Licensed psychologists, counselors and trainees offer counseling services to address the broad spectrum of mental health issues students frequently encounter in their adjustment to college life. Counseling services are typically brief in duration and include individual, couples, and group therapy. The Center also educates the campus community about wellness strategies for positive mental health on topics related to body image, depression, anxiety, sexual identity, and healthy relationships. Our MindSpa, equipped with a massage chair, provides a range of stress management self-help techniques. Through weekly tutoring and meetings with academic counselors, the TECHniques Center focuses on making education accessible to those who learn differently and helps students become independent learners and self-advocates who accomplish their educational goals.

Limited representation, within Lubbock County, includes landlord/tenant, uncontested family matters, name changes, essential needs licenses, expunctions, criminal defense, certain misdemeanors and small claims consumer disputes. SLS will consult with students on any other legal matter excluding tax law or bankruptcy. This office cannot advise or represent students against another TTU/HSC student, staff, faculty or any other TTU/HSC entity. SLS also offers free notary services. This office's support staff includes an administrative assistant, a law clerk and externs.

Student Business Services processes tuition and fee billing through the eBill system. This service will provide email reminders of changes in a student's tuition and fee bill. It will also allow for online payments and enrollment in payment plans. The emails will be sent to the student's official @ttu.edu email address as well as any eBill authorized user's email address. Authorized users may be set up by the student which will allow parents or others to log on, view the bill, and make payments. Texas Tech University has arranged for several different payment options to make paying the bill as simple and convenient as possible. Options include:

- Use a credit card to pay online using the student eBill system (Service fees may apply)
- Debit or eCheck payments made online using the student eBill system
- Cash, check payments, or debit cards accepted in our SBS office at 301 West Hall
- Personal check by mail (Postmarks will not be considered for meeting due dates)
- Payment Plans available via the eBill system
- Utilize a third-party payer or 529 plan such as Texas Guaranteed Tuition Plan
- Receive and accept a financial aid award package
- International payments made through Flywire
