.

Secondly, we are to identify the doors God opens. To the church in Philadelphia the Lord Jesus Christ wrote, 'behold, I have set before thee an open door, and no man can shut it' (Revelation 3.8). The door the Lord would have us enter will be an open door. It will not be a closed door, a locked door, or a door that other men can shut. It will also be 'before us', indicating that it will not be hidden, nor will we have to search it out.

The Apostle Paul experienced the Lord opening doors and closing doors. He desired to preach the Gospel in Asia but was 'forbidden of the Holy Ghost' (Acts 16.6). The Lord closed that door

to him. However, Paul discerned the doors the Lord would have him enter. In 1 Corinthians 16.9, Paul said 'For a great door and effectual is opened unto me'.

In the work of the Society various requests are brought before us. While many of them are genuine, not all fall under the remit of the Society. As we have been called to translate, publish, distribute, promote, and uphold the Word of God, works beyond this cannot be deemed an 'open door' for the Society.

Thirdly, we are to enter the door God opens. The church in Philadelphia was not merely notified about the open door; they were to use it. God is sovereign in opening the doors, but we are to enter these open doors. Not entering the door the Lord opens, and seeking out our own doors, is poor stewardship. Oftentimes, we enter through the door with simple faith, not knowing how God will bring certain projects to pass. It is only when we trust God and submit to His Will that we observe His sovereign, guiding Hand upon the work of the Society.

Fourthly, we are to pray for open doors. In writing to the church at Colosse, Paul asked for prayer: 'Withal praying also for us, that God would open unto us a door of utterance, to speak the mystery of Christ' (Colossians 4.3). It should be a matter

of earnest prayer that the Lord would open doors for the work of the Society. The door we are to pray for is a door to advance the Kingdom of Christ through the translation, printing, and distribution of Holy Scripture. In this, we are not to pray for the advancement of our name but the advancement of Christ's Name.

Fifthly, we are to give God the glory for open doors. In Acts 14.27 we read of Paul and Barnabas, 'And when they were come, and had gathered the church together, they rehearsed all that God had done with them, and how he had opened the door of faith unto the Gentiles'. Paul and Barnabas acknowledged that the open doors afforded to them were not due to their own talents, ability, or wisdom, but all glory belongs to the Lord. This *Annual Report* is a record of how God has opened doors for the Society, and He is to have all of the glory.

Since 1831 the purpose of the Society has been to 'to promote the Glory of God and the salvation of men, by circulating, both at home and abroad, in dependence on the Divine blessing, the HOLY SCRIPTURES, which are given by inspiration of God, and are able to make men wise unto salvation, through faith which is in Christ Jesus'. May God continue to open doors for this purpose, for the glory of His Name.

## **Tagalog** Language Summary

#### Who speaks Tagalog?

agalog is primarily spoken in the Philippines and by its diaspora in the United States, Canada, Australia, Saudi Arabia, and other parts of the Middle East, Europe, and Asia. Around 28 million people speak Tagalog as their first language, and over 70 million people as their second language.

Tagalog forms the basis for the Filipino language, and along with English is one of the two official languages of the Philippines. Around 90% of the Filipino language is based on Tagalog. However, Tagalog itself is an ethnic language native to specific regions, whereas Filipino is a standardised, evolving national language that includes elements of other Philippine languages.

Tagalog belongs to the Austronesian language family. The language is mostly native Austronesian, but it also borrows many words from Spanish, Chinese, Malay, and English. It is a phonetic language, using the Latin alphabet, with most words pronounced as they are spelt.

### A brief history of Christianity in the Philippines

In the sixteenth century the Spanish colonised the Philippines, bringing Roman Catholic missionaries with them. Today this influence is still felt, with Roman Catholicism the most popular religion in the Philippines.

In 1898 the Spanish colonial period ended with the Spanish-American war, and the American government took control of the Philippines. During this period Roman Catholicism was disestablished as the state religion and the Americans brought Protestant missionaries with them. The first missionaries were army chaplains and the first Protestant service at this time is thought to have been held in August 1898 by Chaplain George Stull who came with the occupying forces. His primary duty was to minister to the soldiers, but he recorded in his diary that that first service was also attended by some Filipinos.

