1/20/2025	Proclamation	DECLARING A NATIONAL EMERGENCY AT THE SOUTHERN BORDER OF THE UNITED STATES	<p>Declaration of national emergency at southern border, including invoking section 12302 of title 10, United States Code, to make available, according to its terms, to the Secretaries of the military departments concerned, subject to the direction of the Secretary of Defense.</p> <p>To provide additional authority to the Department of Defense to support the Federal Government’s response to the emergency at the southern border, the president declares that this emergency requires use of the Armed Forces and, in accordance with section 301 of the National Emergencies Act (50 U.S.C. 1631), that the construction authority provided in section 2808 of title 10, United States Code, is invoked and made available, according to its terms, to the Secretary of Defense and, at the discretion of the Secretary of Defense, to the Secretaries of the military departments.</p>	<p>Within 30 days of the date of this proclamation, the Secretary of Defense shall submit to the President, through the Homeland Security Advisor, a report outlining all actions taken to fulfill the requirements and objectives of this proclamation; and</p> <p>Within 90 days of the date of this proclamation, the Secretary of Defense and the Secretary of Homeland Security shall submit a joint report to the President about the conditions at the southern border of the United States and any recommendations regarding additional actions that may be necessary to obtain complete operational control of the southern border, including whether to invoke the Insurrection Act of 1807</p>
1/20/2025	Executive Order	CLARIFYING THE MILITARY’S ROLE IN PROTECTING THE TERRITORIAL INTEGRITY OF THE UNITED STATES	<p>No later than 10 days from the effective date of this order, the Secretary of Defense shall deliver to the President a revision to the Unified Command Plan that assigns United States Northern Command (USNORTHCOM) the mission to seal the borders and maintain the sovereignty, territorial integrity, and security of the United States by repelling forms of invasion including unlawful mass migration, narcotics trafficking, human smuggling and trafficking, and other criminal activities.</p>	<p>Within 10 days of the effective date of the order</p>

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1/20/2025	Executive Order	REALIGNING THE U.S. REFUGEE ADMISSION PROGRAM	<p>Pursuant to sections 212(f) and 215(a) of the INA, 8 U.S.C. 1182(f) and 1185(a), determined that entry into the United States of refugees under theUSRAP would be detrimental to the interests of the United States, the president directs that entry into the United States of refugees under theUSRAP be suspended — subject to the exceptions set forth in subsection (c) of this section — until a finding is made in accordance with section 4 of this order. This suspension shall take effect at 12:01 am eastern standard time on January 27, 2025.</p>	<p>The suspension ofUSRAP shall take effect at 12:01 am eastern standard time on January 27, 2025.</p> <p>Within 90 days of this order, the Secretary of Homeland Security, in consultation with the Secretary of State, shall submit a report to the President through the Homeland Security Advisor regarding whether resumption of entry of refugees into the United States under theUSRAP would be in the interests of the United States, in light of the policies outlined in section 2 of this order.</p> <p>The Secretary of Homeland Security, in consultation with the Secretary of State, shall submit further reports every 90 days thereafter until I determine that resumption of theUSRAP is in the interests of the United States.</p>

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1/20/2025	Executive Order	PROTECTING THE MEANING AND VALUE OF AMERICAN CITIZENSHIP	<p>It is the policy of the United States that no department or agency of the United States government shall issue documents recognizing United States citizenship, or accept documents issued by State, local, or other governments or authorities purporting to recognize United States citizenship, to persons:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> when that person’s mother was unlawfully present in the United States and the person’s father was not a United States citizen or lawful permanent resident at the time of said person’s birth, or when that person’s mother’s presence in the United States was lawful but temporary, and the person’s father was not a United States citizen or lawful permanent resident at the time of said person’s birth. <p>This policy will apply only to persons who are born within the U.S. after 30 days from the date of this order. Additionally, this order will not affect the entitlement of other individuals, including children or lawful permanent residents, to obtain their citizenship documentation.</p>	<p>This policy will apply only to persons who are born within the U.S. after 30 days from the date of this order.</p>

