IPA continued to unite and strengthen the voice of independent pharmacy in Texas for more robust and effective advocacy, as well as to advance independent community pharmacy practice.









Advocacy

Positioning pharmacy as part of the health care solution

TEXAS STATE BOARD OF PHARMACY

TPA monitored activity by the Texas State Board of Pharmacy and provided oral comments to positively influence a number of TSBP rules on topics ranging from prescription



delivery to sterile and non-sterile compounding. TPA members representing both chain and independent pharmacies regularly participated in the TSBP Prescription Monitoring Program (PMP) Advisory Committee, providing valuable insights.

LEGISLATIVE TESTIMONY

TPA members and staff testified before Texas House and Senate committee hearings during the legislative interim to address topics such as the role of pharmacists in medically underserved areas and the effectiveness of existing PBM reform laws.

GRASSROOTS ADVOCACY

Members traveled throughout the state to meet with legislators, thank them for their support during the last legislative session, and share pharmacy priorities for the 2025 session. In all, TPA met its ambitious goal to meet with the offices of 106 members of the Texas Legislature before the end of 2024. Staff also met with Governor Greg Abbott to urge his support of pharmacy initiatives to help pharmacists care for patients.

the complex prescription drug pricing system and highlighting the role of pharmacy benefit managers (PBMs). TPA provided a list of recommendations that would benefit both patients and pharmacists. Later, members met with TPI's executive director to share the challenges they face and the opportunities they have to provide cost-effective care.

CONFERENCE & EXPO

In July, hundreds of pharmacists, student pharmacists, and technicians attended the 2024 TPA Conference & Expo in Allen, TX, to meet faceto-face with their pharmacy peers. Educational sessions covered topics



ranging from legislative advocacy and regulatory updates to artificial intelligence and pharmacogenomics. The message throughout the event was clear: Game on!

STUDENT LEADERSHIP INSTITUTE

Student pharmacist members from all across the state gathered in Austin in April to attend the inaugural program of TPA's Student Leadership Institute. Students had an opportunity to



gain leadership skills and learn how to link those skills with advocacy to effectively elevate the profession and advance the practice both today and tomorrow.

GOVERNOR'S TASK FORCE RECOMMENDS EXPANDING NUMBER OF PHARMACY TECHS

Expanding the number of pharmacy technicians in Texas is one of 18 recommendations from Governor Greg Abbott's Healthcare Workforce Task Force's report. TPA was invited to participate in discussions and to provide expert testimony concerning



pharmacist and pharmacy technician workforce trends and the resulting effects on pharmacy staffing.

PRACTICE RESOURCES

Members rely on TPA to help them run their practices and serve their patients. As an example, TPA prepared a comprehensive summary of the new Medicare Prescription Pay-



ment Plan (M3P) program. This members-only resource includes requirements, expectations for pharmacies, and billing procedures to aid in implementation.

MEMBERS SHARE RURAL HEALTH STORIES

In honor of National Rural Health Day, two TPA members and independent pharmacy owners—Crystal McEntire and Lee Ann Hampton—shared their stories to highlight the work of Texas





pharmacists in caring for underserved communities. The project was sponsored by the Centers for Medicare & Medicaid Services Office of Minority Health.

MONTHLY CE WEBINARS

TPA completed its third year of offering free monthly member con-



tinuing education sessions as live webinars (also available on-demand) covering topics OTC medications, and stress management.

STUDENT POSTER SHOWCASE

TPA held its inaugural Student Poster Showcase at the 2024 TPA Conference & Expo to celebrate student contributions to advancing pharmacy practice. Students had the



opportunity to share their work and dialogue with pharmacy professionals representing a variety of practice areas.

COMMUNITY HEALTH WORKERS

TPA explored the intersection of pharmacy and Community Health Workers (CHWs) to address the nonmedical driv-



ers of health needs in their communities. TPA attended a stakeholder meeting in November and currently has a group of pharmacy technicians enrolled in a CHW training program.

BOARD OF DIRECTORS

FISCAL STRENGTH

Membership totals remained strong in 2024, helping contribute to the Association's solid financial footing. Total



assets increased by 6% and revenues increased by 2% compared to 2023. Income exceeded expenses for the year.

FUNDING THE FUTURE

The Texas Pharmacy Foundation awarded 21 scholarships, funded in part by contributions to TPF's Funding the Future campaign.



The Foundation conducted successful fundraisers at TPA's annual conference, including the Silent Auction and the Student Pharmacist Self-Care Championship.

NEW EXECUTIVE LEADERSHIP

TPA welcomed RoxAnn Dominguez, Pharm.D., as its new CEO



after a nationwide search. Dominguez reports to the Board of Directors and leads a professional staff who manage the Association's advocacy, practice development initiatives, membership, education, finances, communications, marketing, and the Professional Recovery Network.

HOUSE OF DELEGATES

Our House of Delegates the voice of the membership—met during the 2024 TPA Conference & Expo. The House approved two resolutions:



one supporting pharmacists' role in the collection, use, interpretation, and application of pharmacogenomic data to optimize health outcomes, and another to support and encourage advocacy for pharmacy involvement in expanded clinical services including, but not limited to, health testing/test and treat, vaccinations, and disease management.