Soon Protestant missionaries from various denominations arrived in the Philippines, and they came up with a 'comity agreement' in 1898 which divided the country into different areas to avoid competition and potential conflicts. For a short time this agreement worked but grew more complicated as the mission work expanded.

In 1946, following the Second World War, the Philippines gained independence. Roman Catholicism remained the dominant religion, but Protestantism was more common in urban centres and among more educated communities.

In 2010 the Philippines were ranked as the

fifth largest Christian majority country on earth. 91% identify as Christian. Most of these are Roman Catholic, but approximately 12% are Protestants. The rest of the population are Muslim or Buddhist, or follow indigenous religions.

#### **The Tagalog Bible**

Early translations of the Bible into Tagalog were made by Spanish Roman Catholic missionaries in the seventeenth century. In 1905, the first Protestant translation of the Bible into Tagalog was published, called the Ang Biblia. This translation is based on the American Standard Version (the American edition of the Revised Version. which used the Greek Critical Text), and many Tagalog Christians now use an edition of this version that was updated in 1982. However, it is plaqued with the problems common to translations based on the Critical Text. For instance, the 1982 Bible weakens the doctrine of the Trinity, by omitting 1 John 5.7. The result is that this doctrine is not well understood among Christians in the Philippines.

Over the past century, there have been various other translations based on the Critical Greek Text and using modern translation methods. In 2001, the Philippine Bible Society updated the Tagalog Bible, known as Ang Bagong Ang Biblia (The New Ang Biblia). This version aimed to make the Bible more understandable to contemporary Filipinos by using modern, formal Tagalog. Other versions, such as the Tagalog Popular Version or Magandang Balita Biblia, and Ang Bible Pinoy Version (in colloquial Taglish dialect), have been produced, along with various Roman Catholic translations.

#### The TBS Tagalog project

For some years the TBS longed to have a project in the Tagalog language. We carried out research into the available Tagalog Bible versions and had to conclude with regret that there was not an edition that met both our textual and translational standards. Therefore, we began to prepare

a new translation directly from the Hebrew Masoretic and Greek Received Texts. We have one main translator in the Philippines, who has enlisted some of the Filipino brethren in his church to help him progress the work. We also have Tagalog speakers in other parts of the world, who have helped review the translation.

In 2024 the Gospel according to John was published online at the sonline bible.com/#tl, and now printed copies are available. Many of these are being distributed via a circle of Baptist churches in the Philippines, but copies are also available to purchase from our website. Our translator is also working very diligently on the rest of the New Testament; he has completed drafts of Matthew, Mark, Luke, Acts, and Romans, and is now working through the rest of the New Testament. TBS (Canada) has generously supported this project, together with a congregation in Canada.

We would encourage your prayers for this project as we seek to provide trustworthy Scriptures for Tagalog readers everywhere.

## **Editorial Report**

'These things saith he that is holy, he that is true, he that hath the key of David, he that openeth, and no man shutteth; and shutteth, and no man openeth; I know thy works: behold, I have set before thee an open door, and no man can shut it: for thou hast a little strength, and hast kept my word, and hast not denied my name.'

Revelation 3.7–8

he past year has been marked by an unmistakable providential momentum in the translation work of the Trinitarian Bible Society. Currently we are working in 90 different languages and providing consultancy in a further 5. In addition, there are over 40 more languages where we are carrying out research or the potential for future projects exist. The current number of projects represents four times as many languages as in 2011 and more than double what we had in 2023. Opportunities to advance the Scriptures in the languages of the world have abounded, and our response must

reflect not only gratitude, but also humble dependence and faithful diligence. Such a situation brings to mind the words of Revelation 3.7–8 as quoted above. The Lord Jesus Christ, sovereign over His church and over all things, has opened doors. Furthermore, the doors that He opens for the Society are also opened for the church, since our role is simply to supply the church with Scriptures to distribute, and no doubt this verse may be applied in that sense to our work.

