



TCEP Leadership and Advocacy Fellowship Program

The TCEP Leadership and Advocacy Fellowship was developed by the Texas College of Emergency Physicians to groom future emergency physician leaders. The fellowship combines elements of mentoring, organizational education and advocacy skills training in addition to guided experiences to selected fellows.

OVERVIEW

The purpose of the Leadership and Advocacy Fellowship is to provide both an orientation to organized medicine and leadership development for future leaders of the Texas College of Emergency Physicians.

PROGRAM GOALS

- a) Identify individuals with the potential to become leaders in emergency medicine.
- b) Provide orientation and skills to allow potential leaders to promote emergency medicine locally and nationally.
- c) Facilitate the promotion of fellowship graduates into leadership positions both locally and nationally.

GUIDELINES FOR PARTICIPATION

- a) Nominees must be a current member in good standing of TCEP.
- b) Nominee must have a minimum of two years membership in ACEP or EMRA.
- c) Nominee must agree to participate in all elements of the Leadership and Advocacy Fellowship as noted in the program outline (i.e., attend all designated meetings).
- d) Cost for participation will be incurred by Fellow.

PARTICIPANT SELECTION

- a) The TCEP Board of Directors will review and select Fellows based on applications.

- b) Selected Fellows will be notified by the Fellowship Director immediately following the decision.
