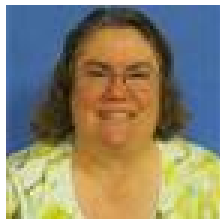

Printed handouts or presentations will not be provided at the meeting. Also, the CE sessions will have Wi-Fi available so you may bring a laptop, phone, or tablet to log CE and take notes.

To receive credit, participants must go into LP to submit the secret codes and evaluation for each CE activity attended. At the end of each CE presentation, you will be provided with the secret code.