As already considered in the devotional article earlier in this edition of the QR, the image of an 'open door' in Scripture often denotes a God-given opportunity to proclaim and promote Divine truth. The Apostle Paul used similar language in describing Gospel work at Ephesus (1 Corinthians 16.9) and Troas (2 Corinthians 2.12), acknowledging both the privilege and the challenge inherent in such work. Similarly, today we see the Lord making a way for the Scriptures to be rendered into the languages of peoples who have long waited for them, or whose existing versions fall short of faithfully and accurately rendering the Word of God in its fulness.

#### Who provided the open door?

The Lord Jesus Christ is described here in Revelation 3 as He that is holy and true, and holds the key of David. As John Gill comments, 'He is truth itself and purposes that His truth will prevail. He has the key of authority and of knowledge in the Scriptures, and gives it to His people'. In His sovereignty He has the supreme role in all translation efforts. He opens doors 'and none can shut them, either men or devils, or hinder the spread of light and knowledge by them'.1 This is our hope as a Society: that by His sovereign Hand, new opportunities for faithful Bible translation will continue to arise and flourish.

Of course, translation without distribution is fruitless, just as distribution without translation is impossible. Where doors have been opened for translation, we look to the Lord to provide similarly for distribution. Christ alone determines where it must go, plainly declaring: 'it shall accomplish that which I please, and it shall prosper *in the thing* whereto I sent it' (Isaiah 55.11). Thus, the Lord is able to make that Word effectual to salvation; He 'opens the Scriptures, which are shut to a natural man.'<sup>2</sup>

#### How should we respond?

The Lord opens these doors in His holy providence, but He also calls us to enter them with humility and faith. As the message to the church in Philadelphia notes, 'thou hast a little strength' (Revelation 3.8). This is not a rebuke, but instead a reminder that our sufficiency is of God.

Our resources as a Society, human and material, may seem small, and indeed the challenge before us seems scarcely sustainable with what we have. Yet when joined to prayer, dependence on God,

and unwavering commitment to His Word, the resources entrusted to us may become mighty tools for the advancement of His Kingdom.

It has been a matter of great thankfulness in the past year to see translation projects go from a pilot project to a New Testament project as funds become available to support them. However, at the time of writing we have still have four Nepali language translation projects that cannot progress beyond the Gospel according to John because we do not at present have the funding necessary to support the available translators. These challenges stir us up to pray that the door which has been opened will remain open.

It is humbling as well as encouraging to read 'I know thy works' (Revelation 3.8), and to think that our weak endeavours are within the Saviour's notice. The Lord also observes 'thou hast a little strength, and hast kept my word, and hast not denied my name'. The original Greek verbs used in Revelation 3.8 suggest not just one-time actions but completed actions that have a lasting effect. There are ongoing responsibilities and certain attitudes that must characterise our work as we press forward into the open doors the Lord has provided. These include:

- **Humility:** Recognising our own limitations, we depend entirely on the Lord for strength and blessing.
- Faith: We must trust that if He has opened a door effectually it will not be shut despite our limitations, unless He wills.
- Faithfulness: We must 'keep His Word' uncorrupted and without compromise in the work of translation. We dare not 'deny' Christ's name, we must maintain the doctrine regarding His Person and work, and be faithful to His Gospel.

- Zeal: We must give Christ all the glory, confessing Him in the spirit and purpose of our translation work.
- Wisdom: An open door may also be a call to devote ourselves and what we have more single-mindedly to this work. and therefore to discern whether there are other things that we should not do.
- Watchfulness: Adversaries and challenges abound—doctrinally. spiritually, and practically. We must not be surprised at opposition. Without anv
- Diligence: Open doors may not remain open indefinitely. No man can shut the doors that the Lord opens, but in His mysterious providence He may not keep the door open forever. We must labour while it is day.

#### What will the future hold?

Without any hyperbole, the Trinitarian Bible Society stands at a crucial moment. The work of the past year bears witness to the Lord's continued favour and assistance. Inevitably we ask what

the future may hold, not simply in fresh opportunities, but in faithfully stewarding those we have already been given. As projects develop and progress, they require more of the wider TBS in terms of staff time and financial resources, particularly as we come to publish and grant. What may be a small beginning inevitably increases, so we must consider how to keep in step with this increase over the next five years and beyond. Much wisdom is also needed as we seek to plan how we meet the challenge that such opportunities present for our

limited resources. And with opportunity comes obligation: to press on faithfully in fulfilling our main object as a Society:

to promote the Glory of God and the salvation of men, by circulating, both at home and abroad, in dependence on the Divine blessing, the HOLY SCRIPTURES, which are given by inspiration of God, and are able to make men wise unto salvation. through faith which is in Christ Jesus.

