Clinical Pharmacist, Chemical Dependency Intern


Dr. DuVall received her BA in Communication Disorders from Eastern Washington University, an MS in Education of the Hearing Impaired from Idaho State University and her PharmD from Washington State University. She completed a residency at Central Washington Hospital in Wenatchee and a clinical research fellowship in geriatrics with Washington State University in Spokane. She was the Director of Continuing Professional Development for the Washington State Pharmacy Association (WSPA), Pharmacist Supervisor of the Washington State Penitentiary pharmacy in Walla Walla, and Pharmacy Manager of Friday Harbor Drug on San Juan Island. Currently she works as a clinical pharmacist for Rite Aid in Kelso and volunteers at Choice Wellness Centers in Vancouver counseling individuals recovering from chemical dependency. Recently she has been collaborating with WA State Department of Health representatives, legislators and WSPA to expedite the training of pharmacists seeking Chemical Dependency Professional certification. Dr. DuVall is an active member of the Longview Anti-Drug Coalition and Opioid Taskforce. She frequently presents locally and regionally on substance abuse topics for school, community and professional audiences.