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1/20/2025	Executive Order	SECURING OUR BORDER	<p>The executive order takes numerous steps, through empowering federal agencies, to secure U.S. borders. These include:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Construction of physical barriers along the southern border • Deployment of military and DHS personnel along the southern border • Empower DHS to take all appropriate actions to detain aliens apprehended for violations of immigration law • DHS will also issue new policy guidance or propose regulations regarding the appropriate and consistent use of lawful detention authority under the INA, including the termination of the practice commonly known as "catch-and-release" • DHS will also resume Migrant Protection Protocols along the southern border • DHS will cease using "CPB One" • Terminate categorical parole programs including for Cubans, Haitians, Nicaraguans, and Venezuelans 	<p>Within 14 days of the date of this order, the Secretary of State, the Attorney General, the Secretary of Health and Human Services, and the Secretary of Homeland Security shall provide recommendations to the President regarding the use of any other authority to protect the United States from foreign threats and secure the southern border.</p>

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1/20/2025	Executive Order	PROTECTING THE AMERICAN PEOPLE AGAINST INVASION	<p>The order empowers federal immigration authorities to vigorously enforce the existing immigration laws, including those related to illegal entry and unlawful presence of aliens in the U.S.</p> <p>Additionally, the order establishes a Homeland Security Task Forces (HSTFs) in all states nationwide to end the presence of criminal cartels, foreign gangs, and transnational criminal organizations throughout the United States, dismantle cross-border human smuggling and trafficking networks, end the scourge of human smuggling and trafficking, and ensure the use of all available law enforcement tools to faithfully execute the immigration laws.</p> <p>The order also requires DHS to establish detention facilities. Further, the order authorizes state and local law enforcement to perform the functions of immigration officers to carry out these efforts. The order includes additional policies that carry out the mandate of the policy.</p>	<p>Within 90 days of the date of this order, the Secretary of the Treasury and the Secretary of Homeland Security shall submit a report to the President regarding their progress implementing the requirements of this section and recommending any additional actions that may need to be taken to achieve its objectives.</p>

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1/20/2025	Executive Order	PROTECTING THE UNITED STATES FROM FOREIGN TERRORISTS AND OTHER NATIONAL SECURITY AND PUBLIC SAFETY THREATS	<p>The order strengthens the visa-issuance process to ensure that those aliens approved for admission into the United States do not intend to harm Americans or our national interests, including through enhanced vetting and screening. It re-establishes a uniform baseline for screening and vetting standards and procedures, consistent with the uniform baseline that existed on January 19, 2021, that will be used for any alien seeking a visa or immigration benefit of any kind. The order also empowers federal agencies to assess countries who pose the highest risk for entry to the U.S.</p>	<p>Within 60 days of the date of this order, the Secretary of State, the Attorney General, the Secretary of Homeland Security, and the Director of National Intelligence shall jointly submit to the President, through the Assistant to the President for Homeland Security, a report: identifying countries throughout the world for which vetting and screening information is so deficient as to warrant a partial or full suspension on the admission of nationals from those countries pursuant to section 212(f) of the INA (8 U.S.C. 1182(f)); and identifying how many nationals from those countries have entered or have been admitted into the United States on or since January 20, 2021.</p> <p>Additionally, the order evaluate existing policies and implement new guidance that serve to carry out the order within 30 days.</p>
1/20/2025	Executive Order	DESIGNATING CARTELS AND OTHER ORGANIZATIONS AS FOREIGN TERRORIST ORGANIZATIONS AND SPECIALLY DESIGNATED GLOBAL TERRORISTS	<p>This order creates a process by which certain international cartels and other organizations will be designated as Foreign Terrorist Organizations, consistent with section 219 of the INA (8 U.S.C. 1189), or Specially Designated Global Terrorists, consistent with IEEPA (50 U.S.C. 1702) and Executive Order 13224 of September 23, 2001 (Blocking Property and Prohibiting Transactions With Persons Who Commit, Threaten to Commit, or Support Terrorism), as</p>	<p>The designation and determination of any cartels to be listed as foreign terrorist organizations must be completed within 14 days.</p> <p>Additionally, federal agencies have 14 days to make operational preparations, including the establishment of facilities as necessary to expedite the removal of those who may be designated under this order.</p>