Throughout 2024 we have seen a marked increase in the number of translation and revision opportunities across various continents. From major language groups to smaller communities who have pleaded for a faithful rendering of God's Word, the calls for help have multiplied. Some languages now stand in need of new, faithful translations from the Masoretic Hebrew and the Greek Received Texts Others await the first

ever words of Scripture in their language with expectation and joy.

Every project includes layers of activity laborious translation, linguistic scrutiny, careful project management, proofing, typesetting, checking, and ultimately publication and distribution. These processes require spiritual discernment, linguistic competence, and practical effort. In every phase, the Society is committed to the supremacy of Scripture, the accuracy of the Received Texts, and the necessity of literal, trustworthy translations.

#### **Our Work**

As we labour, we echo Paul's words: 'Not that we are sufficient of ourselves to think any thing as of ourselves; but our sufficiency *is* of God' (2 Corinthians 3.5). We are mindful that the work before us is weighty. We dare not proceed without prayer and without the confidence that we serve under the Lordship of Christ, who opened these doors.

#### **Our staff**

Pursuing these endeavours and supporting the large volume of projects that are highlighted later in this report would be impossible without the exceptional efforts of the Editorial Department staff. They are shouldering a heavy and increasing burden. We are thankful that staff are able to gain efficiency by making use of technological developments in researching, editing, and preparing text in various contexts. We are also deeply grateful for the contributions of numerous volunteers who assist with specific tasks.

Philip Hopkins, Senior Editorial Consultant (Projects), continues to maintain responsibility for a substantial portion of our Bible translation and revision initiatives while working just two days a week for the Society. It was possible to move forward many of our Indian projects during his visit there this year.

Larry Brigden, Senior Editorial Consultant (Linguistics), shoulders an increasing number of projects, reviewing translations in a wide variety of languages and scripts. His carefully weighed opinions on complex translational points as well as his knowledge of the Biblical languages are greatly esteemed.

**Peter Hughes** continues the complex task of typesetting Scriptures in numerous languages and scripts. He has been able to implement technological solutions in the

typesetting software that both accelerate and improve the process.

**David Astudillo** has been working on some short films and especially the anticipated Tyndale documentary. He continues to support the design aspects of the Society's social media work in English and Spanish, as well as designing websites in French, Chinese, and Hebrew.

**Tim Tribe,** our IT consultant, continues developing and supporting the Editorial System and the TBS Online Bible which greatly enhance our operational efficiency. Recent developments have included the ability to automatically generate printready files from the Editorial System.

**Natalie Hanks** leads our meticulous quality assurance processes for all print and digital publications, including the exceptional design and content standards of our *Quarterly Record*. Natalie additionally oversees the development of many new English-language products and manages the Society's social media presence. We are also grateful that **Debra Anderson** still assists us with her proofreading skills.

**Elizabeth Tichelaar** handles substantial responsibilities in reviewing and preparing translation texts through systematic checks, precise editing, and thorough proofreading. Thanks to her efforts we have fresh, well-presented content on the TBS website and in the weekly email newsletters for supporters.

**Daniel Bulican** is involved in reviewing and checking manuscripts prior to publication. Much of his time has been devoted to the revision of our Romanian Bible, and it has been a valuable providence to have had a native speaker on the team.

**Qiyu Zou** has been working to support the Chinese project in contacting churches

and organisations, as well as promoting and distributing the Chinese New Testament. We are grateful to GBS for their generous support of this project.

**Alex Artola** was appointed this year and works in a part-time role supporting our projects; he has made considerable progress in understanding the work already. In particular, he collaborates with translators to prepare our Words of Life and Golden Thoughts calendars and the annual diary.

