PRIMARY DUTY: Under basic supervision, performs environmental health inspections for the Public Health District (PHD); protects the health and safety of the public from adverse environmental determinants.

ESSENTIAL FUNCTIONS: *Essential functions, as defined under the Americans with Disabilities Act, may include any of the following representative duties, knowledge and skills. Factors such as regular attendance at the job are not routinely listed in job descriptions, but are an essential function. Essential duties and responsibilities may include, but are not limited to, the following:*

- Performs environmental health inspections and investigates complaints to verify compliance with state and local regulations; scope of work includes food quality and safety, wastewater treatment, solid and hazardous waste management, air quality, water quality, insect and animal vector control, recreational and institutional facility inspections, consumer health and occupational health and safety.
- Organizes and presents training programs; applies and enforces statutes, regulations, ordinances and policies governing environmental health; prepares summary and status reports; assures that the services provided meet the program requirements.
- Supports the relationship between the City of Waco and the general public by demonstrating courteous and cooperative behavior when interacting with citizens, visitors and City staff; maintains confidentiality of workrelated issues and City information; performs other duties as required or assigned.
- Must possess a valid Texas Driver’s license.
- May be required to respond afterhours, including holidays and weekends, in the event of a departmental or City wide emergency.
- Driving is essential.

KNOWLEDGE AND SKILLS:

Knowledge:

- City policies and procedures and ordinances.
- Federal and state environmental health program regulations and requirements, including Texas State Department of State Health Services standards.

Skill in:

- Understanding and applying state laws and City/County policies and procedures governing environmental and public health.
- Maintaining accurate records and generating reports.
- Utilizing standard personal computer software programs.
- Communicating effectively verbally and in writing.

MINIMUM QUALIFICATIONS:

Bachelor's Degree in Public Health, Science, or a related field is required; AND one year of public sector inspection experience; Sanitarian registration requires 4 yr Bachelors with 30 hours of Natural and Applied Science.

LICENSE AND CERTIFICATION:

- Must possess a valid Texas Driver's License.
- Registered Sanitarian from the Texas State Department of State Health Services is required; additional technical training and certifications may be required.

PHYSICAL DEMANDS AND WORKING ENVIRONMENT:

The physical demands described here are representative of those that must be met by an employee to successfully perform the essential functions of this job. Reasonable accommodations may be made to enable individuals with disabilities to perform the essential functions.

- The physical activities of this position include:
 - Balancing - Maintaining body equilibrium to prevent falling and walking, standing or crouching on narrow, slippery, or erratically moving surfaces.
 - Reaching - Extending hand(s) and arm(s) in any direction.
 - Standing - Particularly for sustained periods of time.
 - Walking - Moving about on foot to accomplish tasks, particularly for long distances or moving from one work site to another.
 - Finger Dexterity - Picking, pinching, typing or otherwise working, primarily with fingers rather than with the whole hand as in handling.
 - Grasping - Applying pressure to an object with the fingers and palm.
 - Feeling - Perceiving attributes of objects, such as size, shape, temperature or texture by touching with skin, particularly that of fingertips.
 - Talking - Expressing or exchanging ideas by means of the spoken word. Those activities in which they must convey detailed or important spoken instructions to other workers accurately, loudly, or quickly.
 - Hearing - Perceiving the nature of sounds at normal speaking levels with or without correction. Ability to receive detailed information through oral communication and to make the discriminations in sound.
 - Repetitive motion - Substantial movements (motions) of the wrists, hands and/or fingers.
- The physical requirements of this position:
 - Medium work. Exerting up to 50 pounds of force occasionally and/or up to 30 pounds of force frequently and/or up to 10 pounds of force constantly to move objects.
- The following personal protective equipment may be required and must be worn when required by the task being performed
 - Gloves, face shield and proper footwear.
- The visual acuity requirements including color, depth perception and field vision.
 - The worker is required to have close visual acuity to perform an activity such as: preparing and analyzing data and figures; transcribing; viewing a computer terminal; extensive reading; visual inspection; using measurement devices.
 - The worker is required to have visual acuity to determine the accuracy, neatness and thoroughness of the work assigned (i.e., custodial, food services, general laborer, etc.) or to make general observations of facilities or structures
- The conditions the worker will be subject to in this position
 - Work is performed primarily in a vehicle traveling from site to site.
 - The worker is subject to both environmental conditions. Activities occur inside and outside with temperatures that may be below 32° or above 100° for periods of more than one hour. Consideration should be given to the effect of other environmental conditions, such as wind and humidity.
 - The worker is subject to hazards. Includes a variety of physical conditions, such as proximity to moving mechanical parts, moving vehicles, electrical current, exposure to high heat or exposure to chemicals.
 - The worker is subject to atmospheric conditions. One or more of the following conditions that affect the respiratory system of the skin: fumes, odors, dust, mists, gases, or poor ventilation.

- The worker is frequently in close quarters, crawl spaces, shafts, man holes, small enclosed rooms and other areas that could cause claustrophobia.
- The worker is required to function in narrow aisles or passageways.

This job description is not intended to be construed as an exhaustive list of responsibilities, duties and skills required. City management has exclusive rights to alter this job description at any time without notice.

Employees will be required to follow any other job related instructions and to perform any other job related duties requested by any person authorized to give instructions or assignments.
