Training will be offered in an empirically validated treatment approach General Psychiatric Management (GPM), which has been demonstrated to equal Dialectical Behavior Therapy's (DBT) effectiveness in treating patients with BPD. The course teaches psychiatrists and other primary care clinicians what they need to know to become competent providers who can derive satisfaction from treating these patients.

- Appreciate the historical aspects of Borderline Personality Disorder (BPD).
- Explain the diagnosis of BPD to patients and families and establish reasonable expectations for change.
- Discuss prioritization strategies in treating BPD.
- Discuss cost-effective and optimistic case management approaches for treating of BPD.