#### **Conclusion**

May the Lord advance His Word by using the efforts we contribute in felt weakness. The work of translation, revision, and review, together with the requirement for advising, directing, correcting, checking, and editing must be done in much dependence on the wisdom and strength that come from the Lord alone. We are reminded that the open door is not merely about increased productivity or global expansion. It is about assisting in the church's great mission to bring the knowledge of Christ to every tribe, tongue, and nation, so that He may have the preeminence. May we, though having but'a little strength', continue to walk faithfully through the open doors set before us.

## Non-English language Bible projects

This article provides a summary of all the Trinitarian Bible Society's non-English language Scripture projects in which we are currently involved or in which we have carried out research recently. Although the information is brief, we trust it will help inform the prayers of our supporters. A summarised version is necessary since to provide a comprehensive report would extend to more than 21,000 words; full details are available on the Society's website: tbsbibles.org/projects. All references to the future, including proposed dates for publication, are subject to the Lord's will.

e are seeking to have Scripture in the top 20 languages spoken in the world which would cover around 75% of the world's population. There are only two languages in this list in which we have no options to explore, these are Vietnamese and Javanese.

As must be clear, there are particular areas of expansion geographically which have opened up through the commitment of dedicated individuals. These include India (see *Continuing the Carey Project* article in QR651), Nepal, Myanmar, and the Philippines.

The projects are split by geographical location. India has its own page, due to the high number of projects there. Active projects are located on the maps; those that are at research/consultancy stages are listed next to each map instead.







# A Digital Bible to Use and Share

The Online Bible is the Society's primary platform for publishing the digital versions of our Scripture translations. It can be accessed as a normal website, but may also be downloaded from there as an app for use on phones and tablets.

As a free resource, without ads, paywalls, or user tracking, the Online Bible helps us distribute the Word of God to places that are otherwise difficult to reach with our print Bibles. It is used by tens of thousands of people from over 120 countries around the world, including places where owning a Bible can be dangerous.

Whole or partial Bibles are available in over 40 languages, with more regularly added as they are digitised. Society members and others with an account on our website can also unlock valuable additional features (including all the cross-references, notes, and maps of our Westminster Bibles) by connecting their account to the Online Bible.

#### Introduction


he Society's Trustees and Management would publicly acknowledge the Lord's great goodness in supplying the Society's needs during 2024 in faithfulness to His own promise: 'And God *is* able to make all grace abound toward you; that ye, always having all sufficiency in all *things*, may abound to every good work' (2 Corinthians 9.8).

In this Annual Report the key points from the Society's finances over 2024 are highlighted and the summary financial statements are given at the end. The full Trustees' Annual Report & Financial Statements for 2024, which include considerable additional information about the activities and administration of the Society, are available both on our website (tbsbibles.org/AnnualReport) and in printed form; we would encourage members and supporters of the Society to visit our website or contact our Headquarters to request copies.

#### The Result for the Year

The Society's Total Funds reduced by £636,435 during 2024. After gains and losses caused by movements in foreign exchange rates are removed the Net Expenditure for the year was £474,752. This figure is the accumulation of a deficit from TBS London of £703,657 and a net surplus from the Society's five Branches totalling £228,905. The Trustees are very thankful to God for all His provision during the year.

The Net Expenditure of £474,752 is broken down by Branch in the following chart; the figures are presented both **excluding** and **including** sales and funding exchanges between London and the Branches.




#### The key points to take from this are:

- TBS (Australia) and TBS (USA) employed translation consultants which are overseen and funded from London. Hence these Branches' deficits normally become surpluses when inter-branch funding is added back.
- TBS (Canada) sent very significant funding to London (hence their surplus reduces when inter-branch funding is included).

#### **Income**

The 2024 worldwide income was £4,340,877, down 26.4% from £5,894,899 in 2023. This overall reduction was significantly driven by three main factors:

- Donations and Legacies were down by £1,376,364 (34.6%) to £2,597,027. This was mainly due to:
  - $\triangleright$  £1,388,594 (86.7%) reduction in Legacies to £213,625, largely as a result of a single legacy in 2023 of £1.35m, whereas 2024 is the second lowest amount in the past 20 years;
  - ▶ £313,743 (66.9%) reduction in Partner Funding to £155,533, due to a combination of factors, including which projects were externally funded during the year, the timing of funding on those projects, and how much funding was given; offset by
  - ▶ £336,877 (23.6%) increase in Donations to £1,765,385, of which about two-thirds occurred in Canada and the remaining one-third was roughly equally split between London and the USA.




