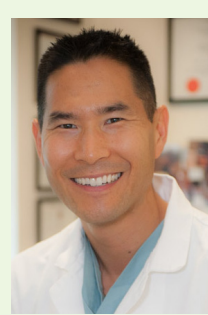

Speakers



Kenji Inaba, MD, FACS, FRCS

Dr. Inaba is a Professor, Clinical Scholar of Surgery, Emergency Medicine and Anesthesia at the University of Southern California (USC). He is the Vice Chair of the Department of Surgery, and the program director for both the General Surgery Residency and the Surgical Critical Care Fellowship. He is the Medical Director of the Surgical Intensive Care Unit and the Associate Trauma Medical Director. While at USC he has been the recipient of 25 teaching awards including the USC Keck School of Medicine Overall Excellence in Teaching Award for the Clinical Sciences, the Alpha Omega Alpha Honorary Medical Fraternity Faculty Teaching Award and the Leonard Tow Humanism in Medicine Award. He has lectured extensively, having given more than 387 invited lectures around the world. He has mentored more than 145 research fellows and students who have garnered 34 separate research awards for this work. Dr. Inaba has authored more than 440 peer reviewed articles (plus 21 in press), 392 scientific presentations, 44 textbook chapters (plus 10 in press) and is the editor of 7 textbooks. In addition to his role at USC, Dr. Inaba is also a sworn Police Officer with the LAPD, currently assigned as a patrol officer to Rampart area, Central Bureau.



Michael McGonigal, MD, FACS

Dr. McGonigal is currently an attending trauma surgeon and director of trauma services at Regions Hospital in St. Paul, Minnesota. He is an Assistant Professor of Surgery at the University of Minnesota College of Medicine Minneapolis, Minnesota and former Assistant Professor of Surgery Division of Traumatology and Surgical Critical Care University of Pennsylvania College of Medicine Philadelphia, Pennsylvania. Dr. McGonigal completed his undergraduate studies at Oberlin College, Oberlin, Ohio and medical school at Ohio State University College of Medicine in Columbus, Ohio, and completed his General Surgery Residency at Wayne State University College of Medicine in Detroit, Michigan. He is the author of a very popular online trauma education offering known as The Trauma Professional's Blog.



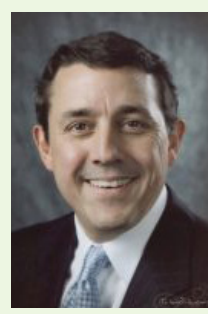
Lawrence Lottenberg, MD, FACS

Dr. Lottenberg is currently practicing at the Level I trauma center at St. Mary's Medical Center in West Palm Beach, FL. He is the Director of Trauma Research and Education there as well. He has been a surgeon since 1980 with a focus on trauma, emergency general surgery, elective general surgery, burns and surgical critical care. He is an Associate Professor in Clinical Surgery, Director of Surgical Simulation and Technology and Associate Dean for Graduate Medical Education at the Charles E. Schmidt School of Medicine at Florida Atlantic University in Boca Raton, Florida. Dr. Lottenberg also served as a member of the Trauma Surgeon Team at Parkview Regional Medical Center for over two years and currently is a surgeon consultant to the Trauma Center.



Mark Litwinko, NRAEMT

Mark Litwinko is a Lieutenant and 15-year veteran with the Fort Wayne (Ind.) Fire Department. Currently serving as an Engine Company Officer in the Combat Division and a member of departments Hazardous Materials and Water Rescue Teams. Litwinko is coordinator of the FWFD/FWPD Rescue Task Force program in response to High-Threat Mass Casualty Incidents and serves as a Tactical Medic with Fort Wayne Police Departments Emergency Services. He works regularly as a Tactical Casualty Care and Trauma instructor for the Indiana Dept. of Homeland Security and is the owner, operator and primary instructor of Axis Emergency Readiness Solutions. Litwinko has a Bachelor of Science in Hazardous Materials Management from the University of Findlay (OH) and holds numerous certifications in firefighting, emergency medical services, leadership and emergency management.



Scott Thomas, MD, FACS

Dr. Thomas received his medical degree from Indiana University School of Medicine and completed his residency in general surgery at St. Joseph Mercy Hospital in Ann Arbor, Michigan and The Royal North Shore Hospital in Sydney, Australia. He also completed his trauma fellowship at The Royal North Shore Hospital in Sydney. Board certified in surgery, Dr. Thomas is Chief of Trauma Services for Beacon Health System and answers as Medical Director of Trauma Services at Memorial Hospital of South Bend. He has been instrumental in strengthening the quality and expanding the capabilities of the area's leading trauma program. He is a member of the American Trauma Society and a fellow of the American College of Surgeons. Dr. Thomas, who has served on numerous medical committees and councils, has conducted a variety of presentations and panel discussions regionally, statewide and internationally.

5. Integrate new temporizing and definitive management options for complex surgical disease.
6. Discuss approaches to non-lethal police injuries.
7. Implement methods for external bleeding control.
8. Outline a plan for managing coagulopathic traumatic brain injured patients.
