Online CE Platform and Presentation Materials

The Northwest Pharmacy Convention uses Lecture Panda (LP), an online CE platform, for all continuing education sessions. Attendees can use LP to access accreditation details, download presentation slides and handouts, claim CE credit, and complete session evaluations.

You should have received an email from "LecturePanda" with a link to create your meeting-specific profile. Even if you've used LP before, a new profile is required for each meeting. Pharmacists and technicians must enter their NABP# and date of birth to register and claim CE credit.

After setting up your profile, you should have received a confirmation email— it contains the link to return to your profile. Through LP, you'll be able to view CE session objectives, upload CE credit, and access presentation materials under the "Materials" tab. Be sure to download or print any handouts before the meeting, as printed copies will not be provided.

Convention staff can assist with CE uploads throughout the event. **Credits must be uploaded within 60 days of the activity date to receive credit**, which will then be transmitted to the CPE Monitor for tracking.

Improving Public Health: The Leading Role of Pharmacists in Adult Vaccination

Speaker: Pooja Joshi, MD

In this presentation we will be reviewing the historical evolution of vaccines and their impact on public health, and the pharmacist's critical role in implementing adult vaccination guidelines across diverse practice settings using influenza, herpes zoster and respiratory syncytial virus as key examples.

Dr. Pooja Joshi is a Medical Science Liaison with GSK Vaccines since 2019. Trained as a physician, she holds an MBBS and an MD in Pharmacology and Therapeutics from India. She began her career as a Medical Officer at King Edward Memorial Hospital and later contributed as a research investigator on multiple Phase 3 and 4 clinical trials.

Pooja transitioned to the pharmaceutical industry, initially leading medical initiatives in innovative treatments for type 2 diabetes. With a strong interest in public health and preventive care, she subsequently shifted her focus to vaccines. She is passionate about vaccine education, evidence-based communication, and advancing research to support immunization awareness.

Clinical Considerations of Human Albumin and Institutional Priorities Impacting its Handling and Administration

Rethinking Hyperkalemia Management in Patients on RAASi Therapy

Speaker: Jenny Wong, PharmD

This session will explore the burden of hyperkalemia in patients with chronic kidney disease and heart failure, including the challenges of recurrent hyperkalemia and its impact on RAAS inhibitor dose reduction or discontinuation. It will review current guideline recommendations for managing hyperkalemia in these populations and provide an overview of potassium binder therapy as a treatment option.

Jenny Wong, PharmD is a Senior Medical Science Liaison (MSL) at AstraZeneca. Prior to becoming an MSL, she was a clinical pharmacist and educator specializing in cardiovascular diseases at the University of Washington (UW) in Seattle. She also holds the position as a Clinical Assistant Professor at the UW School of Pharmacy serving as a lecturer and mentor for pharmacy students. Jenny is passionate about education efforts to bridge care gaps and help improve health outcomes in patients with cardiovascular diseases in the community. She is a strong advocate in adapting principles of implementation science and integrating evidence-based pharmacotherapy into clinical practice. In her current role, she collaborates with healthcare providers to optimize guideline-directed therapy and reduce the burden of chronic disease.