- Income from Charitable Activities—Distribution of Scriptures (Sales and Royalties) fell by £260,512 (15.2%) to £1,448,564, this arose in the UK, with the other five branches showing an overall increase in Sales of £29,159. As suggested in the last Annual Report, the similar rise in UK Sales in 2023 proved to be largely a timing issue, with some large orders fulfilled right at the end of that year, which caused a corresponding reduction in Sales in 2024.
- Investment income rose by £74,692 (36%) to £282,124, due to higher cash deposits and use of a new Charity Deposit Platform in the UK.

We continued to pursue our goal of distributing Holy Scriptures by way of sales in 2024, often at heavily discounted prices. Indeed, the vast majority of the Bibles purchased from us will ultimately be given away free of charge. The total number of items sold worldwide in 2024 was 1,244,729 (2023: 1,640,851), of which 188,600 (2023: 581,141) were under royalty. Of the total, 896,128 (2023: 1,278,669) were Bibles or Scripture portions, 202,490 (2023: 236,783) were calendars, and 146,111 (2023: 125,399) were text cards, children's items, and other Scripture items. Total Sales income in the year was £1,420,827 (2023: £1,648,044); the production cost of these items was £908,193 (2023: £1,073,734), and there was additional royalty/licensing income of £27,737 (2023: £61,052).

#### **Expenditure**

**Worldwide operating expenditure** in 2024 was £4,744,612, down £319,961 (6.3%) compared with 2023. This decrease was largely driven by:


■ The cost of Translating the Scriptures was down by £234,252 (20.8%) to £889,782, principally due to the completion of the Spanish Bible (£96,052) and the near-completion



of the Hebrew New Testament (£39,875), combined with a reduction (£98,325) to a more usual level following a 2023 spike in the costs of the numerous translation and revision projects.

- The cost of Publishing the Scriptures (i.e. the stage between completion of the translation and it being available to distribute) rose by £27,028 (22.7%) to £146,061 as the Society has published many new translations in 2024 (see Editorial section earlier).
- The direct and indirect Costs of Sales were down by £40,242 (2.1%) to £1,883,922 due to the reduction in Sales, but still significantly offset by the rapid inflation in the cost of producing Scriptures in recent years.
- The direct and indirect Costs of Grants were down by £141,414 (18%) to £643,605. The previous year (2023) was a particular high point in the cost of Grants due to publication of several significant new languages/editions (there was a 48% increase over 2022), so in 2024 we reduced to a figure still well above the recent average, reflecting the growth in the Society's work.
- The cost of Displaying the Scriptures Publicly rose by £17,811 (30.9%) to £75,473 due to increased activity in the UK (Bus Poster Scheme) and in Canada.
- The cost of Distribution Centres has risen by £10,183 (12.7%) to £90,676 as the work of our Distribution Centres in Latin America and particularly Ethiopia, grew during the year.
- The cost of Promoting & Upholding the Scriptures was up by £42,829 (4.5%) to £989,032 as the Society increases these activities, particularly in Latin America in connection with the new Spanish Bible, and in the UK.





**During 2024**, 1,999,175 (2023: 1,191,888) **Bibles and Scripture portions, 353,049** (2023: 404,293) **calendars**, and **12,400** (2023: 29,928) **text cards, children's items, other Scripture items, and articles** were supplied free of charge to institutions and individuals including churches, missions, prisons, schools, and missionaries. **The production cost** of these items was **£476,957** in 2024, compared with £573,655 in 2023.

#### **Short/Medium Term Resources**

The Society's Net Current Assets have decreased by £559,568 (6.7%) to £7,778,698 at 31 December 2024. Within this, the liquidity situation remains healthy, with cash balances (including deposits maturing within three months) of £2,589,626 and cash on deposit totalling £3,257,967, a total of £5,847,593 at the year-end.

#### **Long-Term Resources**

The Society's UK operation held Fixed Asset Investments of £1,463,775 at 31 December 2024, down from £1,524,733 in 2023, which is largely the result of stock market movements over 2024.

The freehold properties of the Society (including the International Headquarters in London) are stated at the net book value of £2,474,325 at 31 December 2024 (2023: £2,523,074). The leasehold properties of the Society are stated at the book value of £266,592 (2023: £273,833). The Trustees are of the opinion that the open market value is in excess of the book value expressed in local currencies.

At 31 December 2024 UK Free Reserves (i.e. Unrestricted Funds less Tangible Fixed Assets less Stock & Work in Progress) were £2,713,625 against a requirement of £1,206,295 (i.e. 4/12ths of 2024 UK Unrestricted Funds Expenditure less Depreciation), giving a surplus of £1,507,300. In accordance with the Society's Financial Strategy, the use of these funds is planned with the five-year Financial Plan 2025–2029 whilst always maintaining a Balanced Budget (defined as when the Free Reserves are maintained at a level at least equivalent to four months' expenditure in each individual year of the five-year Financial Plan).

#### **Future Financial Plans**

The Society's Financial Plan 2025–2029 was approved at the same time as the 2025 Budget in October 2024. The Financial Plan is updated annually, and in accordance with the Society's Financial Strategy it seeks to provide for the wise and efficient use of reasonably anticipated income, as well as available Free Reserves, over the five-year Plan period. The Trustees are thankful that in the light of the resources available, it has been possible to again approve a sustainable Financial Plan for the period 2025–2029.

#### **Going Concern Considerations**

The Trustees are well aware of their responsibility to be satisfied that the Society is a going concern, given that the Financial Statements are prepared on this assumption. To this end, various scenarios have been tested based on 2024 expenditure levels and the 31 December 2024 Balance Sheet position. This scenario testing shows that the Society has sufficient General Fund reserves for at least 12 months following the approval of these Financial Statements, even if income fell to 'worst case scenario' levels. Thankfully, with inflation back to more manageable levels and the supply chain issues of recent years having at last eased, risks on the expenditure side have also eased, although we continue to deal with the long-term re-basing of costs arising from these events, and thus we must remain vigilant.

#### **Conclusion**

The Trustees are very thankful to God for the faithful provision that He has again made for this work during 2024, which has enabled the Society to meet its objectives, particularly the progressing of translation work in many different languages and the granting of Scriptures, as well as the maintaining of the more routine activities of the Society.

We believe that the Lord will continue to provide for the Society as He has done in maintaining it for the past 194 years. Although the Society is acceptably funded for the span of the current five-year Financial Plan, the Trustees and Senior Management are aware of significant financial challenges in the longer term due to the growth of the work, particularly when the many translation projects sent to us by the Lord in the past two years start to come to fruition and need publishing. We are very grateful to our wonderfully loyal supporter and membership base for their continued prayerful and practical support. We would encourage you each to be much in prayer for our financial needs, as well as for all our other practical and spiritual needs.

## Independent Auditor's Statement to the Trustees of the



We have examined the summary financial statements for the year ended 31 December 2024 set out on pages 65–67.

#### **Respective Responsibilities of the Trustees and the Auditor**

The Trustees are responsible for preparing the summary financial statements in accordance with applicable United Kingdom law and the recommendation of the Charities SORP.

Our responsibility is to report to you our opinion on the consistency of the summary financial statements with the full annual financial statements.

We also read the other information contained in the *Annual Report* and consider the implications for our report if we become aware of any apparent misstatements or material inconsistencies with the summary financial statement. The other information comprises only the Financial Highlights on pages 58 to 63.

#### **Basis for Opinion**

Our examination involved agreeing the balances disclosed in the summary financial statements to the full annual financial statements. Our audit report on the full annual financial statements of Trinitarian Bible Society describes the basis of our audit opinion on those financial statements.

We advised him that he knew more about the need for Bibles among the Armenian people than we did, so we told him he




These photos show the ongoing distribution of Spanish Bibles, New Testaments, Gospels, and calendars throughout the Spanish speaking countries in Latin America.


#### The Aims of the Society
